Congratulations to Wilson's State Scholar/Athlete Champions

NYSPHSAA has announced that the Wilson Girls Volleyball Team team has achieved the State Scholar/Athlete Championship for Fall Sports!

Wilson's 8 member Girls Volleyball Team placed first out of 231 teams in the state with a combined average of 96.972. This is Wilson's first Scholar/Athlete State Championship in the state

in the state program's 14-year history. Wilson is

the Section's 5th school to earn the Girls Volleyball S/A State title in the last 10 years. Their team GPA of 96.972 is only .028 of a point away from the state's highest average in the fourteen years of the program. They are second only to Monticello of Section 9 that won the state title in1998 with an average of 97.0. The amazing fact is that all girls are juniors and have another chance to eclipse that



mark next year.

Not only were the Lakewomen good in the classroom, their 9 wins, 5 losses earned them a 2nd Place Finish in the competitive Niagara Orleans League and a Sectional Quarter-Final

- 1. E-mail a photo to the State office by sending it to: pictures@nysphsaa.org
- 2. Enter your team's roster into the Association database by going to the website www.nysphsaa.org, then click on "forms", click on "roster report form" and complete the roster form.

Don't wait until you have made it to the semi-finals. By that time it is often too late if there is a problem receiving your photo and/ or roster. Be sure that your teams and athletes get the recognition they deserve!

Centralized Management of Assigning of Officials

In September 2004, the Section VI Athletic Council created an Ad Hoc Committee for the purpose of researching the issue of centralized management of assigning of officials, reviewing associated costs, and providing recommendations regarding the direction for this task as a section-wide initiative. The members of committee include Superintendents and representatives from each of the four BOCES and all six leagues within the Section. After several meetings, the Ad Hoc Committee's initial recommendations include:

- Move forward with centralization management of assigning of officials.
- Appoint a Technology Committee for the development of the software and hardware with an initial meeting to be held in February 2005.
- Begin centralized management of assigning with basketball and wrestling in 2005-2006, and establish a time-line to phase-in all sports.
- Hire the lead person for this new office by July 1, 2005. Hire additional personnel needed by fall 2005.
- Appoint a Management Committee with responsibility for equity, quality assurance, overall guidelines and establishing general management principles.
- House the central management office with Section VI, under the auspices of the Management Committee.
- Review the assigning portion of the Officials' Contract and make recommendations towards a more cost effective centralized management system.

Additional study is needed with regards to the specific technical aspects of the project, the creation of BOCES positions and job descriptions and overall financial ramifications to districts.

The committee has been sharing information at meetings of Superintendents, Business Administrators and District Superintendents from the four BOCES since their most recent meeting on December 9, 2004. Opportunities for sharing information with additional groups will be provided as needed. The issue will be a discussion item at the January 19, 2005 meeting of the Section VI Athletic Council. Additional details of the Ad Hoc Committee's research and complete meeting notes will be forwarded to Council members in early January. It is anticipated that by the end of January there will be an opportunity to move forward with a postcard ballot due to the nature of this type of item and its potential impact to districts.


Wrestling State Qualifier to be held at Ralph Wilson Field House

Hamburg

The Hamburg Boys volleyball faced off against McQuaid Jesuit of Rochester in the Class A State Regional Championships. The scores of the game were 25-23, 25-21, 22-25, 25-17. This was Hamburg's first State Intersectional title for the boys volleyball program. During the State tournament the Bulldogs went 5-1 in pool play by beating Burnt Hills (Albany) 25-22, 25-16, Central Square (Syracuse) 25-28, 25-12, and McQuaid (Rochester) 25-18, 22-25.

After starting the season 0-2, Hamburg finished on a 21 game winning streak with an overwhelming 30-3. The team, coached by Brian Carroll, won the 16-team Eden tournament, competing against teams from all over NY State, the Orchard Park tournament, and the Sweet Home Tournament. This is the most successful volleyball team Hamburg has had in its schools history.

Ken Lindstrom, the officer who monitors sportsmanship for the Niagara Frontier Board of Women's Soccer Officials (otherwise known as the Girls Soccer Referees) has announced that for the third year in a row, the WNFBOWS Varsity Sportsmanship Champion is the Jamestown Lady Red Raider Soccer Team.

All 110 WNFBOWS members rate sportsmanship for each of the 53 public and private school team at every Varsity, JV and Modified Soccer game that they officiate. The public school with highest compiled rating is awarded The WNFBOWS Varsity Sportsmanship Award. There may be 5 different public champions determined by wins and losses, but there is only one Sportsmanship

Champion! Winning this award once is a great achievement. What is amazing is that the Jamestown Varsity team won this award three times in a row, while competing against 52 other varsity teams. It is a great tribute to the girls, their teachers, coaches and parents, that such a difficult accolade was attained. Winning may be an important goal in playing sports, but to the members of WNFBOWS and many others involved in High School sports, the development of fine quality young citizens is much more significant. Playing High School sports should be a learning experience. One of the best ways to determine if a team is doing well in this learning experience, is their display of sportsmanship.

Also, for the 8th consecutive year, the Jamestown Girls Soccer team achieved the NYSPHSAA Scholar-Athlete Team Award. Seventeen of the twenty-one players on the team received the Scholar-Athlete pin in 2004. The Lady Raiders finished their season with a record of 10-6-3 in ECIC.

In addition to the Sportsmanship Team Award, WNFBOWS presents an award each year to the coach of the varsity team with the highest rating amongst both public and private schools. This year, also for the third year in a row, the Coach of the Year Award was presented to **Randy Anderson** of Jamestown High School. Two years ago when Randy won the award, the first thought was "what a wonderful choice!". Last year when he won, it

was "Lightning Strikes Twice!". When his name was announced as the winner for this year, it was obvious "Excellence is a habit!" Randy has stated "I feel very lucky to be a coach in Jamestown where I have such wonderful student-athletes, supportive parents, and strong backing from Athletic Director, Ben Drake, and Wally Huckno before him."

Procedural change

Officers of officials organizations should note that there has been a minor change to the fingerprinting policy for new officials. The packets with completed fingerprint cards, money order and consent forms should now be sent to the Section VI office instead of SED. A newly fingerprinted official will be added to the Section website as "Clearance Pending" when the completed packet is received at the Section office. This will ensure that the data sent to SED is complete and accurate, and will expedite the process. CCAA Sportsmanship Day - Civility



Section VI to Host Action on Target Workshop: "Life of an Athlete"

Mr. John Underwood, Founder and Director of the American Athletic Institute, in cooperation with the New York State Public High School Athletic Association and the NYS Chemical Health Committee will present a one-day training workshop at **Daemen College**, 4380 Main Street, Amherst, NY. The workshop will be held on Monday, January 24, 2005 beginning at 9:00 am. Mr. Underwood has presented numerous programs in school districts, colleges and universities in and around New York. His presentations are always well received and generate a great deal of interest in his materials.

District superintendents, high school and middle school administrators are urged to attend the first two hours during which time Mr. Underwood will present an overview of the new five year program and its potential impact on district-wide athletic programs.

Athletic Directors and others being trained are asked to attend the full day session. Those "teams" from each school district in Section VI who are being trained will be facilitators of Phase One of the program. Districts are encouraged to send 3 to 5 members to participate at the training session. Phase One entitled "The Life of the Athlete" is a program designed to help modified-level student athletes understand the basic purpose of interscholastic athletics, lifestyle of the athlete, training effects and to help them establish a perspective for healthy participation, physically, and emotionally. This program lays the groundwork for establishing clear and consistent boundaries for our programs.

Note: Each district school represented at the workshop will leave with a PowerPoint CD and master copies of all materials needed to present the program at a preseason meeting for middle school student athletes, their parents, and coaches.  Florida recently became the 18th state to enact legislation specifically created to protect sports officials during, before, and after contests.

The Florida Senate and House approved a bill to protect sports officials at all levels of competition from threats and assaults as one of its final acts before adjourning its 2004 session on April 30th.

Both houses unanimously passed the Senate version which increases aggravated assault and battery punishments to the felony level.

The law adds the definition of sports officials to an existing provision that already protests numerous other public servants such as elected officials, teachers, Department of Children and Family Services employees and others.

To date New York is not on the list of 18; however, significant research is under way with this effort.

 I was recently confronted with a very legitimate question concerning the promotion of aspiring young officials. Naturally my comments revolved around the five "P's". Successful officials usually demonstrate behavior which is professional, punctual, prepared, polite, and positive.

I would be remiss if I didn't include a personal belief that the accomplished official is usually committed to being an educator at heart. The NYSPHSAA Handbook expresses a belief that all officials should be trained to deal with secondary students at a professional level. Constructive gestures and comments are often perceived as part of the valuable service rendered by officials, especially at the modified level.
