A Tribute to Daniel P. Hagen - Section VI Veteran and Friend

Mr. Dan Hagen, Eden's long time teacher, coach and athletic director, died on August 26, 2010 at age 89. Mr. Hagen taught physical education, coached and was the athletic director from the 1950's until his retirement in January 1980. He was instrumental in organizing the Erie County Interscholastic Conference (ECIC) and served as the Executive Secretary of the ECIC for several years. Additionally, Mr. Hagen was one of the key individuals in developing the rules and regulations of Section VI and served as Secretary-Treasurer of the Section at a time when Section VI was cited as being the best-run section in the State. In these leadership capacities, Mr. Hagen was proactive in high school sports and an advocate for safety in athletics.

Mr. Hagen coached numerous sports during his tenure at Eden, most notably cross-country and track. He founded the cross-country team in 1955 and coached many successful teams including the 1958 team inducted into the Eden Hall of Fame in 2008. His track teams dominated the division for years. As athletic director, Mr. Hagen oversaw many changes and additions to the athletic program at Eden including the addition of the volleyball program. He was one of the founders of the Eden Athletic Hall of Fame and a charter member in 1991. In Mr. Hagen's honor, each year the Dan Hagen Award is presented to a deserving Eden High School senior male athlete.

Mr. Hagen was a long time resident of East Aurora and a graduate of Ithaca College. He was an avid golfer and a member of the East Aurora Country Club. A Memorial Service was held on September 12th at the Baker Memorial United Methodist Church in East Aurora. He was predeceased by his wife, Elynor and is survived by his children Paul, Cheryl and Douglas.

NYSPHSAA EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING -MAY 6-7, 2011

ACTION ITEMS FOR CONSIDERATION

Cross Country - In the State Championship, athletes from each Section will wear their sectional colored t-shirts, providing there is no cost to the individual Section's budget.

Safety Committee - Recommends the safety meeting mandate be required every other year.

Boys and Girls Tennis - Commitment to Compete Form. "Failure to honor your commitment to complete the tournament for reasons other than injury or illness will result in forfeiture from the tournament and ineligibility from next season's NYSPHSAA State Tennis Tournament. This incident will also be reported to the student's school administration."

Ice Hockey - Recommends a waiver of NFHS rule to allow a maximum of 2 game disqualifications per contest for a coach or player.

Gate Lists - Schools that are participating in the semifinal and finals of the Baseball, Softball, Boy's Lacrosse, and Girl's Lacrosse Championships are reminded that the School Championship Gate List is to be sent to the NYSPHSAA office two days prior to the championship event. Athletic Administrators can obtain a copy of the Championship Gate List at <u>www.nysphsaa.org</u> under championships.

Community Service Challenge Award - You Can Help Change The World. Application and program information is available online @ <u>www.nysphsaa.org</u>. Deadline for Section Award is May 1. Program deadline for NYSPHSAA Award - June 1. **Sportsmanship Promotion Award** - Sections are to submit their Sportsmanship Promotion Plaque winners to the NYSPHSAA office by May 10, 2011. Sections will need to identify one or two of those schools to be considered for the Sportsmanship Promotion Banner Award. Schools that are nominated for the Banner Award will need to submit supporting documentation by **May 20th** to the NYSPHSAA office.

Central Management and Assigning of Officials - ArbiterSports

Section VI is nearing the end of the fourth year of coordinating the efforts of centralized management and assigning of sports officials through ArbiterSports. This four-year process has achieved compliance with Schools Against Violence in Education (SAVE) legislation and Section VI Superintendents' mandate in 2003 that all sports officials who work contests in Section VI must be fingerprinted. All assigners are to be commended for their cooperation, efforts and accomplishments!!

In 2010-11, sectional contests and scrimmage levels were added and assigned in Arbitersports. Also, the evaluation system for sport officials was expanded to include the sports of boys and girls lacrosse as well as boys ice hockey which used the system last year. Coaches for these sports login to arbitersports after each game to rate the officials on a variety of criteria. The results are valuable in establishing the ranking of sports officials.

Now available from each official's Arbitersports account is access to the NEW on-line Disqualification and Form X forms. The hot-line for DQ's is no longer necessary and the paper trail is eliminated since each on-line form is emailed directly to the Section office when submitted.

And lastly, with the finances of the Boys Ice Hockey Federation handled directly by the Section office, central payment was accomplished this year for boys ice hockey officials using RefPay in Arbitersports. Hockey officials opened RefPay accounts and received payments for league games in the method of their choosing: direct deposit, payment to a debit card or a check. The need for social security numbers on vouchers was eliminated and funds were available to officials within hours of release from the Section. The process was efficient and cost effective. Section VI is moving forward with this method of payment for boys and girls lacrosse officials for contests paid by the Section office (semis and finals for these sports) this spring. Under evaluation is the possibility of using RefPay in 2011-12 for all payments to officials for certain levels of sectional contests made from the Section office.

Note: The Schedule Import and Assigning Timeline for 2011-12, posted on the Section VI website, has been adjusted for fall sports in consideration of potential athletic program changes within districts following budget votes this May. Due to the current fiscal crisis in NYS, athletic programs may be eliminated or reduced. Athletic Council members, sportchairs, assigners and officials are requested to remain flexible and understanding. All are encouraged to contact Executive Director Timm Slade with budget/program issues. North Assigning will begin June 24 with a publish date of July 7.

Reminder of Requirements

Fall officials: Sign-in and update availability on ArbiterSports by the deadline specified in the Timeline (June 22) in order to receive assignments!!! A Reminder (with instructions) will be emailed to officials June 1.

Sub-Assigners: Verify rosters and rankings in ArbiterSports and notify the Section office of updates before assigning begins. **Athletic Directors:** Comply with the Timeline for 2011-12 for sport schedules.

Section VI Loses Another Veteran - Pinky Loughlin

John (Pinky) Irving Loughlin, formerly of Medina, NY and of Rock Hill, NY, died, peacefully, at home Thursday, March 31, 2011. He was born in Herkimer, NY in 1925, the son of Mary T. and Irving Loughlin. He enlisted in the United States Navy at age 17 and served in the Pacific during World War II as quartermaster and navigator aboard the USS C.S. Badger, a destroyer. He returned from the Navy and completed high school where he began a lifelong passion for coaching high school sports.

He graduated from Brockport State Teachers College in 1952 and began teaching health and physical education at Monroe High School in Rochester, NY. In 1955 he moved to Medina, NY, where he began a 26 year career with the Medina Central School district. He served in a variety of capacities including teaching assignments, athletic director, assistant principal and director of transportation. He coached track and baseball, but his great love was football where as head coach he compiled a record of 135 wins, 50 losses and 7 ties over 24 seasons. He took great satisfaction from the Mustangs being league champions 13 times during his career. He also refereed high school and college basketball for almost three decades. During his



residency in Medina, he served his community in a variety of capacities including as a Village Trustee, a member of the Board of Education and one of the founding members of the Armory Committee for the YMCA.

"Pinky" was a prominent figure in Section VI and a true servant to our athletes. He served on the Section VI Athletic Council for 15 years as the Boys Sports Representative from the Niagara Orleans League. Pinky was on the Health and Safety Standards and Finance Committees and served as co-chairman of the Sectional Basketball Committee for many years. In March 1971, the Sectional Basketball Program was dedicated to Pinky and Alan MacGamwell. He served as Chairman of the Section VI Officials Coordinating Committee, negotiating several of the contracts with the Sports Officials Pinky was also a representative on the Section VI Football Federation Committee from its inception and worked on converting Section VI Football from leagues to the present Federation, quite a practical and philosophical undertaking.

In 1992 he moved with his wife, Joanna N. Loughlin to Rock Hill, NY to be closer to their children, residing in metropolitan New York City. In Rock Hill, he served on the Board of Directors of Emerald Green Homeowners Association and the Finance Committee of St. Joseph's Parish of Wurtsboro. He was also a lifelong member of the Knights of Columbus, the American Legion and, more recently, the Holy Name Society of St. Joseph's Parish.

John is survived by Joanna, his wife of 57 years; three children, John (and Darlene) of Rye, NY, James of Manhattan, and Joseph (and Suzanne) of Rock Hill, NY; as well as four grandchildren. Visit www.journal-register.com/obituaries for online guest register.

NYSPHSAA Announces 2011 Hall of Fame Inductees

The New York State Public High School Athletic Association (NYSPHSAA) has announced the inductees for its Class of 2011 Hall of Fame. Section VI is proud to say that two of the inductees are from our own section: **Dr. Ronald Black** (Administrator, Section VI) and **Stacey Schroeder-Watt** (Athlete, Grand Island). Dr. Black and Ms. Schroeder-Watt along with Gary Clark (Coach, Section V-Fairport), Joe Cuozzo (Coach, Section XI-Ward Melville), Jay Fiedler (Athlete, Oceanside) and Louis Pettinelli (Wrestling Official) were chosen through a two-level selection process involving a screening committee and a selection committee.

Nominations were endorsed by each inductee's member Section of the Association—a preliminary requirement in the nomination process—before going on to the NYSPHSAA screening committee for consideration. The six inductees will be honored this summer at the NYSPHSAA's Annual Hall of Fame Banquet on Wednesday, August 3rd at the High Peaks in Lake Placid, NY (Section VII). The Hall of Fame, launched in 2002 and sponsored by Pupil Benefits Plan, Inc. and Jostens, is mirrored after the National Federation of State High School Associations (NFHS) program which recognizes individuals in the categories of athlete, coach, official, administrator and related contributor.

DR. RONALD BLACK, Administrator (Akron Central School- Section VI)

Dr. Ronald Black, a long-time administrator in Section VI, was NYSPHSAA's President from 2006-08 and the Section VI President for two terms. For nearly 40 years, he worked in Section VI schools as a teacher and Administrative Assistant to the District Principal at Holland Central School (1961-72) and as a Principal in Akron Central School District (1972-99). An Orchard Park resident, Dr. Black was additionally appointed a long-term seat on the NYSPHSAA's Championship Advisory Committee and served on the Strategic Planning Committee in the early 2000's.



Prior to his administrative career, Dr. Black was a four-sport athlete playing football, basketball, track and baseball at Buffalo Technical High School, then went on to play soccer at SUNY Cortland and later became the coach of the freshman soccer team at Penn State University. He earned his Bachelor of Science from SUNY Cortland and a Master of Science in 1961 from Pennsylvania State University. He additionally earned a Doctorate of Education from SUNY Buffalo in 1970, and in 1973-74

he received a Certificate of Specialization in Education Administration and a Certification of School District Administrators from Niagara University. Ron has received numerous honors and awards during his career including the School Administrators Association of New York State (SAANYS) Region 12 Administrator of the Year Award (1991) as well as SAANYS New York State Distinguished Secondary Principal (1992) award and the New York State Athletic Administrators Association Distinguished Service Award to Athletics (1992).



STACEY SCHROEDER-WATT - ATHLETE (Grand Island – Section VI)

Stacey Schroeder-Watt was one of the most exceptional track athletes in the state competing at Grand Island High School in Section VI. Her dominance in the shot put and discus led to a remarkable career including two NYSPHSAA State Championships in the shot put (1991, 1992) and one in the discus in 1992 when she shattered the girls state record, which still stands today. From 1988 through 1990 as an underclassman, she also earned spots in the NYSPHSAA State Championships after dominating Section VI in shot put and discus. Overall, Schroeder-Watt won five Section shot put titles and four Section discus crowns to go along with eight Niagara Frontier League championships. Her performances in the shot put and discus led to the honor of All-American status in 1991 and 1992 and being ranked number one in the country in 1992.

Beyond track, Stacey also successfully participated in high school volleyball and basketball. In volleyball, she was a first team League All-Star in 1992 and second team All Star in 1991 while helping her team to a Section championship. As a

Section VI is pleased to announce that the Clarence Boys Indoor Track has achieved the distinct honor of State Scholar/Athlete Championship for winter sports!!



Courtney broke the Lancaster teams vault record of 9.35 set in 2007, and she broke the uneven bar record back in October scoring a 9.45, surpassing the previous record of 9.35.

Courtney led her Lancaster High School team this season to their 11th Sectional Team Championship and hopes to continue this reign of success as she enters her freshman year at Lancaster next season.





Iroquois' Kloc Earns State Wrestling Championship

Iroquois junior Jimmy Kloc went undefeated at 145 pounds in Division I to lead the Chiefs' contingent of three participants and become the first Chief to be state champion since Matt Mariacher in 2007. 

NYSPHSAA SPORTSMANSHIP MEETING

On March 17, 2011 the State Sportsmanship committee discussed a number of issues. Please discuss this information at your next league meeting and get back to the section office any information that we need to take back to the state.

- Ice Hockey Game Misconducts: The NYSPHSAA Ice Hockey Committee has recommended a waiver of the NFHS rule that allows only one game disqualification penalty per contest for a player or coach. The recommendation is to allow a maximum of 2 game disqualifications per contest for a player or coach. This recommendation is fully supported by the Sportsmanship Committee.
- Wrestling Sportsmanship Concerns: Some of our sections have expressed a concern about wrestlers that are not being properly supervised immediately following a match. Some of these unsupervised wrestlers are very upset about losing a close match and have caused extensive damage to local venues. In one case a wrestler was arrested and charged with a crime. The committee feels that all student athletes need to be properly supervised before, during, and especially after a contest. The committee recommends that a reminder be stated to the NYSPHSAA Executive Committee and the NYSPHSAA Wrestling Committee about properly supervising student athletes especially following a match or contest.
- Sportsmanship during Foul Shots: Section 8 asked the other representatives if their section had a rule regarding noise during foul shots. No other section had a specific rule regarding noise during foul shots. Most of the sections referred back to the Be Loud Be Proud Be Positive statement. As long as the noise was a positive and not negative toward an individual they did not have a problem with the practice. Noise is allowed during the entire game as long as it is not negative toward and individual or a school or official.
