T. Slade attended the July 18, 2016 classification meeting in Saratoga Springs, NY. The meeting was held to discuss concerns with non-public schools' classifications. Non-public schools' classifications do not become an issue for Section VI until the regional championship level. An ad hoc committee was established to address non-public school participation within the NYSPHSAA. Two sub-set groups of this committee will each research one of 2 possible concepts:

- 1. The creation of a statewide committee to review and ultimately approve the sectional placements. This committee would provide a second set of eyes and also a possible review board if another section was concerned with a section's placement of one of their schools.
- 2. The feasibility of creating a parallel section or the creation of additional sections consisting of the non-public schools.

6.3.2 Sports Season Calendar

The Section VI 2016-2017Sports Season Calendar is posted on the Section VI website under the Athletic Director's Tool Kit. This document was requested to be provided annually as a resource tool. This item no longer needs Section VI Athletic Council approval due to the NYSPHSAA approved standard calendar of weeks.

Reminder: The modified practice requirements have changed (approved at the July 2016 NYSPHSAA Central Committee meeting) and are reflected on the Section VI Sports Season Calendar.

6.3.3 WeatherBug Update

At the July 2016 NYSPHSAA Central Committee meeting, WeatherBug was adopted as the official source for NYSPHSAA member schools to obtain the current heat index and wind chill readings. Since WeatherBug's inception, a number of issues and concerns have been presented. T. Slade, Executive Director, will address these concerns with T. Nelson, NYSPHSAA Assistant Director. Updates will be given when available.

Note: Member schools that do not have a WeatherBug station on site must use the closest WeatherBug station for temperature readings.

1. Direction for the Boys and Girls Representatives regarding the following items will be sought at the Athletic Council meeting

- Wrestling 2 Division Dual Meet State Championship
 The NYSPHSAA Wrestling Committee is proposing a 2 division dual meet state championship, effective
 January 2018 and to be conducted during week #30. Each section would determine their representative
 teams. In preparation of anticipated approval of this proposal, Section VI plans to offer a dual meet
 tournament beginning with the 2016-2017season (scheduled for January 21, 2017). The Section VI
 Wrestling Committee is working on issues regarding the large school and small school team selection
 process.
- State Title Proposals
 - Girls' and Boys' Swimming & Diving Team State Championship Title
 The following proposal from the NYSPHSAA Boys and Girls Swimming and Diving Committees is a discussion item for the October 2016 NYSPHSAA Executive Committee meeting:

Allow our coaches and schools the opportunity to crown a state champion at the state meet. This would then allow New York to participate in the David H. Robertson Excellence in Coaching Award presented by the National Interscholastic Swim Coaches Association each year.

Concern was expressed regarding the focus on the coaches' awards within the rationale of the proposal.

2. Girls Golf – Expand State Title to Include Teams

The following proposal from the NYSPHSAA Girls Golf Committee is a discussion item for the October 2016 NYSPHSAA Executive Committee meeting:

To invite and include sectional high school team champions to the NYSPHSAA Championship. They would represent their high school team.

This proposal stems from the fact that teams compete in all Sectional Tournaments for a team title, but do not have the opportunity to win a team championship with their teammates at the State Tournament.

Winning teams already send 3 individuals on average to the State Championships. If approved, there will be 1-2 more competitors for each section participating in the State Championships, which will result in 12-20 more athletes competing.

3. Boys' & Girls' Bowling

The following proposal submitted by the NYSPHSAA Bowling Committee is an action item for the October 2016 NYSPHSAA Executive Committee meeting:

To expand the State Championships by splitting the existing School Team Division into Division 1 and Division 2. The initial Division 1 enrollment number will be 600 and above.

The rationale for this proposal is to provide Division II teams with an opportunity to advance to the state championship. Total participation in the State Tournament is presently less than 5% (B/G combined, based on data provided in 2015) and heavily skewed towards schools with enrollment greater than 600. Currently, 55% of all participating schools have enrollment less than 600, but approximately 75%-80% of all qualifying teams come from schools with enrollment greater than 600. It is important to note, approval of this proposal will increase state championship costs.

Cheerleading Video Replay

The following proposal is a discussion item for the October 2016 NYSPHSAA Executive Committee meeting:

To allow the use of the video replay at the NYSPHSAA Cheerleading Championships to review safety and deduction points during a routine

The rationale in making this proposal stems from judges concerns of accurate point and safety deductions. Varsity Media provides the capability to review a third party video in order to review all deductions, including safety violations.

2. Cheer Music

All recordings used in cheer routines should be properly licensed. Member schools should maintain confirmation of any of the licenses obtained for the music. The NYSPHSAA has developed guidelines to assist member schools with compliance to the copyright regulations that arise with the use of music for cheer routines and performances. NYSPHSAA cheerleading music guidelines are posted on the Cheerleading page of the Section VI website.

- NYSPHSAA Scholar Athlete Team Award Program Changes
 The following revisions to the NYSPHSAA Scholar Athlete Award Program were approved at the July 2016 Central Committee meeting:
 - 1. Modify criteria associated with being a Scholar Athlete Team to include 75% of the roster
 - 2. Teams who receive a 90.00 or above Grade Point Average (GPA) will receive a Scholar Athlete Team Award certificate. Only individuals who receive a 90.00 or above will receive a pin.
 - If a team did not qualify for the Scholar Athlete Team award, individuals with a 90.00 or above GPA are eligible to receive a Scholar Athlete pin.
 - 4. Accept both weighted and unweighted grades
 - 5. Sports recognized by their respective Sections will be considered for the award (i.e. Girls Ice Hockey, Badminton, Fencing, Rifle, etc.)
 - 6. Revise the submission process associated with recognizing Scholar Athlete teams (a draft was included in the meeting packet).
 - 7. Continue the School of Distinction program by awarding schools who have 100% of their teams achieving a team average of 90.00 with a School of Distinction Award
 - 8. Implement the School of Excellence program by awarding schools who have 75% of their teams achieving a team average of 90.00 or above with the School of Excellence Award
 - 9. Eliminate the practice of awarding "Scholar Athlete Team State Champion" due to membership concerns with disparities between weighted and unweighted grades

6.8.2 Case 186, Orchard Park, Football

Case 186 was denied as the student-athlete did not meet the extended eligibility requirements. An appeal was issued to the New York State Education Commissioner. The Commissioner granted a stay, thus allowing the student-athlete to participate in football while the appeal is being processed.

As a result of Case 186's ruling by the NYSED Commissioner, the NYSPHSAA is addressing concerns regarding the extent of involvement of NYS Legislature in the NYSPHSAA.
