NYSPHSAA News

FOOTBALL CONTACT LIMITATION APPROVED:

The NYSPHSAA Executive Committee approved the Football Committee's proposal to limit contact beginning in the Fall of 2015. The newly approved rule states:

Contact in the sport of football for high school and modified football teams shall have no more than two "Full-Contact practices" per week during the season; with no "Full-Contact" session to exceed 90 minutes. "Full-contact" means a practice where drills or live action is conducted that involves collisions at game speed, where players execute tackles and other activity that is typical of an actual tackle football game.

Limitation of "Full-Contact practices" will begin with the 13th day (high school) and 14th day (modified).



The following items were **approved** at the May 1st NYSPHSAA Executive Committee meeting:

- Proposed Cross Country Classification cut-off numbers to begin with the fall 2016 season
Fall 2016 Numbers:
 - Class A – 850 and up – 148 schools – 25%
 - Class B – 445 to 849 – 148 schools – 25%
 - Class C – 261 to 444 – 148 schools – 25%
 - Class D – 260 and down – 148 schools – 25%
- Proposed Girls Volleyball Classification cut-off numbers to begin with the fall 2016 season
Fall 2016 Numbers:
 - Class AA – 941 and up – 122 schools – 19.9 %
 - Class A – 587 to 939 – 123 schools – 20%
 - Class B – 345- 586 – 122 schools – 19.9%
 - Class C – 203 to 344 – 123 schools – 20%
 - Class D – 202 and below – 122 schools – 19.9%
- Modified Soccer Goalie Uniform Waiver
The NFHS regulation that the boys' and girls' soccer goalie uniform jersey be numbered shall be waived at the modified level for two years (2015-16 and 2016-17).
- Increases in Wrestling Game Conditions (Modified)
 - Wrestling Game Condition #1 - A contestant (or team) may participate in competitions not to exceed 14 points during the season.
 - Wrestling Game Condition #2 - No contestant (or team) can accumulate more than 10 points out of the maximum 14 points allowed via 2 point contests.
