She honors herself, her team, and her school as she highlights this positive relationship between scholarship and athletics.

I consider her to be Lancaster's greatest track and field athlete. She is a champion sprinter, as well, who owns the sprints on her high school record board. Lancaster High School's track and field program has supported and helped develop Mary's athletic and scholastic potential but her

personal pole vault coach, Rick Suhr, who runs his own pole vault training program, is especially responsible for her pole vault achievements. After much thought and many choices, Mary decided to attend Notre Dame after graduation.

Saxer's Accomplishments:

Indoor Track (as of March 2004) Mary finished the indoor track season as NYSPHAA and Federation Long Jump Champion and was National Scholastic Indoor Track Champion with a 19'-3 1/4" jump. She was second in the NSIC pole vault with a 12'-5 1/4'' vault.

2005 Coaches Clinics

Good Sports Program and Awards

Schools sent assessments to Section Coordinators by April 15. Coordinators sent a list of schools deserving awards to Lloyd Mott by May 10. The Committee to select schools to be recognized with the banner meets May 12. In the future, the assessment forms will be posted on the website for coordinators to download and distribute to schools. Letters of introduction with directions will be emailed to coordinators to share with Athletic Directors and Superintendents.

Safety

Reports of MRSA (Methicillin Resistant Staphylococcus Aureus) being found in athletes not in a hospital environment have stimulated much discussion. Mark Donnelly, Section 7 Safety rep, reported that the wrestling team at West Point Military Academy had a serious problem with infection to wrestlers. This will be further investigated by Mark, Dr. John O'Bryan and Doug Sackett (Safety Committee Liaisons). The state Safety Committee is interested in methods to prevent the spread of such diseases. Their findings will be shared.

Swimming

Approval was given to Girls and Boys Swimming to participate in the NFHS experimental no-recall rule for 2005-06, that the athlete who false starts will not be recalled, but instead would be disqualified after the race is completed.

Volleyball

The following requests were <u>approved</u> at the state meeting May 6:

- The continued use of USA Volleyball rules for 2005-2007
- Change the date for the implementation of the USA Uniform Rule from Nov. 1, 2006 to Sept. 1, 2009
- Waiver of the NCAA warm-up protocol leaving the rule as it had been that the teams can warmup behind or adjacent to the court during the warm-up period (Rule 9, Section 1, Article 2, page 41-42)

• Transfer(p.74) Exemptions #1 add "and can substantiate that they are independent and self-supporting"

Representation (P.69) Add after last sentence "School districts may submit a written request to the section for adjustment of contests for individual participants"

This waiver was requested due to limited availability of NOCSAE approved facemasks and the late notification of the "NOCSAE approved" requirement. Schools should be prepared to outfit all softball teams with NOCEA approved facemasks for the 2006 season.

Outdoor Track (as of June 2004) Her jump of 19'-5 1/2" earned her the title of NYSPHAA and Federation Outdoor Track Long Jump Champion, and a record for Section VI. At the same time she placed second in the pole vault with a vault of 12'-3". At the Adidas Outdoor National Track and Field Championships held at North Carolina State in June, Mary earned All-American honors for her fourth place finish in the pole vault with an effort of 11'-11 3/4" and her sixth place long jump of 18'-6".

Indoor Track (as of March 2005)

Mary set her first national high school record in the pole vault at the Dartmouth Relays on January 8, 2005 where she became the first US high school female to clear a monumental 14'-0" indoors or out. She placed second in the long jump with 18'-5 1/2". She also led her 2 x 200 M relay team to a sixth place and helped her team place second of fifty-one Northeast high schools. After a special invitation, she competed on February 4 in the Millrose Games in Madison Square Garden, the top indoor meet in America.

At the NYSPHSAA competition, Mary was a rare double winner. She won the pole vault with 13'-5" and the long jump, resetting the indoor section long jump record to 19'-2". At the National Scholastic Indoor Track & Field Championship (NSIC), she was the pole vault champion and then reset the national pole vault record to 14'-2" at the Nike Indoor National Championship (NIN). This is the best vault ever in the world by a female 17&under and a USTAF 19&under record. Presently she is ranked 5th of all vaulters in the US including Olympians.

Mary has been featured in the New York Times and was one of Sport's Illustrated Faces in the Crowd in February. Some have her pegged for the 2008 Summer Games in Beijing or perhaps the 2012 games in New York City.



Niagara Falls Takes NYSPHSAA and Federation Crowns

Niagara Falls Boys Basketball, the Number One Ranked Large School in Western New York (Buffalo News Poll), won the New York State and Federation Class AA Championships with final record of 28-1. MVP Paul Harris netted 19 points and grabbed 8 rebounds to lead Niagara Falls to a 69-58 victory over New Rochelle, Section 1, in the NYSPHSAA boys basketball Class AA tournament. The Wolverines Greg Gamble added 11 points for Niagara Falls, while Jonathan Flynn and Robert Garrison each netted 10 points. In the NYS Federation Tournament of Champions, Robert Garrison and Paul Harris teamed up for 37 points to lead Niagara Falls to a 68-65 victory over Xaverian (CHSAA). Garrison finished the game with 20 points and 5 assists, while Harris tallied 17 points, 15 rebounds and 8 assists. James Starks added 12 points, while Greg Gamble chipped in with 7 points and 14 boards for the Wolverines.

On the national scene, NFHS finished #3 in the USA Today poll as well as #1 in the Hoops USA poll. NFHS's only loss was a 3 point overtime loss to Vashon (MO) who was ranked #1 in the country at that time in the Primetime Shootout in NJ. The Wolverines won the prestigious City of Palms Tourney in December defeating several top ranked teams. Paul Harris led the team in scoring with 19 points, 12 rebounds and 5 assists. NFHS also won the Cataract City Classic held in Niagara Falls defeating a then undefeated Schenectady team, making them a four-time Cataract City Classic Champion. Other prominent victories for the Wolverines include teams such as Buchtel, Ohio, St. Edwards, Ohio, Jamesville Dewitt, Syracuse and East HS, Rochester (twice).

Paul Harris, 6'5" Guard/Forward, ranked 20th nationally, is now a 2time Western New York Player of the Year. Harris, Greg Gamble, 6'3" Forward, and Rob Garrison 6' 1" Point Guard are First Team All Western New York. Jonathan Flynn is Second Team. Greg will play next year at the State University of New York at Buffalo on a full college scholarship. Rob has received offers from Boston University, Lehigh, Binghamton, Canisius, and Robert Morris. James Starks, 6' 3" Guard/Forward and all Western New York Football selection, is the team's best overall athlete with a combination of size, speed and strength that makes him a force on the court. He is going to the State University of New York at Buffalo on a football scholarship. Other team members include Tyrell Douglass, James Bennett, Kendall Davis, Tyrell Lynch, Anthony Marshall, and Marcel and Miguel Respress. Coach Dan Bazzani is a member of the District Sports Hall of Fame for his own athletic accomplishments. Assistant Coaches include Bob Stone and Sal Constantino.

It took much work and difficult times to achieve our success in 2004, but it was shortly after that challenge that we began our quest for the 2005 State Championship. Our third in a row.


The Pine Valley Lady Panther Basketball Program has a rich tradition of success. Since 1988 (17 years), the Lady Panther's have won 15 League Championships, appeared in 16 Section VI Championships, won 9 Western Regional Championships and 7 State Championships.

The questions posed are "how can you be so lucky every year?" or "what do you feed those girls at Pine Valley?". First, we at Pine Valley have a "program", not just a team. We start our girls off young and are consistent with the things that we teach. We have several philosophies that we follow at all levels. The first one is: <u>Practice</u> equals <u>Success</u> which leads to <u>Confidence</u> which leads to more <u>Success</u>. We work on skills which will help individuals do good things on the court. When they experience a degree of success, they start believing in themselves and their abilities, which brings even greater success. We also tell the girls often that basketball is a TEAM sport and each individual needs her teammates to achieve their goals. A Lady Panther has to believe not only in herself, but also in her teammates. A third philosophy is "play the game hard". Players shouldn't be concerned with the score, but with doing their best.

A team is created to achieve what an individual cannot . The 2005 edition of the Lady Panthers was comprised of Seniors: Justina Troutman, Bryelle Cortright, Jennifer Farley, Jamie Reynolds, Ashley Weiss and Katie Reynolds; Juniors: Brianna Colburn, Rachel Johnson, Amanda Hillebert, Lyndsay Foster, Dakota Hirschman-Stankey, Kim Lincoln and Alexis Gadra; Sophomores: Deanna Schmittendorf and Kaliene Hallett and Freshman: Jessica Farley.




Justin Craddock, a senior at Kenmore East High School,won the 600 meters at the NYSPHSAA Championship Indoor Track meet at the Carrier Dome in Syracuse on March 5, 2005.

His time 1:20.59 is a new Section VI record.

At the National Scholastic Indoor Championships at the Armory in NYC, he won the 800 meters, breaking the Indoor state record. This was the #4 indoor performance all-time and ranks him #1 in the country at this time.

Justin, coached by Geoff Brunger, owns school records in Indoor Track for the Long Jump, 300, 600, 1000, 4 x 2 relay, 4 x 4 relay, 4 x 8 relay and in Outdoor Track & Field for the 400. He also excels academically having been on several of Kenmore East's NYSPHSAA Scholar-Athlete teams for Cross Country, Indoor Track and Outdoor Track. After graduation, Justin plans to attend college at either Kansas State, Texas A & M, Eastern Michigan or Kentucky.



Cory Pixley, a senior at Pioneer High School, took 1st place in the High Jump at the NYSPHSAA State Championship with a height of 6'4". As a junior, Cory won the Section

VI Championship Title with his best jump of the season 6'6".

Cory is Coach Mary Doud's first State Champion!! He is the son of Vicki Goldsmith of Delevan, NY and John Pixley of Franklinville, NY.

Lancaster Athlete Wins Two State Medals for Indoor Track

At Syracuse University's Carrier Dome, Lancaster High School's **Mary Saxer** surprised no one by leading the pole vault which she won with a 13'-5" vault. She narrowly missed an attempt at breaking her own national record, at that time, of 14 feet. Shortly before she was called to the vault, she reset her section record in the long jump with a winning leap of 19'-2". That made her a double winner in the state championship competition and a three-time state long jump champion!



Section VI Successfully Defends State Rifle Crown (.22 cal)

The Section 6 rifle team successfully defended its rifle crown by firing a score of 1655.67 and edging out Section 8 and their total of 1650.67 in the sectional competition at the State Regionals held at West Point on March 5, 2005. Firing on the Sectional team were: Rebecca Gerevics (Alden)- 287.16, Meghan Seitz (Al) -285.14, Deven

McMaster (Ken East) - 276.11, Chris Koss (Clarence) - 276.09, Ken Krueger (Al) - 270.06 and Mike Barone (Al) - 261.06. Julie Schaefer (Al), team alternate fired a 257.07. Despite firing a score of 1103 (22 pts higher then their winning score of 2004), the Alden H.S. team finished in 2^{nd} place in the high school competition.

Five of this year's team members were on the winning 2004 team. The 2004 team won the sectional competition with a score of 1623.44 and again edged out Section 8 with a score of 1620.052. Firing on the 2004 team - Seitz - 284.07, Krueger - 276.08, McMaster - 273.11 Gerevics - 266.06 and Mike Barone - 255.05. The 6th team member was Joe Bromley (Ken East) - 269.07. Gerevics is a 10th grader and Krueger an 11th grader. The remaining members of the team are seniors.

Gerevics won 2nd aggregate (total-3 position), 2nd prone, 5th offhand and 1st kneeling Seitz won: 4th aggregate, 4th prone, 6th offhand and 2nd kneeling McMaster won: 8th aggregate, 3rd prone and 8th offhand Koss won: 9th aggregate, 10th offhand and 8th kneeling Krueger won 12th aggregate, 9th offhand and 9th kneeling.

Kane Smith's Road to his Second State Title

In the 2004 wrestling season, **Kane Smith** of Salamanca High School, won the state title at 189 lbs and was undefeated with a 43-0 record. He became Salamanca's first ever state champion. He then went on to place 5th in the nation at the Brute-Adidas Nationals held at the University of Nebraska. This past summer Kane won the gold medal at the empire state games. This season, Kane successfully defended his first state title by defeating:

1st round:Jake Austin of Section III 12-1Semi's:Mark Bailey of Section IV Fall 1:192nd round:Shane Spence of Section XI TF 15-0Finals:Nick Clark of Section V 8-3

This was Smith's and Clark's second meeting of the year as they met in the Finals of the Salamanca Tournament back in February, with Smith winning 7-3. Kane again finished undefeated with a record of 44-0. His career record is 201-43

Kane is only the second wrestler in Salamanca history to go over 200 wins. Victor Arena was the other with 217.

At the Senior Nationals in Cleveland in early April, Kane wrestled at 189 lbs, which was perhaps the toughest weight class in the tournament as 11 nationally ranked wrestlers competed. Rebecca Gerevics, a 10th grader at Alden High School, fired a 99-7C in the kneeling position to win the State Kneeling Crown at the



regional match at West Point on March 05, 2005. Rebecca fired an aggregate score of 287-16C, 99.08C prone, 89.01C offhand and 99.07C kneeling. Her aggregate (total, three position) score tied Mu Tang's (Valley Stream) aggregate score, but Rebecca lost first place overall on a tie breaker. (Mu Tang fired a 92 in the offhand position to win the tie breaker). Besides her 1st place finish kneeling and 2nd place aggregate, Rebecca also won 2nd place prone and 5th place offhand. Her kneeling score was a state record.

Rebecca, an honor student at Alden, is in her second year of shooting for the Bulldog rifle team. She received her scholar athlete pin from the NYSPHSAA this year at the winter sports night on March 8. As a 9th grader, Rebecca was on Alden's State Winning team where she fired a 266 (12th place). This year, she had the 2nd best average on the team (277.25) and the second best in the league. Her best match this year was in the sectionals, where she fired an aggregate score of 288.11C in .22 cal rifle and 186.06C in air rifle and set three sectional records. Her aggregate record was a sectional record. It broke the old record of 287.06C set by Alden's Brian Curtis in 1990 and tied by Kenmore East's Adam D'Ambrosio in 1991. Her second record - offhand - 94.02 also broke the record (92.02) fired by Curtis in 1990 and tied by teammate Megan Seize in 2004. The Southwestern Wrestling team finished the season as the No. 1 ranked Small School in Western New York and won the Division 1 league title by sweeping league foes Fredonia, Falconer, and Salamanca. And what the Trojans did following the regular season was become one of the most successful postseason wrestling squads in recent history.

Southwestern ran away with the Class AA team title and also sent seven of its 15 wrestlers to the Section 6 Qualifiers. At the Section 6 tournament the Trojans placed six of their seven wrestlers in the finals and four of them won to advance to the New York State Public High School Athletic Association state championships at the Pepsi Arena in Albany.

Once there, the four Southwestern wrestlers shined as **Matt Mazgaj** repeated as the 215pound state champion for Division 2 with a dominating win over Cooperstown's Brendan Hill in the finals. **Shane Uber** and **Dusty Truver** both cruised into the finals at 152 and 135 respectively, before losing tough decisions to finish as runners-up. And **Junior Mikel Bush** took 5th place at 171lbs. after winning his first two matches of the weekend.

For their efforts, the Trojans finished with the most points among Small Schools in the state and were crowned 2005 NYS Division 2 Team Champions. This was the school's first NYS Team championship.

Matt Mazgaj ended his season with a 40-3 record (130-28 career) and also became Southwestern's first ever two-time state champion. Dusty Truver ended his career with a record of 151-24, which set the SWCS career win record. This wrestling team is by far one of the most successful wrestling squads in recent history. What a wonderful way to end the 2004-05 season...NYSPHSAA Division 2 Team Champions!

Michael Aris Brings State Title to Barker

Barker's varsity wrestler Michael Aris was crowned the NY State Champ in the 130pound weight class at the NYSPHSAA Championships in Albany on March 5, 2005.

In the 2004-05 season, Mike Aris, a junior at Barker High School, earned a 41-2 win/loss record. He was named to the all tournament team at Churchville Chili dual meet tournament, took first place at the Akron, Lockport, and Depew Tournaments and 4th place at the Niagara Frontier

Wrestling Officials Tournament, where he recorded Barker's first ever 100th career wins.

But Mr. Aris saved his best performances for the post-season earning his second Niagara-Orleans League Championship with a first period pin in the finals. At Ripley in the Class "A" Divisional Tournament he continued with his outstanding performance by defeating a Frewsburg wrestler 17-7 in the finals, and earning the Most Outstanding Wrestler Award for the tournament. At the Ralph Wilson Field House, Division II State Qualifier Wrestling Tournament for Section VI, Mike continued with an opening round pin over a Portville wrestler. In the semi-finals, he defeated a Medina wrestler 6-2 and went on in the finals to major decision a Southwestern



Wrestler 17-8 that was currently ranked #1 in Western New York. Mike's surprising upset earned him his second Most Outstanding Wrestler Award in the post season.

In Albany, NY at the Pepsi Arena for the NYSPHSAA Wrestling State Tournament, after a bye in the opening round, he wrestled a Section VII wrestler first. Mike had a commanding 5-2 lead when he put his opponent to his back for a third period

pin. His Semi-Finals match was victorious again with a 6-2 win against a Section III wrestler. In the finals, Mike was taken down in the opening period until the end of the period against a Section IV wrestler from Windsor. He scored with a reversal to tie the match, 2-2. Mike's opponent, choosing the bottom position after winning the toss, scored a quick reversal to go up, 4-2. Mike again, battled back at the end of the 2nd period with a reversal to tie the score at 4-4. In the 3rd period Mike took bottom and the Section IV Windsor wrestler rode him out for a good minute. After attempting several reversals with no change of position, Mike battled for a late escape to go up 5-4. With fifteen seconds left in the match Mike held on for Barker's first ever State Championship Title. Mike Aris is coached by Bill Bruning.

• One of the major challenges that face athletic administrators, coaches, and officials today is that of ensuring a sense of fair play and sportsmanship at each and every contest scheduled. Volumes have been written on the subject, but often overlooked is the impact of the officials involved.

Much like a judge in our legal system, officials should be expected to have a keen sense of the contest rules and apply them in a fair and consistent manner. A recent article in Officials' Quarterly defines these qualities as "professional behaviors" that we should expect from all interscholastic officials.

Certainly one of the post season challenges that face administrators and coaches today is that of evaluating the performance of all officials, especially as we consider the expanding need to promote the qualities of sportsmanship and fair play.
