4.1 WNYSO Contract

An arbitration date regarding the officials' contract is yet to be confirmed, but an April 2015 date is anticipated.

4.2 Boys Lacrosse Chairman - Report

E. Greenway

At their committee meeting, the federated Boys Lacrosse coaches made a proposal to re-align divisions. Rationale for the proposal includes concern of losing athletes to Monsignor Martin schools for the specific purpose of playing lacrosse and the balance of the number of games played. Monsignor Martin schools play upwards of 26 games as compared to a maximum of 16 played by Section VI member schools. The vote to schedule the leagues separately was unanimous (of the 28 coaches in attendance). Scheduling the leagues separately will mainly affect the All-Americans, the All-Stars, and the All-WNY. No edict, however, was made not to play MM for non-league games; each school is still allowed to individually schedule their non-league games. In in addition, every school that has boys lacrosse will still be considered for the Senior All-Star contest.

4.3 Process for Candidate Selection

The notification process regarding Section VI job position candidate selections was clarified. The Executive Director will notify applicants via both phone and letter.

4.5 Girls Indoor Track Chairman

E. Mancino has been relieved from his Girls Indoor Track Chairman interim appointment as B. Lombardo has returned and is able to carry out the duties of his position.

4.6 Fall Sport Chairs Terms

The Section VI Fall Sports' Chairs terms are set to expire June 30, 2015. Incumbents were notified and asked to submit the job application indicating their wish to return or step down from their respective position. Council representatives were asked to share this information with their respective leagues and communicate to interested individuals that the sport chair job description and application requirements are posted on the Section VI website (under *General Information*, *Bulletin Board*). Note: The Boys and Girls Cross Country chairmen have resigned from their positions.

4.7 Selection Classification Procedure

The NYSED recently approved a revision to the Selection Classification process to take effect in the Fall of 2015. The NYSPHSAA has requested a meeting with NYSED representatives to address concerns with the newly implemented "Advanced Athletic Placement" process as it pertains to mixed competition testing, tanner scores, and waivers. More information will be provided as it becomes available.

4.8 Football Litigation Update

Section VI is named in the lawsuit regarding the passing of the Brocton/Westfield student-athlete during a regular season football game. At the time of the incident, Section VI did not have insurance coverage during the regular sports season. At the direction of the Section VI Superintendents' Representative, M. Wendt, Hodgson & Russ LLP has been secured as representation in the event the ruling involves financial obligation by Section VI. Note: As per the NYSPHSAA, Section VI has since obtained insurance coverage for both the regular and post sports' seasons.

4.9 Wrestling Litigation Update

Section VI is named in two lawsuits regarding wrestling athletes who contracted skin disorders. T. Slade, Section VI Executive Director, and R. Zayas, NYSPHSAA Executive Director, are scheduled to give depositions on March 11, 2015 regarding one of the cases. The other case is pending.

6.4.3 Increase in Maximum Number of Points for Modified Wrestling:

The following language change proposal was made by the NYSPHSAA Modified Committee:

"A contestant (or team) may participate in competitions not to exceed 14 points during the season". This would be an increase from 12 points which is allowed at this time. The rationale behind this motion is to be consistent with the maximum number of games allowed at the modified level as it relates to the high school level. Currently other sports are at a higher percentage as it relates to the total number of games allowed when compared to the high school level. This would bring the sport of wrestling up to the other sports.

Council representatives were asked to discuss this item with their respective leagues as this will be an action item at the Section VI March 25, 2015 Athletic Council meeting in order to give the Section VI Modified Committee Representatives, M. Librock and K. McGowan, direction on how to vote at the March 27, 2015 NYSPHSAA Modified Committee meeting.

6.6.1 Max Number of Contests Proposal

Motion to give direction to the Section VI Boys and Girls Representatives to approve the maximum number of contests proposal.

The intention of the proposal is to balance the maximum number of JV and varsity contests and is based on the actual length of the three respective sports' seasons. If approved, the proposal would take effect beginning with the 2015-2016 school year.

As requested at the last Section VI Athletic Council meeting, T. Slade contacted fellow section executive directors inquiring about their respective sections' sentiment towards the maximum number of contests proposal. All sections are in favor of the proposal, except Section VIII.

Discussion:

- The Niagara Orleans League voted to approve the maximum number of contests proposal based on the concern that if the proposal is not approved, the moratorium on the reduction of games would remain (J. Reed).
- Section VI representatives will present the following questions at the January 30, 2015 state meeting:
 - 1) Why are some sports back to their full complement and others are not?
 - 2) Ice hockey went from 24 to 20 games. Therefore, if the winter season is longer, why isn't hockey being addressed?

6.6.2 Standard Calendar Proposal

The proposal includes adopting the NFHS standardized procedure for numbering calendar weeks to ensure consistency and uniformity in establishing NYSPHSAA Championship dates and common sport season start dates. Approval of the proposal will provide the ability to publish annual calendar dates in advance, eliminate the need for discussion pertaining to "when" an event will be scheduled, establish a fair and consistent starting date for all NYSPHSAA member schools, and reduce the amount of overlap of sports seasons.

As requested at the last Section VI Athletic Council meeting, T. Slade contacted fellow section executive directors inquiring about their respective sections' sentiment towards the standard calendar proposal. Fellow sections are in support of the standard calendar, but have the following concerns specifically related to the dates of the championships:

- The number of championships scheduled on the same weekend and thus the inability of administrators to present awards at each because of the overlapping schedule of events.
- The inconsistency in length of sports' seasons
