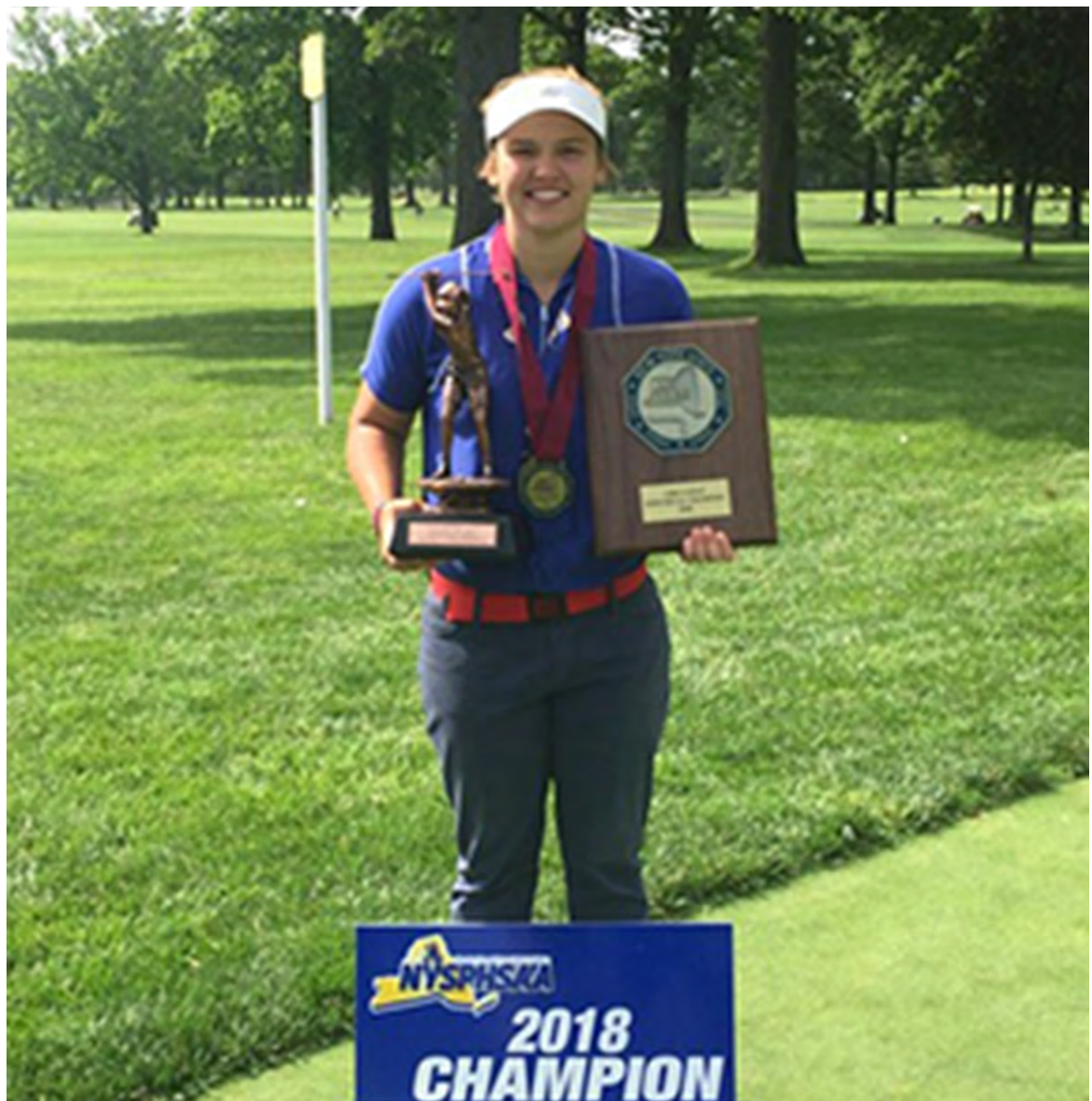

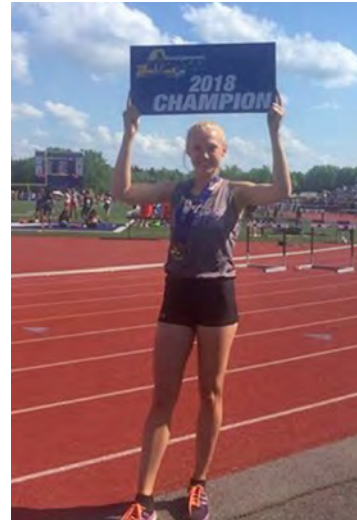


Cleveland Hill's 4x100 State Championship was captured by a foursome of underclassmen; Juniors - Aaron Wahler, D'Mario Grant, and Javon Thomas along with Sophomore Christopher Diem. This group was undefeated in all of their dual competitions as well as every invitational they ran in (Buffalo Public School Invite, Little Four Invitational, Rodiek invite at Hamburg, and ECIC Champions). Their State Championship time was 43.00 and they set a school record with a time of 42.92. This is Cleveland Hill's third 4x100 State Championship (previous championships were won in 2009 and 2006).

She is our first State Champion at Cheektowaga Central for track events and we are very proud of her. She did a ton of work to get herself in the right position of competing for this event starting with the indoor season where she finished in 3rd place in the 55 Meter, but missed a trip to the States by .02 seconds.

On the morning of the finals for the 100 Meter, we worked on her backend of the race because that was the one thing that was going to make or break her in the event. Not only did she listen, she also executed it to perfection. Jayla is looking to compete at the next level and hopefully, winning the State title along with her abilities and work ethic will allow her to accomplish that goal.

### Ian Russ- East Aurora - Division II - 3200 Meter Run



Ian Russ, a senior and captain of the East Aurora Track and Field team, finished his high school career as one of the most decorated athletes in school and Section VI history.

Picking up where he left off in Indoor Track, where he set the Indoor Track and Field 3200 Meter Section VI record, Ian helped his team win the ECIC Division title and excelled in the 800, 1600, and 3200 Meter runs. Ian set the Outdoor Track and Field Section VI record in the 3200 Meter Run with a time of 9:00.97, won the Section VI title in the event for the second consecutive year, and went on to win the D2 New York State Championship as well. Ian will attend Providence College in the fall where he will run cross country, track and field, and study business.

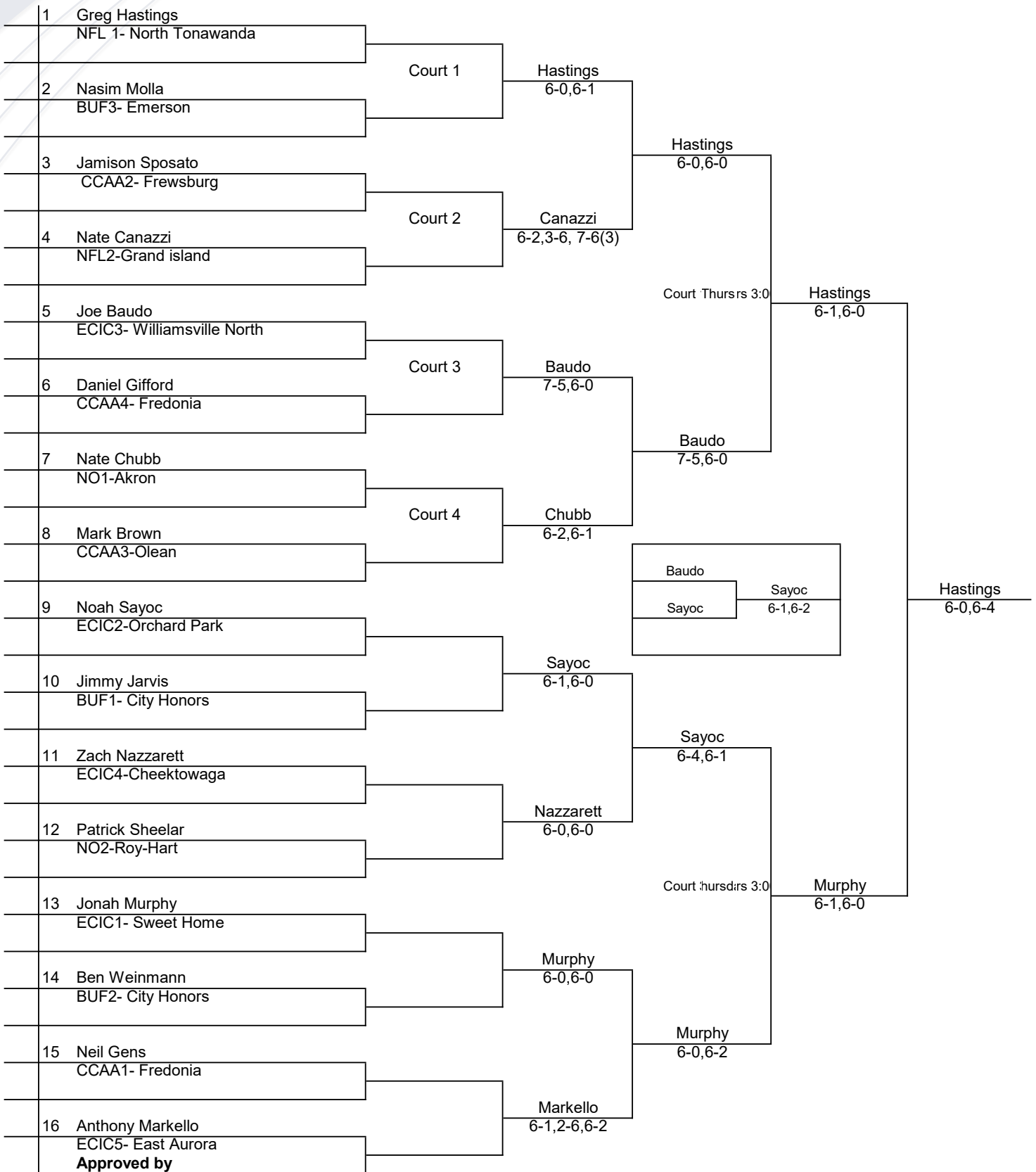

# Throwback to 1968...

## 100 Mile Relay World Record - Lockport

The following was written by a runner...

On June 16, 1968 eight Lockport high school boys (I being one of them) met at a cinder track with our coaches John Chew and Max Lederer for a running event that was considered a rather extreme venture. The distance to be achieved was 100 miles and the time to break seemed nearly insurmountable, except for the fact that we didn't care to think about it. What we thought about was running fast, maybe a little further than normal, but doable. With four freshmen, one junior, and three seniors ranging in ages from 14 -18 we would have to go the distance completing 12 and 1/2 miles each in order for us to succeed. The question we would answer that day was dependent on our speed and endurance combined in a relay format that demanded sprinting each interval. Our goal was to break the current 100 mile relay record held in New York State. Our speed and endurance became evident midway with 50 miles to go. We were running below a 4:30 mile pace, but the question remained whether or not we could keep it up for 50 more miles. Our coach admitted later that he expected us to slow, but that didn't happen. The 80 mile mark was difficult because it was still too far away to anticipate the finish - You could feel yourself drifting along unchecked in some relentless cycle around the track, but you were oblivious to everything else. The day seemed unending, the sun beat down and our nerves shook us at times, but we continued to sprint. Crowds began to gather at the track with about 10 miles to go as news of the event had circulated throughout the day. The final baton handoffs of the last miles went by with encouragement from the crowds and the final sprinter crossed the 100 mile mark in front of the stadium bleachers. The time recorded was 7 hours 27 minutes and 55.6 seconds (a sub 4:30 mile pace). It was nearly 30 minutes faster than the

previous Lockport record and broke Hamburg's record by more than 12 minutes. Our time set the best mark accomplished by any high school relay team in New York history. Thirty years later it was discovered to be the fastest time run by any 100 mile relay team in the world. The US Congress recognized and recorded this as a world record in 1998.

Since then we've gathered annually to honor our coaches, renew friendships and recall memories. That one day remains for us a remarkable bond we share with one another. In credit to our coaches, we were well trained; two of our graduating seniors were state qualifying runners in track and cross country and the rest of us continued to represent Lockport as the section 6 cross country champions in state meets later that same year and every year following unto graduation. In retrospect of our relay we may have been a bit overexcited when we started; it was really unknown territory to us, so it kept us striving hard. As a team we discovered that we could work off each other's pace; it produced an extraordinary energy between us that became more evident as we ran.

Today our memories of it have grown much sweeter by the times we have shared and by bringing this world record home for Lockport High School and the city of Lockport. We owe our deepest gratitude to our coaches and teammates, our High School and the city of Lockport, and most of all to our families for supporting us as athletes in our youth.

Postscript: The record we set that day was our best. We never felt the need to prove ourselves again in that manner. It was an experience that inspired us to continue pushing ourselves as athletes. From the time it was discovered to be a world record in 1998, it remains unbroken.

Mr. LaFALCE. Mr. Speaker, I would like to call to the attention of our colleagues the 30th anniversary of an extraordinary high school track and field record that still stands today. In June, 1968, eight members of Lockport Senior High School in Lockport, New York ran the 100-mile relay in a time of seven hours, 27 minutes and 55.6 seconds. This mark beat the previous New York State record by a full nine minutes. It is also an astonishing 26 minutes 36.5 seconds faster than the existing world record as listed in the Guinness Book of Records. And that so-called world record involved 100 runners--not eight. Members of the record-setting relay team, led by Coach John Chew, were Jim Rycyna, Charlie Quagliana, Bob Brown, Brian Brooks, Jeff Hulshoff, Frank Pfeil, George Bickford, and Jeff Watkins. Each of these student-athletes ran 12 1/2 miles in spurts of 110 yards, 220 yards, and 440 yards. The overall average time was less than four minutes and 30 seconds per mile.

Mr. Speaker, the State of New York recently passed a resolution congratulating the 1968 Lockport High School relay team, and the Mayor of Lockport issued a proclamation commending their achievement.

I too am pleased to recognize these eight men on the occasion of the 30th anniversary of their 100-mile relay record, and ask all Members to join me in congratulating them as they reunite this month to celebrate their tremendous athletic performance.
