Track and Field - The committee is investigating three proposals:

It was a different year, but the same result for the **Eden** and **Hamburg** boys volleyball teams. Both teams successfully defended their Intersectional New York State championships on November 12, 2005 at Webster-Schroeder High School in suburban Rochester.

Eden won its eighth Intersectional title by beating Class B foe Victor of Section V, 25-20, 25-17, 25-22, at Webster-Schroeder High School in suburban Rochester. Junior Tom Kline had 23 kills and three blocks, while classmate Jake Waszak added 47 assists as Eden repeated as champions. "It feels great to be state champions again," Waszak said. "We kind of expected it. We knew we had to play very well to beat Victor because they brought a lot to the court. We knew if we played a solid match we'd probably come away with the victory. We just had to make sure we executed the way we're capable of doing." Sam Beiter had six aces and nine digs, while Ed DeRosa added 10 digs.

Hamburg (31-3) won its second Class A crown by rallying to dispatch Section V's McQuaid, 19-25, 26-24, 31-29, 25-19. Nikolaj Prychodko led the Bulldogs with 17 kills, while Patrick Abulone had 14 and Mike Jackson 10.

## Wilson Girls Volleyball - State Champion with a team GPA of 96.460





Two touchdown passes from Rogers to Blake Morrison and three running touchdowns by Jeff Durow were the offensive highlights. And again, the Cardinals were a dominating defense ... they sacked Spencer Luke four times. Morrison led with none tackles, Tim McElwain added seven tackles with additional sacks by Durow, Dustin Poitras, David Everts and Mike Seiberg. The Cardinals, coached by Pat Slater, won the Class D Championship Title with a score of 35-6. Honors awarded were: Durow MVP, Pat Oyer- most valuable offensive lineman, Jackson- most valuable offensive back, Brooks Morrison - most valuable defensive back, Matt Ring - sportsmanship and special congratulations is due to Coach Pat Slater who was selected as the Buffalo Bills Coach of the year. Congratulations Randolph!!

On a final note, the Randolph offense scored 35 points in the state Championship game. Randolph's defense allowed all 13 opponents throughout the season a total of 35 points!

The Blue Devils' 10th invitational win of the season turned out to be their biggest triumph as they captured the New York State Class B championship On November 12, 2005 in Queensbury, edging Honeoye Falls-Lima of Section V, 53-63. The win enabled East Aurora to gain a measure of revenge against old friend Honeoye, which edged the Blue Devils, 55-56, for the state crown last year. East Aurora went 10-0 in invitationals this season.

Although Honeoye's Liz Deir won the overall race and teammate Audrey Mangan placed fourth, the Blue Devils' depth proved to be the difference in helping head coach Walt McLaughlin win his first state title, according to girls Section 6 Chairman Jim Zubler. Sarah Moser placed 10th in 19:13.7 for EA, while teammates Kirsten Weberg (17th), Marla Kelley (20th), Jenna Hulton (21st) and Erin Crawford (31st) all ran outstanding races. The Blue Devils' sixth and seventh runners, Ellen Duane and Tara O'Connor, finished 58th and 59th, better than HF-L's fifth runner who came in 60th. The top five finishers for each team count toward a team's score, and HF-L runners came in 1-4-19-33-60.

"The entire team ran awesome today, right from our first to our seventh girls," McLaughlin said. "Everyone did their job and it was a great win. HF-L had won the previous seven years in a row, and they're a real class act.

### Reminder from the Transportation Committee

School districts are reminded that for the remainder of the school year, districts will need to make their own transportation arrangements to state competition for <u>team</u> <u>sports</u> if their team qualifies. Districts will be reimbursed by the Section for this expense. The Section will continue to provide buses for individual sports such as track and field. This policy was approved by the Executive Committee in November due to the lack of availability of coach buses. The Transportation Committee will be meeting in the near future to review Section policies on transportation to state competition.

### Centralized Payment of Sports Officials

The pilot program launched by Erie I BOCES in cooperation with Section VI for centralized payment of sports officials by Erie I BOCES was successful for girls soccer. The pilot is currently underway for winter sports. Boys Basketball and Indoor Track officials will receive one paycheck from Erie I BOCES for all contests worked in the pilot districts and all league meets worked within a monthly pay period. Track and Field will be the pilot sport for spring. The web-based software approved by the Section to facilitate this program is League Minder. The pilot districts currently include Alden, Akron, Hinsdale, Kenmore and Olean.

When fully operational, centralized payment of sports officials through Erie I BOCES will include all sports and will be open to all Section VI member districts who wish to participate. All sports officials will then receive one monthly paycheck for all contests worked at participating member schools. This program complies with SED regulations regarding Board of Cooperative Educational Services entitling districts who participate to state aid for the cost of League Minder.

Section VI and Erie 1 BOCES express their gratitude to the girls soccer, boys basketball and track officials and to the pilot districts for their cooperation with this program, developed to ensure payment of officials in a timely, efficient and cost effective manner for districts (see Reminder to Distrits article this page).

## **Putting Sports in Perspective**

As you have heard many times, coaches are moral educators, if not by explicit instruction then at least by the habits you instill and the examples you set. The game, however, has a power not only to uplift and encourage, it can depress and ultimately destroy if not kept in perspective. Consider the sad case of a former major league pitcher whose life spiraled downward after giving up the big homer in the playoffs, or the former pro football player whose life ended in suicide. Coaches have a tremendous responsibility in this regard "what really matters most". As educators first, we must figure out how to do this in such a way that wey never let our players forget that no pitch, no inning, no dropped pass, a missed foul shot, or no game, is...pardon the sports metaphor, "the whole ball game" or to use the standard expression, "It's only a game." Everyone knows it's a game, but we need to state the obvious because it's easy to become so absorbed in the game that we forget the obvious. We as coaches need to remind our players how lucky they are to be able to play, to be able to pursue this unique kind of excellence for at least a small part of their high school careers.

- During the fall of 2005, several sections across the state experimented with policy changes concerning red and multiple yellow card violations in soccer. It's no secret that sportsmanship issues relating to both boys and girls soccer have been a priority concern throughout the country. Section 6 adopted a much stricter policy for multiple yellow card violations. Data collected by coaches and officials is currently being evaluated to determine the impact on the game in general. The outcome of this evaluation and possible recommendations for the 2006 season will be posted in the near future.
- The National Federation of High School Officials recently unveiled a multimedia campaign addressing the growing problems of steroid use at the high school level. It contains two 12-minute videos, one directed toward coaches and the other towards parents. The NFHS is very upbeat concerning the early support of the program entitled "Making the Right Choice".
