Field Hockey

New Rules & Clarifications:

- To ensure a more consistent and uniform playing surface, the grass should be cut to a maximum height not to exceed 1-1/2 inches.
- All field players shall wear tooth protectors and shin guards. Beginning with the 2006 season a tooth protector shall be of any readily visible color, other than white or clear.
- Effective 1/1/07, the players stick shall weigh no more than 23 oz., not exceed a bow of 25mm, and must pass through a 2-inch ring.
- A chest protector specifically manufactured for field hockey goalkeepers to be worn under the shirt.

Hamburg Girls Gymnastics (fall 04 team)-State Champion with a team GPA of 96.257.



Congratulations to the Hamburg High School girls' gymnastics' team. For the fifth time in six years they have been awarded the title of New York State Scholar Athlete Champion. Hamburg had the highest grade point average out of 67 other girl's gymnastic teams across New York State. Over half of the girls on the teams had over a 90 average during the gymnastic season. The top seven members make up the Scholar Athlete Team with a combined average of 96.25. Eleventh grader Jill Fennell and ninth grader Lauren Brechtel, had the top average of 98 for the team. REMINDER: Fingerprinting of Officials

The superintendents of Section VI Member schools in April 2003 unanimously approved the following resolution: "ALL SPORTS OFFICIALS must be fingerprinted and cleared before working any sports contests in Section VI, effective Sept. 1, 2003" The Section VI Executive Committee approved a change to the resolution to allow officials to work Section VI contests provided they have submitted their fingerprints to OSPRA and are listed as "clearance pending" on the Section VI website. Athletic Directors and Assignors will refer to this list for eligible officials. Only officials who have been fingerprinted are eligible to officiate Section VI contests. NOTE: All clearances are issued by the Office of School Personnel Review and Accountability (OSPRA) at SED. An

individual can check the status of his/her background check by calling 518-473-2998 Mon, Wed or Friday or emailing ospra@mail.nysed.gov.

SUMMARY: Prior to officiating a Section VI sport contest, an official must present to the school representative:

a) A valid Section VI sports official photo ID

OR

b) Drivers license and a copy of his/her clearance from OSPRA

OR

c) Drivers license and be listed as "clearance pending" on the Section VI website

OFFICIALS' PHOTO ID

Each cleared sports official will be issued a Section VI Sports Official Photo ID from the Section VI office. A school representative will examine the official's photo ID prior to his/her officiating a contest in their district and record that official's assigned identification number. This Photo ID will provide appropriate confirmation that the official has been properly fingerprinted and cleared. An official must be cleared to receive the ID. Section VI takes photos for the required Photo ID at the Section VI office in the Erie 1 BOCES building, 355 Harlem Rd. West Seneca every Wednesday from 9:30 am – 3:30 pm. One evening session is scheduled each season (by appointment only): November 2 for winter sports and March 1 for spring sports.

The Blue Devils fell in the state semi-finals. The team is coached by Matt Chimera, a teacher at Kenmore East High School.

Soccer Sportsmanship Policy

Upon a review of the 3year composite report of sportsmanship incidents in boys and girls soccer, the Section VI Soccer Committees in conjunction with the Section VI Athletic Council have developed a more stringent policy to monitor the cautions and ejections in boys and girls soccer.

This policy will be used for all levels of play. All coaches and officials will be required to submit their red and yellow cards. Officials are asked to call the Section VI Hotline 821-7094 (Please note that this number was printed incorrectly on the officials sportsmanship cards!! The correct number for the hotline is **821-7094**) Red and Yellow Cards will also be reported to each school's Athletic Director who will assist the Section office and the Soccer Chairmen in keeping track of the cards that are assessed. Varsity coaches are expected to report their red and yellow cards to their league representative on a weekly basis. Junior Varsity & Modified coaches will report the Cards to their Athletic Director.

The Soccer committees thank everyone for their cooperation with this policy intended to improve sportsmanship.

Centralized Payment of Sports Officials

In response to a request from Section VI District Superintendents and Business Officials for a BOCES service to pay sports officials, Erie I BOCES initiated a Request for Proposal for web-based athletic management systems to perform this function. In May 2005, two proposals were presented at a conference attended by representatives of member schools. Evaluations of both programs were reviewed by the Section VI Ad Hoc Committee for Central Management of Sports Officials. At the May meeting, the Section VI Athletic Council voted to endorse League Minder, pending certain stipulations, as the system to facilitate the BOCES shared service of payment of sports officials. This program will comply with SED regulations regarding Board of Cooperative Educational Services.

In September, a pilot program was launched by Erie I BOCES in cooperation with Section VI for centralized payment of sports officials by Erie I BOCES. The pilot is being conducted for the fall sports season with girls soccer only and involves two Section VI member districts. Girls soccer officials will receive one paycheck from Erie I BOCES for all contests worked in the pilot districts within a monthly pay period.

The pilot program will be expanded for the winter season to include additional schools and sports. When fully operational, centralized payment of sports officials through Erie I BOCES will include all sports and will be open to all Section VI member districts who wish to participate. All sports officials will then receive one monthly paycheck for all contests worked at participating member schools.

Section VI and Erie 1 BOCES express their gratitude to all officials and to Akron and Kenmore for their cooperation with this program, developed to ensure payment of officials in a timely, efficient and cost effective manner, and to safeguard officials social security numbers from identity theft.

Janice Keppler, a senior at Medina High School, took the Division II Girls State Championship in the Pole Vault. Her school records include 12' Pole Vault and 16.2 100HH. She also holds a Niagara Orleans League record of 12' in the Pole Vault.

Blake Eaton

Blake Eaton, a sophomore form Allegany-Limestone CS, won the New York State Division II Championships in the Shot Put and Discus at



the New York State Track & Field Championship Meet held at Cicero North Syracuse HS June 3-4, 2005. He won the shot put on his first throw of the competition with a new school record of 58' 9 3/4", his previous record being 58' 5 1/2". Blake continued his season long domination in the event going undefeated for the year in the shot put. In winning the discus, Blake again broke his own school record with a winning toss of 166' 1". His previous record was 162'9".

Blake who is coached by Mike Wilber, is a three-time section six champion. Winning the shot put and discus this year added to his victory in the shot put last year as a freshman with a winning put of 56' 9 3/4". He won All-American status last year in the discus finishing among the top eight in the nation at the national Junior Olympic track & Field Meet at the University of Oregon.

Blake is also a member of the Gator football team. The 6' 2" 300 lb. tackle is as dominant on the football field as he is in the circle having earned 2nd team all league honors as a freshman on both sides of the football.

At the 2005 state competition, **Geoff Lesch-Wragge** of Fredonia High School finished the 800 meter race in 1st place to capture the Div. II championship with a time 153.75. This time,

Geoff, coached by Bob Ball, has been a member of the Varsity Track Team for 6 years, and received the MVP award for two of those years.

Holland



Holland Central's 4X400m boys relay team captured the Division II

New York State Championship for 2005. This relay team's time of 3:24.87 (FAT) was the fastest in all of Section VI this year, and Holland was the only Division II school in the State to qualify for the Federation Final. The boys broke their own Holland High record (3:24.98) set at the Section VI Championship the previous weekend. Holland's relay consists of freshmen Jon Ramsey and Taylor Kensy, sophomore Matt Bender, and senior co-captain Jeremy George. To claim Holland's first track and field State championship required Ramsey to lead off (51.6), Kensy to surge (51.3), Bender to weather a stumbling trip (51.6), and George to battle Oneida High School's anchor leg with a gutsy 50.2 final lap. The margin of victory was a mere .22 hundredths of a second.

Kimberly Williams, a senior at Leonardo DaVinci High School took the 200 meter Division II title at the 2005 NYSPHSAA championships. The first three seasons of Kimberly



Williams' track and field career were highly successful. The Lady Dragons won two league championships and Kimberly won several individual honors at the league, sectional, and state level. Kimberly and teammates Lakeisha Perez, Karen Lackey, and Chelsea Prophet won back to back state championships in the 4 x 100 meter relay. During her senior year, Kimberly raised her performance to an even higher level and added to her glittering record.

Kimberly set the tone early in the season winning track MVP awards at the Kenmore Invitational and the Joseph Paterniti Invitational at Jamestown. At the All High Championship Meet, Kimberly won the 100, 200, and 400 and helped teammates Whitley Kye, Karen Lackey, and Chelsea Prophet to victory in the 4 x 100 relay. She also set a Buffalo league record in the 400. The first day of the Section VI championships brought disappointment as a bad baton exchange ended da Vinci's chance to defend their state championship in the 4 x 100 relay. On day two, Kimberly responded with two outstanding efforts, holding off strong challenges from two time state champion Lisa Romano of Eden to win the 100 and 200. Teammate Chelsea Prophet won the 100 hurdles as well.

At states, Chelsea finished third in the 100 hurdles, while Kimberly was a bit disappointed with her 3rd place finish in the 100. In the 200, she got a better start and took the lead by running the curve aggressively. She held off a challenge from 100 meter champion Trisha Hawthorne to win her first individual state championship.

Kimberly finishes her career with 14 All High medals, 8 sectional patches including 6 championships, 6 state meet medals including 3 championships, 1 federation medal and 3 league records. Kimberly will attend the State University of New York at Binghamton on a track and field scholarship.

Dan Schichtel of Eden won the 100-meter. Division II race at the New York State Track and Field Championship, in a time of 11.03. His time in the 100 was the third fastest time of all competitors at the State Meet. Schichtel also ran to a third place finish in the 200-meter Division II finals. He had an outstanding track season, winning every race in the 100 meters and losing only once in the 200 meter, that coming at State Finals. Along the way, Schichtel was MVP of the Maroon Classic, setting records in both 100 and 200. He won the 100 and 200 at the Jamestown Invitational, the E.C.I.C.'s and Sectionals. Schichtel tied the E.C.I.C. and school 100-meter record with a time of 10.6 and set the school 200-meter record, in a time of 22.1. Only a Junior, Schichtel has his goals set for a return visit to the State Championship to defend his title.
