Report on changes in Policy or Practice that were implemented

The Diamond Hawk GC venue was lost on May 7. The reason given was that, "it was no longer financially viable for them to close their course down to host the event". Sectionals was scheduled for May 19th. Thankfully, River Oaks Golf Club, Grand Island came to the rescue and offered to host the event. The cost per person increased from \$15 to \$20 per player and coach. They also asked for \$10 per cart issued as they have gas carts, not electric. Carts are vital to the event as coaches both mark and forecaddie for their assigned groups, drive players back to tees, on and off the course, etc. As the Section VI Sportchair, it is my position that \$20 (plus \$10 for cart) is extremely reasonable, especially since every paid person received lunch included in the fee. \$20-30 is at least a 50% discount on greens fees pretty much anywhere you can go play at a course comparable to the championship quality of River Oaks GC. At this price point, courses aren't shutting their courses down to make money, they do it to give back to the public HS Boy's Golf community.

Problems encountered/ concerns

In regards to the Section VI Transportation Policy for Boy's Golf - as the Boy's Golf Sportchair, my main concern is that each of the 9 boy's on the Section VI State Golf Team has adequate transportation at States – every day of the championship. This means players are able to be moved from their Dorms to the Golf Course in a safe and efficient manner. Some district(s) this year allegedly interpreted the existing policy as being satisfied by simply dropping the player off for registration and picking the player up at the conclusion of the championship. Initially, it became known to me through the involved districts' coaches, that the coach(s) were not permitted to transport their player and that alternative transportation was not planned for outside of dropping off and picking up. Naturally, this became my concern of mine, not because of the means of transportation but when it was known that I'd have no way to get the player to the course because the involved district(s) didn't provide adequate transportation. If the coach wasn't allowed to drive the player, how could I or another coach be permitted to as well? It is also my opinion that school districts should not by default assume that it is the parent(s) responsibility to transport the player to and from the dorms, restaurant(s) for lunches and the golf course. Currently, the parent is not required to be present for any portion of the championship, but a certified coach from each district is required for every minute a player is present for the event. How could we transport a player if their parent were not present and this was their only means of transportation as designated by their district? Given that the coach is required to accompany his/her player to the championship (and not the parents), it would stand to reason that the most economical and efficient way to transport players would be to have coaches approved and/or certified by their districts to drive their players at the Boy's Golf State Championship. Paying one driver (or many drivers) to lodge 3 nights, meals and salary for 4 days is unquestionably more costly than allowing each certified, district approved coach to transport his/her player(s) especially since the coach has to be there anyway. To certify coach drivers, districts may simply set up a drug/urine test, run the coach's

license through the DMV and sit the coach through a DMV training video for certification. This can easily be done between Sectionals and States as was done by district(s) this year. The preferred/suggested means of transportation is purely my opinion for the reasons stated. Due to the issues I encountered with district interpretations of the Section VI transportation policy, it is my suggestion that the transportation policy be clarified to additionally state that each district is required to provide transportation every day their player is in attendance at the championship venue (to and from the dorms and golf course, restaurants for lunches, etc). In addition, it should also state that it is not the responsibility of the parents to transport the players for any portion of the championship. If it is known that a district will not be providing adequate transportation at states, the Boy's Golf Sportchair should call up an alternate from a different district who will provide adequate transportation. It was my belief (all the way until the afternoon before we left for states) that players may be dropped off at Cornell this year with no approved way of getting from the dorms to the golf course. Some districts were saying their parents would be there Saturday and planned to bring the driver home Friday evening assuming the parents would be responsible for the rest of the weekend transportation needs. I knew from actually speaking with the parents they weren't planning to get down to Cornell until that afternoon at the earliest. We would have had no way to get the player to the golf course Saturday morning. Again, if the player's coach could not drive their own player, how could I as the Section VI Sportchair allow that player to ride with myself or another coach?

I would not want to place myself or any other coach in a position of liability and transport a player against their district's policy. I was shocked that I even had to deal with this as to me, the existing policy is clear. It seems however, that it needs to be clarified so that it is not an issue next year. Somehow we almost lost sight of what's best for the kids, who earned their place at the Boy's Golf State Championship. There are 572 school districts in NYS that participate in Boy's Golf – over 8,000 players. Our (9) boy's represent the top 1/10th of 1% of public HS golfers in all of NYS. Boy's Golf is unlike any other sport in NYSPHSAA – it is unique and should in my opinion, be viewed as such.
