Report on changes in policy or practice: Binghamton was an outstanding host for the State Tournament, the city did a great job embracing the event, in spite of a major snowstorm just days ahead of everyone's arrival.

The official "ball" for the Section will become the Spalding "Legacy". This will be used for Sectional semi-finals through the State Final Four. Home teams in earlier rounds may use the Leagcy OR the Spalding "Classic" that was used this past season. This change was made after NYSPHSAA offices listened to feedback from Sectional Chairman as well as BCANY.

Problems encountered/concerns: Charter schools – had a very informative, helpful, cordial post season meeting with Mr. Robert Baxter, current Athletic Director at the Health Sciences Charter School. Mr. Baxter explained the way Charter Schools go through a lottery system within the city of Buffalo for choosing potential students. Our committee was allowed to ask questions and gain information as we try and get a handle on how we should classify Charter Schools, particularly those that are beginning to show a "pattern of dominance" within their current Class. The question at hand is whether or not we should take a school such as Health Sciences and bump them up from Class B to Class A or AA. After our meeting, we continued to discuss the pros and cons of re-classifying, tried to get a better handle on our own definition of "dominance". Many schools have shown patterns of having great teams, but that tends to be cyclical and eventually the tide turns and they come back to the pack so to speak. At this point, we have agreed as a committee to continue to consider what our position should be. We plan on re-visiting this issue and making a decision on re-classification for any basketball teams this fall.

<u>Other pertinent data</u>: BEDS numbers are very low for Class C. As of right now, we anticipate having only 1 Class C division for Sectional play next year as opposed to the C1/C2 split we have had for many years.

We continue to rotate Classes during the week at Buffalo State – after 5 years, we are back to the original format with Class B starting on Monday, and Class AA playing on Thursday. Rotating classes has not shown to have any adverse effects on travel, attendance, etc.

Regionals ran into some issues with the severe weather conditions in the greater Rochester area in early March (major windstorm). Regionals were forced to move to Genesee Community College, which was a willing and accommodating site, but much too small for the event.

Season will begin on Monday, November 6, 2017 (week 19 of NYSPHSAA Calendar)
