The aforementioned representatives were informed of the procedure in which the appeal would be conducted. The representatives were allowed 15 minutes for the presentation of their appeal. Afterward, the representatives were excused from the room and a closed ballot was taken of the athletic council. The representatives were then notified of the results of the vote.

Dr. Jeff Rabey, Combining of Schools Committee Chair reviewed the timeline of events that led up to today's appeal:

The Combining of Schools Committee, consisting of a representative from each league within Section VI, met on January 14, 2016 and began by reviewing the current Section VI Policy 120: Combining Teams for Athletic Participation; the current data from the fall 2015 season, pertaining to the Combining of Schools, along with a list of champions; the current Section VI Forms / Reports for the Combining of Schools; and the definition of "dominance" when referring to a combined sport.

The Section VI Policy 120: Combining Teams for Athletic Participation states, "The combining of teams from two or more schools to form a single team may be permitted by the Section in order to foster the emergence of a new sport, support a school that has a declining number of participants in a sport and/or financial reasons." Furthermore, Policy 120.2 states, "Schools will combine teams for a period of one year. Classifications will be determined by utilizing the newly adopted criteria and graduated structure below. An annual application and approval will be required at various levels. (see 120.3)" Finally, Policy 120.2a states, "The school(s) with the higher(est) classification number will be known as the Host School. For every school that is combining with the Host School, a percentage is dependent upon the association's "5 sport classification cut off numbers: Class AA = 50%, Class A = 40%, Class B = 30%, Class C = 30% and Class D = 20%."

In addition, the Section VI Athletic Council has also supported the utilization of the following factors when making decisions on combined teams and determining the level of "Dominance": Won a sectional championship, High placement at sectionals, Requests or approval by schools/leagues/sport chair, Transfers, Teams' appropriate level of competitiveness, Returning players, Schedule and Program history.

In addition to dominance, the Section VI Athletic Council supports having a maximum number of four (4) schools combining for a sport, however also provides for an appeal process under unusual circumstances, in order to go above four (4) schools.

Ultimately, the Section VI Athletic Council reserves the right to deny a combined sport for any of the reasons stated above, with the opportunity of the Host School (largest school) to appeal to the New York State Public High School Athletic Association.

Lake combined sport of varsity football, it was the position of the Section VI Combined Sports Standing Committee not to recommend the continuation of the combined team at the C Classification for the fall of 2016. This decision was due to the factors of established dominance; after winning two straight Section VI Championships, returning approximately 22 players from Maple Grove and 7 players from Chautauqua Lake for a 74% return rate for the fall of 2016 and in the 2015 season the combined team won all regular season Section VI games by an average of a 31 point spread.

The Chautauqua Lake and Maple Grove (Bemus Point) School Districts appealed to the Section VI Athletic Council's Executive Committee on February 16, 2016. At that appeal hearing, the Districts contended that they did not combine to dominate the sport and that their understanding of dominance was "stacking a team" or combining to strategically achieve a state title. Furthermore, the Districts believed that if they had to play at the B Level, the Districts would jeopardize the safety of their student athletes, as they believed the players at the B Level are bigger and stronger.

As a result of the appeal hearing held on Wednesday, February 10, 2016 and subsequent discussion, the following motion was presented and passed by the Section VI Executive Committee: *Motion for the executive committee to respond in writing to the appeal, supporting the Combining of Schools committee's recommendation for declination of combining Maple Grove and Chautauqua Lake in the sport of Football in Class C.*

Appeal Main Points:

- Maple Grove (Bemus Point) and Chautauqua Lake's purpose for combining is due to
 - -Declining participation. Neither district can field a team individually.
 - -Concern for player safety
 - -Financial reasons
- Refute the declination based on dominance as the Districts believe dominance is not formally defined by the Section
- The Districts' are certain that if they had to play at the B level, they would jeopardize the safety of their student athletes, as they believe the players at the B level are bigger and stronger.

The result of the ballot vote is as follows:

The aforementioned representatives were informed of the procedure in which the appeal would be conducted. The representatives were allowed 15 minutes for the presentation of their appeal. Afterward, the representatives were excused from the room and a closed ballot was taken of the athletic council. The representatives were then notified of the results of the vote.

Dr. Jeff Rabey, Combining of Schools Committee Chair, reviewed the timeline of events that led up to today's appeal.

At the March 14, 2016 Combining of Schools Committee meeting, the Committee, consisting of a representative from each league within Section VI decided not to recommend the new combined team of Bennett, Olmsted, East and Middle Early College at the B Classification for the fall of 2016.

This decision was based on understanding the rationale and history to the evolution of the Section VI Policy 120: Combining Teams for Athletic Participation and the data from the past two years of the Olmsted and Alternative Education with Bennett combined sport of varsity football. The factors involved include established and continued dominance with the former combined team; after appearing in two straight Section VI Championships, returning approximately 18 players for a 53% return rate for the fall of 2016 and in the 2015 season the combined team won all but one regular season Section VI games by an average of a 41 point spread. In addition, Section VI believes that with the new combined team, there will be a combined total of 807 students to recruit from for a football program, where within Section VI, the largest B Classification school only has a total of 536 students to recruit from for their football program.

It was noted that the Section VI Athletic Council has supported the utilization of the following factors when making decisions on combined teams and determining the level of "Dominance": Won a sectional championship, high placement at sectionals, requests or approval by schools/leagues/sport chair, transfers, teams' appropriate level of competitiveness, returning players, Schedule and program history.

Appeal Main Points:

- The rationale for the configuration of combinations is based on the location of BPS schools who participate
 in the sport of football
- BPS wants to remain in their correct classification, Class B, since there is no previous data to use as a benchmark
- MEC and Bennett are housed within the same building
- The population of the schools requesting to combine is changing from the previous year.

East will only have 11-12 grade for 2016

Olmsted will have 5-12 grade for 2016

Bennett only 12 grade for 2016

MEC only 9-12 grade for 2016

7.6.1 Splitting of Classifications

Concerns were expressed regarding the splitting of classifications, specifically in Girls Volleyball, Girls Basketball, Girls Soccer, and Softball. Currently, Section VI Policy allows for the respective sport committee to choose whether or not a class splits once reaching 18 teams within a specific classification. The Sectional Intersectional Committee recommends that classes must split when 18 or more schools are in a specific classification.

Chris Durr, Girls Basketball Chairman, and Bill Shaw, Girls Basketball Assistant Chairman, presented their rationale for opposing the recommendation that a class must be split, once 18 or more schools are reached with a specific classification.

- Average of 7- 10 teams that opt out of sectionals, creating seeding issues
- Believe that the sport committee is able to make a decision in the best interest of the sport, rather than assigning an arbitrary number (18) at which the splitting of a class must occur.
