Joe was the Director of Health, Physical Education and Athletics at Frontier Central Schools until 1977. He wore many hats in service to Section VI and NYSPHSAA over the years. He was Section VI Basketball Chairman for three years, Baseball Chairman for four years, Sectional-Intersectional Representative for five years, Rules and Regulations Chairman of the Handbook Revision Committee for 22 years, Director of the NYS High School Pupil Benefits Plan for eight years, ECIC President for five years and had been a member of the Extended Eligibility Committee since 1985. He is a member of the Cortland State and Frontier Central Hall of Fame as well as the recipient of a myriad of awards for distinguished service. The athletic field at Frontier is named in his honor. He was a GIANT in interscholastic athletics in Western New York as well as New York State a consummate professional personified. We, in Section VI have been privileged to have crossed paths with such a remarkable man.

NEWS FROM THE STATE OFFICE

NYSPHSAA CENTRAL COMMITTEE MEETING DECEMBER 21, 2010

APPROVED → Dues Increase for 2011 - 2012:

Association dues will increase by \$30.00 per district and \$.03 per student for the 2011-2012 school year.

APPROVED → Fiscal Concerns:

To extend the Fiscal Concerns Items (numbers 1-7) for a period of one year (2011-2012) with one exception. Item 6 was changed to reinstate the required Executive Committee meeting schedule to October, January and May. The January meeting will be held by conference call

Fiscal Concern Items (extended for 2011-2012):

- 1. Support the use of telephone conference calls and video conferencing for NYSPHSAA meetings to reduce the travel reimbursements costs for the NYSPHSAA and Sections.
- 2. Support the use of officials from the host Section at all NYSPHSAA regional contests, except when the Sections involved mutually agree to use neutral officials. Effective with the 2009-2010 season and continuing to 2010-2011 school year.
- 3. Support a moratorium on the expansion of existing NYSPHSAA tournaments as it pertains to participation.
- 4. Centralized sites should be considered as part of the bid process for state tournament site selection when it can be proven that cost savings outweighs other criteria.
- 5. Support the reduction of the maximum number of contests permitted during the regular season. Sports with 24 contests will be reduced to 20, sports with 20 contests will be reduced to 18 and sports with 18 contests will be reduced to 16. Wrestling will be reduced to 20 points. Football will be reduced from 10 to 9. The 9th game is permitted, with section approval, for teams who do not qualify for sectional play. For the teams involved in the sectional tournament the maximum number of contests shall be 10. For the sections involved in the state championship three additional games are permitted for a total of 13 games for the season: 1 game for regionals, 1 game for semifinals, and 1 game for championships. Effective for 2009-2010 and 2010-2011.

- 6. As per the NYSPHSAA Constitution, the Executive Committee will meet three times per year in October, January and May. The January meeting will be conducted by conference call. (*Modified December 6, 2010*)
- 7. Support the establishment of a moratorium eliminating mandated attendance beginning with the 2009-2010 school year at the following NYSPHSAA workshops: Safety, Life of an Athlete, Sportsmanship and Chemical Health workshops.

Cheerleading:

- 1. The Cheerleading Ad Hoc Committee continues to study cheer and how it would be defined as a sport.
- 2. NYSPHSAA recommends that beginning

in 2011-2012, all coaches/advisors of Cheer (sideline, spirit, competitive) complete the following courses prior to coaching: First Aid for Coaches, CPR & ACCAA Safety Course.

Wrestling: Penalty for exceeding the maximum number of tournaments:

- ➤ Exceeds the maximum 5 bouts limitation in a tournament – individual wrestler penalized, team loses standing in tournament, but other wrestlers individual performances would stand.
- Exceeds the 6 tournament limitation or the 2 two-day dual meet limitation the individual would be penalized.
- > Exceeds 20 point limitation entire team penalized.

Softball:

- 1. Moving the pitching distance to 43 ft for all high school (9th, JV and Varsity) programs in spring of 2011.
- 2. Continue to prohibit the use of metal cleats for all levels of play.

Central Management of Officials in ArbiterSports

Section VI is well into the fourth year of coordinating the efforts of centralized management of sports officials through ArbiterSports. Progress is continuing towards maximizing usage of all the capabilities of this software.

This fall, post-season assignments were completed in Arbitersports. Athletic Directors and secretaries need only to view their Varsity schedule to see the contests labeled *Sectionals* or *Regionals* and the corresponding officials who are assigned. Sectional levels are currently being added for winter and spring sports so that all post-season assignments can be viewed.

For winter, payment of officials in Arbitersports through RefPay has begun with Boys Ice Hockey. Ice Hockey officials have established RefPay accounts and simply transfer funds into their bank account or pre-set debit card once payment is released. They may also request payment by check. The first payment was released by the Section office on December 16, 2010. Future payments are scheduled for the 15th and 30th of each month as the financial reports are received from the Federation treasurer. Payments to officials for all sectional contests that are currently paid through the Section office is planned for the near future. Officials will be requested by email to set up a RefPay account prior to this method of payment being used for their sport.

Also new in Arbitersports this year is the addition of scrimmages. This corresponds with the new Officials Contract 2010-2013 (approved 6/30/10) which specifies fees for scrimmages. Similar to the "sectional" level, there are levels called "Var Scrimmage", "JV Scrimmage " and "Mod Scrimmage". These *contests* are found in the corresponding level for each team. Athletic Directors must notify their assigner of all scrimmages so they may be added to Arbiter, indicating if the contract fee is to be paid or if the fee has been negotiated to a different amount.

Evaluation of officials is a tool currently used by Ice Hockey and Boys Lacrosse. A coach, once entered into Arbitersports as a contact, can not only see his schedule and the officials assigned, but can evaluate the officials after each contest. A summary of the evaluations submitted is accessible for use by the Officials Organizations as well as Sportchairs.



CLARENCE BOYS CROSS COUNTRY 2010 State Champion with a team GPA of 99.141

Congratulations are in order for the Clarence Boy's Cross Country Team. This years boys cross country team had forty-seven members on the team, thirty-nine students on the team earned a 90% average or above for the first marking period. The top seven students for the NYSPHSAA scholar athlete program earned an average of 99.141 making them the # 1 team of 287 teams in the State of New York. The top seven students included Zach Mayle, Derek Boyer, Emmanuel Rockwell, Alex Tryjankowski, Jackson Yerrick, Sullivan Curry and Jonas Gage.

The boy's cross country scholar athlete championship marks the thirteenth title that Clarence has claimed since the inception of the program. The average of 99.141 is the highest average achieved of the 13 teams that were crowned as State Champions.

FRONTIER GIRLS SOCCER 2010 State Champion with a team GPA of 97.918


This is the fifth time that a team from Frontier High School has won a NYSPHSAA State Scholar Athlete Team Award but the first time for the Girls Soccer Team! In the 20 year history of the State Scholar Athlete program in Girls Soccer, Frontier's team's GPA of 97.918 is the second highest. It should also be noted that Frontier High School was the first school from Section VI to win the State Scholar Athlete Award. The school, administrators, and the community are very proud of the girls for their academic and athletic accomplishments.

Falconer Girls Volleyball Takes First State Title

The Falconer Central School Lady Golden Falcons' Volleyball Team achieved the first State Title in the history of the program. Falconer had previous second place finishes at sectionals losing seven times to Eden and twice to City Honors. The tenth trip to the sectional final seemed to be the crowning achievement for the team until they continued with a Far West Regional Victory over LeRoy and then a State Championship. In the State Class C semi-final tournament round, Falconer posted a split decision with both Thomas Edison from Section IV and Voorheesville of Section II. The Lady Golden Falcons needed to sweep Mattituck from Section XI in order to secure a shot at the State Title. The team achieved a 4-2 record on day one of the tournament

and a chance to play in the Championship match against 5-1 Voorheesville on Sunday, November 21st. The Lady Golden Falcons won the match 3-1 and were crowned the New York State Class C Champions in Girls' Volleyball. Their records were 12-0 in league play and 19-2 overall in 2010.



Clarence Girls Swimming Claims First State Title

The 400 freestyle relay State Championship was the first in school history for the girl's swimming program at Clarence. The winning time of 3:32.88 was 4.98 seconds faster than their earlier preliminary swim. In addition, all



four swimmers were members of ECIC Division 1 league championship titles for Clarence during the 2009 and 2010 ECIC girls swimming seasons. The 2009 title was the first for Clarence since 1978. In addition to the ECIC Division 1 titles, the Clarence girls swimming team won the ECIC Large School championships during the 2009 and 2010 season, the 2009 title is the first ECIC Large School Championships in school history. And finally at the New York State Swimming Championships Clarence finished first in team score. Unfortunately a team title is not awarded at the State meet.

Caroline Benson toured the 5,000meter Lakeside Park course in 20:14.3 for

second place, about 15 seconds behind Hamilton 7th -grader Sage Hurta (19:59.8). Also finishing in the top 10 were 7th graders - Pietrocarlo (fourth in 20:17.1) and Marsh (fifth in 20:21.1). Norris, a freshman, was 12th (20:52.2), Katelyn Benson, a junior, was 16th (20:55.1), freshman Abby Sirwatka, a freshman, was 46th (22:25.4) and Stephanie Krempa, a sophomore, was 95th (25:48.5).

As a team, Maple Grove was almost perfect with 20 points, well ahead of second-place finisher Remsen (87) and third-place Geneseo (90). Section 6 was the winner in Class D with 189 points to easily outdistance Section 3's 227 points.

Eden Proves it is Still State's Best Class B Girls Volleyball Team

Out of Eden's eight state titles, this season's championship run may have been the program's greatest show of strength. Minus four All-Western New York players from last year's state record-setting title team, a less experienced and smaller in stature Raiders team rose to the top of the crop.

Eden pretty convincingly beat Hendrick Hudson, the Section I champion from Westchester County, in a three-game sweep (25-17, 25-20, 25-24) on Nov. 21. It was the third consecutive meeting for a state title for the two teams. Eden head coach Stephen Pierce has won state titles the past two seasons, in addition to championships in 1996, 2000 through 2002 and 2006 and 2007.

The Raiders won over 50 matches this season, including beating previously undefeated Albion in the Section VI championship and previously undefeated Aquinas in the Far West Regional. They lost once at the prestigious Garden State Classic and once at the Horseheads Tournament, then split

with Hendrick Hudson during pool play before the two met once again in a final.

This Eden team may not have been as experienced or offensively capable as some of the past teams, but they were just as driven to win as those former players who once adorned the Eden jerseys. Lost from last year were graduates Stacey Smith, who now plays at Georgia, Hannah Herc (Kent State), Hailee Herc (Stony Brook) and Katie Eschner (Roberts Wesleyan).

This year's team was built on its defense and ball control. What the Raiders may have lacked in power, they more than made up for with their ability to keep the ball off the ground and set would-be hitters. Besides a short period during the middle of the year, the defensive edge in matches always seemed to go to Eden. Leading that effort was the team's only senior returning starters in libero Anna King and setter Heather Feldman. King led Eden with 14 digs, while Feldman contributed throughout the floor, most notably with 40 assists. Feldman, who was the lone All-Western New York returner to this year's team, picked up deserving tournament Most Valuable Player honors. Pierce said throughout the season that the Eden machine does not run with such fluidity without a dominant setter in the Division I-bound Feldman.

Kendall Pierce was also named to the all-tournament team, along with Feldman, after recording 14 kills on offense and 23 digs defensively. Her younger sister, freshman Lainy Pierce, finished with a season-high 19 kills and also added five

aces using her big jump serve.

Aiding the defensive effort was junior Becca Shoemaker with 14 digs and finishing off the final two championship points in the third game was big-serving senior Christine Schaefer. Also on the postseason roster this season were senior Hannah Lauber, junior Tori Eschner, sophomores Megan McCarthy and Carly Stoll, freshmen Heather Holscher and Taylor Mitchell and eighth graders Lydia Baake and Jackie Bonczar.

The players recognized the importance of their coaches including assistant coach Johanna Funke. "They instilled in us what it takes to win and push to be disciplined. It really comes back to the coaches. They make the program go." said King.
