#### NYSPHSAA Handbook Rule Changes (approved January 2005)

Page 55, #2 Amateur

NOTE: Only awards or prizes having a monetary value of one hundred dollars or less per competition will be approved by the Association. Move NOTE up to #2, and add the following:

When honoring student athletes for success in NYSPHSAA sponsored championship events, Boards of Education are encouraged to approve limited awards that are appropriate to high school level competition.

Page 68 #22B – Add as second sentence: Specifically, during the regular season physical and/or instructional activities related to the sport on seven consecutive days is prohibited.

#### **Boys Basketball**

The request to use 3-man officiating in all state tournament contests was denied.

#### Girls Basketball

The request to rotate the selection of the 12<sup>th</sup> official between sections was denied. The 12<sup>th</sup> official will be provided by the host section.

#### Field Hockey

The following rules were approved for permanent adoption:

Rule 2-1-2a: Officials may wear a solid color shirt contrasting with the color of both teams' uniform tops or alternating black and white 1-inch vertically striped shirt.

Rule 4-2-2g: The game clock may continue to run after goals are scored and when one team is ahead by 5 or more goals.

#### Rifle

The request to increase participation in Air Rifle to equal the participation in Cartridge competition at the Regional Championships (6 competitors per sport per section) was approved.

#### Softball

The Softball Committee's request for <u>a waiver</u> on the use of "NOCSAE approved" facemasks for the 2005 softball season was approved. FYI: Schools may permit the student athletes to wear batting helmets with attached face masks.

#### **Boys Tennis**

The Boys Tennis proposal to allow the PSAL to participate in the 2005 Championships on a one year trial basis was approved.

#### Girls Tennis

The request to fill the 2 byes in the state tournaments opening round brackets in both singles and doubles competition was denied.

#### Track and Field

The proposal to expand the definition of excellence for an individual sport to be one Class for every 300 schools with a program to a maximum of 3 was DEFEATED.

Reminder: Schools planning to send athletes to the sanctioned Penn Relays must register with Lloyd Mott, 518-439-8872 at the state office.

#### Wrestling

The request to extend the 2 class state tournament format experiment to 2005-06 was approved.

### Wrestling Minimum Weight Certification

This year, NYS had several schools utilize the services of an assessor who had let their certification lapse. We were able to correct the situations with the help of our Regional Consultant, but schools are to check our list of certified assessors prior to scheduling assessments each season. We will be attempting to develop an assessors' email contact list to help us communicate important messages, reminders, and information to each assessor.

Two wrestling schools violated the "14 Day Rule" having teams assessed after the last allowable day in their section. Again, working with the section wrestling coordinator and the regional coordinators, steps were taken to censure the schools and develop a process for assessing the wrestlers so they did not lose their season. Penalties were applied.

The Wrestling Advisory Committee will meet in the early spring to review the minimum weight certification process along with several wrestling rules related to weigh-ins, hydration and weight loss. A consideration of replacing the calipers for assessing % of body fat with the Tanita BMI impedance machine and moving to centralized sites for weight assessments in regions will take place. The committee has recommended that theses happen in the future. Some related research has taken place in this past season.

Lloyd Mott will be a co-presenter, along with one of our Regional Consultants, on the minimum weight certification process at the NYSAAA Conference in March. The goal will be to have athletic directors become better informed and more involved in the process.

#### **Out-of-Season Competition**

On October 28, 2004, Nina Van Erk convened a subcommittee to review NYSPHSAA and Commissioner of Education rules and regulations pertaining to attendance at <u>unsanctioned and so-called national meets</u>. The subcommittee drafted the attached Points of Emphasis to outline how athletes can participate in these events unattached from their high school programs while adhering to the spirit of our rules:

#### Points Of Emphasis

In order to encourage compliance within the spirit of NYSPHSAA and Commissioners Regulations, this is to serve to guide school districts so that athletes can avoid being declared ineligible for high school competition

- High school aged athletes wishing to compete in unsanctioned events or so called "national" events may participate if they are not representing their high school and/or their high school is not sponsoring the event in any manner.
- Clubs should have no affiliation with the school or the school's athletic program.
   Coaches should be volunteers or compensated by club funds. Clubs should be self-insured and not under the insurance policy of the school district. Clubs should establish a name different from the high school team and purchase separate uniforms for competition.
- School uniforms may not be worn.
  Regarding track and field: According to
  NFHS Track and Field rules, "School issued
  uniforms must be worn in competition".
  Therefore any uniform (regardless of
  purchaser) worn during high school
  competition must not be worn in
  unsanctioned events.

- · School district funds should not be used to fund entry fees, travel, meals, lodging, etc. School districts should not be linked with athletes participation in any manner.
- Athletes should be encouraged to obtain a USATF card. Membership also includes insurance for the individual.

#### "Fairness in High School Athletic Competition Act"

#### Message from Kathryn P. Faber, President, NYSPHSAA

Assemblyman Morelle's proposed legislation "Fairness in High School Athletic Competition Act" has been introduced to the Assembly (Bill A2162) and to the Senate (Bill S2064) supported by Senator Libous from the Section IV area. This legislation, if passed, will completely alter how we establish and conduct our state tournaments. It should be understood that with its passage we will lose the control to have a school, league, section or committee present future proposals to improve our programs and championships.

It is imperative that all of us involved in high school athletics voice our opinion of this legislation so that we may maintain control over the future of our association. If you are opposed to the legislation please take the time to write to your local legislators; both in the Assembly and the Senate. A sample letter is available at the Section VI office 821-7299 to assist you in this endeavor. It is important for your letter to be mailed on either personal or school letterhead. A complete list of all members of the Assembly and the Senate is also available at the Section office. Please inform others so they may also support the NYSPHSAA by expressing their opposition to this legislation.

Every letter will count in our effort to maintain member school control in the decision making process of the NYSPHSAA.

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#### Scholarship Announcement

Sports PT of NY, PC, managed by HEALTHSOUTH, has created Scholar-Athlete Awards to honor an outstanding male and female senior student-athlete in Section VI. ### **Central Assigning of Officials**

A special meeting of the Section VI Athletic Council was held in February to address the issue of computer assigning of sports officials. After much discussion it was decided that additional investigation is necessary. As a result, the Athletic Council formally approved continuing the investigation of centralized management of assigning and payment of officials. An Ad Hoc committee with representation from each league was established to determine the software system best suited to the needs of our member schools and to investigate the best way to serve the needs of the leagues. Additional responsibilities of the committee will be to establish guidelines and principles,

determine the responsibilities of the personnel assigned to the Section VI Central Management office and determine the overall impact on the assigning section of the Officials Contract.

Don Raw, Steve Vanstrom and Dave Thomas volunteered to serve on the committee. The Athletic Council directed President Nicotra to appoint additional members from each league to the committee. League representatives interested in serving on this committee should contact the Section VI office.

#### Time for a sport thought??

- Suppose you have a rule that any player who misses a practice without clearing it with you in advance will be suspended for one game. If your star player violated this rule just before the most important game of the season, would you be willing to enforce the penalty even if it meant that you would lose the game?
- Should you consult with your players before establishing team rules? That is, should you ask players to contribute suggestions concerning team rules and penalties?

#### Hot Topics at the State Level

As most of us are aware, bullying and specifically "Hazing" as it relates to athletic teams have drawn national attention. NYS and local districts have responded with committees and in turn antibullying policies and related programs to address what our society has deemed unacceptable practices and behavior.

Expect as Athletic Directors a concerned point of emphasis to be placed squarely on your shoulders and in turn your coaches in dealing with this matter in a proactive manner.
