### 4.0 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT (M. DiFilippo)

4.1 NYSPHSAA Jewelry Rule/Hair Beads Update

The membership and all affiliated sports officials organizations have received the following update to the NYSPHSAA Jewelry rule.
At the May 4, 2022 NYSPHSAA Executive Committee meeting, the following language to the Jewelry Rule was added: "Hair adornments, including beads, may be worn provided they are secured and do not present a safety hazard to the player, teammates, or opponents." Moreover, R. Zayas, addressed questions regarding making the determination if the beads are secure or safe. If an official or opposing coach feel that a student's beads look unsafe they should report that to the coach and their league, but continue the game. The official and the opposing coach always have the right to refuse to officiate the game, or to pull their team if the situation is "unsafe." At no time should an official directly address the student-athlete in question.
4.2 Procedure for Securing Officials

A reminder was given about the procedure for securing sports officials. It is important that member schools work through their designated assigners. It is against the Section's policy and procedure for member school districts to secure their own officials. The main reason for this procedure is to make sure only certified and fingerprinted officials are used.
4.3 Spring 2022 - Waived 7 Day Rule; Representation Rule in place

At the May 4, 2022 NYSPHSAA Executive Committee meeting, the 7 -day rule was waived for the remainder of spring 2022 season for all sports. Teams are permitted to practice and/or compete without a day of rest. Also, Section VI did not request any waivers for the Representation Rule. All teams and all participants must have 6 competitions in to compete in Sectionals. If needed, the waiver form for injury or illness is located on the Section website and should be submitted to M. DiFilippo.
4.4 Football Start Date Fall 2022

The 2022 Football start date was moved to Saturday August 20, 2022. All other sports are scheduled to start Monday, August 22, 2022. At the May NYSPHSAA Executive Committee meeting, Section VI proposed waiving the 7 -day rule for the first 2 weeks of the football season, which would allow for more flexibility to get in the 10 days of practice before the first contest. This item will be voted on at the July 2022 NYSPHSAA Central Committee meeting.
4.5 Mandatory AD Workshop - August 17, 2022

The annual, mandatory athletic director workshop is scheduled for August 17, 2022. J. Roth, NYSAAA Chapter 6 Chairperson, is planning to provide professional development opportunities during this workshop.
4.6 Future Combining of Schools

The Executive Committee is beginning discussions about possible changes to the combining of schools applications process, especially the combinations that remain the same, year after year. The process is being reviewed to determine if there is an easier, less cumbersome way to handle the combining of schools applications.
4.7 Appeal Process Approved

On March 22, 2022, the Athletic Council approved amendments to the Constitution regarding the appeal process. Per Article 10; 10.1 of the Section VI Constitution, The Constitution may be amended by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the member districts voting. A post card ballot was conducted in April 2022. Of the Section's 74 districts, 61 were in favor, 6 were opposed, and 7 abstained. Therefore, the amendments (Appendix L) are enacted and the Constitution and By-Laws have been revised and posted on the Section website. Implementation of the updates to the appeal process will begin July 1, 2022.

The spring state modified committee meeting was held March 25, 2022. J. Arnold and M. Librock presented the proposals from that meeting, which will be voted on at the fall 2022 state modified committee meeting, to the Section's league modified representatives. Direction on these items will be needed at the September 2022 Athletic Council meeting. The four proposals to be voted on in the fall, which are detailed in Appendix D, include removing the $50 \%$ from the Promotion Rule, allowing participation in 4 events instead of 3 in the sport of Track and Field, changing from two 5-minute overtime periods to one 10-minute overtime period in the sport of Soccer, and removing the mouth guard in the sport of Soccer.

There are 4 points to the Strategic Plan

1. Increase participation with a focus on the modified level
2. Maintaining fiscal responsibility within NYSPHSAA

5. Using enrollments of grades 9,10 , and 11 for the NYSPHSAA Classifications for the following school year. Council members were cautioned that this item would be a significant change if approved and should be heavily discussed at the league level. Enrollments were previously approved at the state level in February, but complaints that February was too late prompted the change to October. When the move to October was made, NYSPHSAA had to shift from relying on BEDS information to the final numbers from the school districts' from June of the previous school year. By the time those numbers are in place, however, those students are freshmen in college. Thus, the rationale for proposing the use of enrollments of grades 9,10 , and 11.
6. Adding positions to the NYSPHSAA budget/Audit Committee
7. $6^{\text {th }}$ classification for all sports that are recommending going to 6 classes starting in the 2023-24 school year The sports involved in this proposal include Boys Basketball, Boys Soccer, Girls Volleyball, Baseball, Girls Soccer, Softball, and Girls Basketball.

## GUIDELINES/PROCEDURES

- If a tornado warning is initiated, immediate event delay should be implemented, and all participants, spectators and athletic staff should seek shelter immediately. Once inside a secure location, tune to local weather alert radio to be informed of the storm location, path and duration of tornado warning.
- Warning may be extended, or a new warning issued at any time, so continue to monitor.
- Safe shelter from tornado inside lowest building level, away from exterior walls/windows, with windows closed.

All Clear-tornado warning will expire after duration specified by the National Weather Service and the site director will notify all involved that the warning has ended and the event may resume or be cancelled/postponed.

## II. Approval Minutes Fall, 2021 Meeting

## III. Executive Committee

Judy Salerno: The new Girls Basketball coordinator is Kirk Ehrensbeck (Section IV).

Todd Nelson: Strategic planning committee has identified 4 areas to focus on for the next five years. Including: Diversity; Equity; Inclusion; Fiscal responsibility and stability.

Another important and current goal is to increase the number of participating officials who are qualified, confident and trained to officiate. The focus on recruitment and retention of officials is being examined.

In the past, the training of officials and retention was geared toward the high school level. The focus should shift to the modified level. (Further report below) The realization of this needed shift occurred during the pilot of the girl's flag football program.

The recommendation of starting the girl's flag football would be to start at the modified level. The program is impeding the other spring programs such as girl's lacrosse, softball and TF. This is creating enrollment issues for various sports (which has been an issue for many districts even without adding girl's flag football).

The state is discussing adding another level of teams. If JV has been eliminated, there is discussion to add $6^{\text {th }}$ graders in the modified programs. This would restructure groupings to the following: 6/7, 8/9, 10-12 level program. "Infancy phases."

A lot of middle schools and middle level programs include $6^{\text {th }}$ graders in the buildings. They participate with $7^{\text {th }}$ graders in outside groups.

Judy: Is there a mod rep on the committee?
Todd: not at the moment. The current focus is setting goals and not action items. The strategic plan will set the goal and then work with the committees to work on the action items to reach those goals.

Kevin: Sections and schools can be more restrictive.
Judy: Flag Football Program - the NFL provided the uniforms for teams?
Todd: NFL worked with their reps and Nike to provide uniforms. 51 teams - working with 6 different section $8,11,1,5,4,6$.

Recruitment and retention of officials:
Todd: Sally is the rep for NYS volleyball officials. She has been very "OCF" involved with the officials group. We are working with Sally's group to streamline the process on how to become an official and in particular at the modified level. We feel that at the association, to get someone in the door and get them working, they could use some basic training.

What it means is learning the basic rules and regulations and the proper mechanics/basic mechanics to do the job. We want to streamline the training and get officials involved where we are critically lacking officials...we have one official when we should at least have two officials.

Piloting a program:
Sally: President at the state level for boys and girls volleyball. Part of an OCF initiative to train fundamentals for modified programs. The pilot included 6 participants who were set up with mentors. Approximately 10-15 officials (potentials) start a class and only 4-8 finish. Several barriers; not as easy as they thought and personal obligations.

Every official needs a core basic of mechanics, rules and interaction skills for coaches, parents, spectators and athletes. We found out our barriers and over the summer we will create a plan based on our findings. Coaches were more than accommodating when they had enough officials on their contests.

Goal of the plan is recruitment and a big part is retention. Retention is also the responsibility of schools as there have cases where inappropriate behavior impacts retention.

Studies show that the number one reason why they (officials) leave is due to the abuse in the profession and poor behavior.

Todd: Schools need to take the necessary actions and that is what will keep officials working for us. Sally took the normal officials training and cut in half to have them work at the modified level and they were able to develop. We cannot overlook the fundamentals. We need to get them working (games) and learn the skills, but perhaps more condensed to get them right into the modified level to officiate.

Q: Are other official's organizations working on this?
Todd: Hot topic at the OCF meeting. Officials are independent contractors - we do not have direct jurisdiction to tell them how to do the training. We hope they can see the benefits of getting them training in a short period of time and getting out there as a modified official.

James Rose: Large group of new reps attended the workshop conducted in January. Any feedback and was the meeting helpful? No feedback.

## V.Discussion Items

a. Track and Field:
" 3 " event rule questioned to change to 4 events.
Joe Alger: Brought up 3-4 rule for participation in track and field. Is there possibility to do 4 events instead of 3? With low numbers this may also help. This would prepare the athletes for high school.
b. Soccer:

10 minute overtime in soccer: Section X (Laurie Brewer) 4 and 4 on different sides so one side is not full of mud. The additional two minutes also impact the official's contracts.

Section 7 - do not act on the overtime until more discussion.
c. Mouth pieces in soccer: Mouth Pieces has to go to safety before executive. Youth soccer does not require for the athletes to wear them. Safety committee to discuss at the next meeting to give feedback. Need to get the data to see if it plays an important safety role.
d. Promotion Rule:

NYSPHSAA Promotion Rule "APP" and restriction on promotion timeline (50\% of season limit)
Todd: why we have this from my understanding is that any $7 / 8^{\text {th }}$ grade student who is talented enough to participate at the HS level, they should probably be tested up before $50 \%$ of the season has been completed. (APP is) Not intended to reward or give experience or fill out rosters. Only for the exceptionally talented to participate at the appropriate level of competition.

Section 7: Why is it $50 \%$ ? Would like to make it an action item to change.
Barb: I would like to bring back to our sections before making an action.
MOTION: First motion, Vickie McMillan and second, John Burdick - to bring back the discussion to the sections and consider as an action item. Voting on making it an action item for next meeting after discussing with sections.

Todd: Every section and committee has the right to make this a discussion - we are tabling it for next meeting so you can go back to your section committee to discuss. Silence is consent if all in favor. Anyone opposed can bring their opposition to the table.

The app can start at any time of the year, the restriction is the promotion piece
e. Track and Field Discussion Continued:

NA: I would like to put forward 4 events instead of 3 . Max of 3 events per day -2 track and 2 field. Verbiage from the rule books indicates a limitation of total distance must not exceed 1200 and 2300 meters. Game rule number two.

Jesse: The thought is good - section and procedure - we need to discuss and explore in our own sections in general to see what we need to bring forward - feel much better about bringing information back to see how the section feels first.

Todd: This is a better place to make decisions from.
NA: Bringing back the idea of 3 events plus 1 relay - and recommendation to eliminate the distance requirement stated above from the handbook.

Todd: Then everyone knows what the motion is and bring it back to their section to bring back in September for voting.

Tamara: Is there a proposal form that needs to be submitted?
Todd: Proposal form - typically when the mod committee makes the actual proposal after discussed among the section reps.

NA: For the high school level, 3 events for in season and 4 events are allowed for post season. Purpose is strategic for more competitors. This may go to safety if an issue modified events are shorter. 3 events during regular season may be a section rule.

## Tornado Policy

- Tornado Watch-indicates tornados are possible. Event staff must continue to monitor the situation.
- Tornado Warning-Tornado siren sounds signaling tornado sighted or tornado indicated by radar


## GUIDELINES/PROCEDURES

- If a tornado warning is initiated, immediate event delay shall be implemented, and all participants, spectators and athletic staff shall seek shelter immediately. Once inside a secure location, tune to local weather alert radio to be informed of the storm location, path and duration of tornado warning.
- Warning may be extended, or a new warning issued at any time, so continue to monitor.
- Safe shelter from tornado inside lowest building level, away from exterior walls/windows, with windows closed.

All Clear-tornado warning will expire after duration specified by the National Weather Service and the site director will notify all involved that the warning has ended, and the event may resume.

Without a courtesy score, athiete deductions during a routine/attempt may yield a score as low as $0.5-1.0$ which does not reflect the effort of the athlete.
3) Increase Beam Fall Time to 45 seconds - This not only matches the fall time for bars, but it also allows an athlete time to collect themselves after a fall and have enough time to set up and continue the routine from the spot they fell off the beam.

Meeting called to order 10:51 am by Chair Gary Vanderzee

1. State Semis \& Finals Bids - Joe Altieri explained the bid procedure process and timeline of approval. He noted bids are now up on our website for review and following the meeting bidders will be notified via email and the recommendations would be placed on the next CAC and Executive Committee agendas. Robert emphasized we are looking for venues that can provide a great experience for student-athletes and we will look at the finances if the venues are comparable.

Football Finals - One bid was submitted by the Carrier Dome. Joe noted it was $\$ 24,000$ more than the previous bid, mostly due to the basketball/football changeover out of season. He also noted the Dome has a $\$ 2$ per ticket fee, a raise from $\$ 1$ in the previous bid. He then asked if there were any concerns or questions with the bid for the Finals. There were no questions or concerns. The committee and staff voted unanimously to accept and recommend the Finals bid from the Carrier Dome for 2023-25.

Football East Semifinals - One bid was submitted by Middletown High School. It was noted a modest increase of $\$ 1,500$ compared to the last bid. There were no questions or concerns. The committee and staff voted unanimously to accept and recommend the East Semifinals bid from Middletown High School for 2023-25.

Football West Semifinals - Three bids were submitted by Rochester Community Sports Complex, Union Endicott High School, and CNS/Vestal High Schools (joint bid). Joe asked the committee to discuss the actual venues first. Committee members were concerned about locker rooms and staff familiarity of the event (last hosted in 2014) at the Rochester Complex. This venue was eliminated as an option. A discussion about the UEHS and CNS/Vestal bids began and although both staffs were commended on hosting previous championships, the committee and staff felt CNS/Vestal bid provided slightly better venues and parking than the UEHS bid despite being the highest price. The committee and staff voted unanimously to accept and recommend the West Semifinals bid from CNS/Vestal for 2023-25.
2. UPDATE COMMITTEE ROSTER: Ken Stoldt asked committee members to send him any changes to emails or phone numbers and he will update the current roster.
3. NEW RULES REVIEW: Ric Hamblin reviewed the NFHS rule changes/Points of Emphasis for 2023.
4. FOOTBALL OFFICIALS REPORT: Ric Hamblin went over the officials ratings from the semi-finals and finals. Ric pointed out strengths and weaknesses from each class and described how scores are calculated. Individual scores can be provided to each Section chairman.

Ric also asked the committee for support to modify the existing selection process for the NYS semifinal and championship games. MOTION by Bob Campese to move forward with the proposal. SECOND by Ken Stoldt. Unanimously passed.

A second proposal was brought to the table by Todd Nelson. This proposal would remove the alternate official from the sideline and put them on the field as a $6^{\text {th }}$ official. It would be a pilot for 2023 semifinals and championships. MOTION by Scott Barker to support this proposal. SECOND by Bob Campese. Unanimously passed.

Ric Hamblin also noted that he is attempting to use HUDL in assisting with the recruitment of new officials.
5. CLASSIFICATIONS: Gary Vanderzee noted the following classification breakdown will be voted on at the May $4^{\text {th }}$ Executive Committee meeting:

## 2. NYSPHSAA Staff Reports

Dr. Robert Zayas, Executive Director
a. He thanked both committees for their hard work on a successful season.
b. He reported on the approval of the proposal for criteria for $6^{\text {th }}$ classification and that it impacts soccer. The criteria is approved but will take discussion and recommendation by the sport committee to be in place. The earliest it can be implemented is the 2023-24 school year. It is possible each soccer committee can decide differently on implementation of a $6^{\text {th }}$ class. The Executive Committee also approved the classification format for non-variation sports.
c. He indicated he was in favor of 6 classes but does not get to vote on this. He believes it gives student-athletes more opportunities.

QUESTION: Diane Wanser asked if the committee can vote differently than their section. Robert indicated you can but you should consult with your section before you do so.

Joe Altieri, Assistant Director
a. Thanked Middletown and Cortland for outstanding jobs running the state tournaments in November. He reported per the bids, the boys tournament stays in Middletown through 2024 and the girls tournament stays in Cortland through 2023 which means next February the girls will discuss bids.
b. He noted NYSPHSAA Hall of Fame nominations are required to be submitted online at www.nysphsaa.org. Deadline passed for the Class of 2022 but nominations can be submitted at any time before January 29, 2023 for the Class of 2023.

## Todd Nelson, Assistant Director

a. He added additional information about the approved proposals. He noted the new formula change means the middle three classes in a 5-class scenario for BOYS will result in 169 schools in those classifications. If you go to a $6^{\text {th }}$ class, it results in 126 schools in the middle four classes. For GIRLS, a 5-class scenario would mean 161 schools in the middle three classes and for a 6-class scenario it would be 121 schools in the middle four classes.
b. He reported the experiment with digital programs this year was a success. The analytics showed a significant amount of views of the online version of the program. CP Sportswear did not do many post tournament orders for the program to be printed.

QUESTION: Rob McAuliffe just received his printed programs and asked why there was a delay. Todd will investigate and get back to Rob.

## Team Sectional Championship - Year 2

## Of Special Note:

1. Out of 57 schools, we had only 16 teams participate in 2021 - This is the lowest \% of all the Sections in the State.
2. A survey was sent to all coaches to receive feedback on participation and thoughts - many coaches responded and a few suggested that changes need to be made - however, nothing constructive came out of it.
3. Teams need to make sure that they have scheduled enough matches for players to be eligible. They need to have played 6 matches in order to be eligible for sectional play. NFL and CCAA did not seem to have issues with this last year but Buffalo and ECIC's did not have enough matches in their schedule by the first round in some cases (weather played a small role).
4. Format is subject to change based on participation (it changed a few times before being finalized last year)
5. Clarification of practice/line-up rules will be made prior to the tournament.

In order to determine both a small and large school Section 6 Team Championship winner we will again attempt to use a 3-day tournament.

DATES: Sept $24^{\text {th }}$, Sept. $27^{\text {th }}$ and Oct. 1 st. The first round will take $24 / 32$ teams down to 8 . Round 2 is the quarterfinals and Round 3 will be the semis and the finals. The overall winners of both divisions will play in the Regional Championship on Oct. 22nd for a chance to qualify for the State Team Championship in Flushing, NY. More details are attached at the end of this document.

For the 2022 NYSPHSAA Individual Tournament, Section 6 may be sending an additional singles player or doubles team based on the new 9 -year rotation. Therefore, the format of the Section 6 tournament would remain the same, however more players may qualify.

Continuation of Team Sectionals, Regionals and a State Team Championship.

## Rule Changes for 2022-2023:

We will follow the most up-to-date safety information and protocols (if any) regarding Covid-19.
A joint proposal for boys and girls tennis was approved which states that all NYSPHSAA tennis players are required to claim their profile in the Universal Tennis Rating (UTR) system prior to the season. Coaches/schools are also required to claim their teams and update their rosters. This provides NYSPHSAA and member sections a comprehensive system to properly seed its tournaments.

## Other Pertinent Data

1. All Coaches in Section VI will continue to be required to maintain accurate match results online on the given website.
2. In addition to uploading a current roster to the score reporting website, coaches will be required to upload the same roster to the UTR website and claim their team. This is free and step by step instructions will be given. The UTR is the most important number when it comes to seeding players at the State level and for many sections, at the section level as well. Our score reporting site already works with UTR for players that have entered the system (mostly players who compete outside of HS Tennis). It will be extremely beneficial for us to help with seeding for the Team Tournaments.
3. We will hold our Section 6 individual tournament at the Miller Tennis Center in Williamsville. MTC has committed to hosting the event and has agreed to the proposed tentative start times. They have agreed to all 5 courts on Friday and 4 courts on Saturday.
4. We will be hosting the Section VI vs. Section V Regional matches this year at the Miller Tennis Center on October 22. We need to provide for an athletic trainer as well as an USTA official for those matches.
5. The Individual State tournament will be held Thursday October 27th to Saturday October 29th, 2022, at Sporttime in Schenectady, NY. I am awaiting confirmation on a block of 11 rooms at the host hotel, The Crowne Plaza -Desmond, Schenectady for 2 nights beginning Wed. Oct 26th and checking out on Friday October $28^{\text {th }}$. The State has secured this host hotel at a rate of $\$ 130 /$ night which includes 4 breakfast tickets per room for both days.
6. The transportation/meal/hotel policy has worked out very well for years now and I would again recommend continuing with this policy.
7. The State committee seeding meeting at the State Tournament will be held on Wednesday October 26th.

The $3 / 4$ team pod will be determined by the Section VI committee based on; team record up until Sept. 16th, BEDS, perceived strength according to chairpersons, and may consist of UTR, past performances, or other information available at that time. The goal is to have a fair and equitable tournament for all teams in order to send our strongest team to Regionals.
Once a site is determined (Division 1 must be at a site with 8 courts if at all possible), a schedule of time will be made available. The 3 or 4 teams in the pod will play an 8 game pro set against each other in a round robin format to determine the 1 team from that pod that will advance to the quarter finals. Division 1 will play 3 singles/4 doubles, and Division 2 will use 3 singles $/ 2$ doubles. The team that advances will have beaten both other teams head to head. Should there happen to be a tie, we will follow the USTA 2020 league tiebreak rules. The tiebreaker will be:

1. Most total individual match wins
2. Fewest number of games lost
3. Winner of head-to-head matches
4. Coin toss

Day 2 - Tuesday September 27th: $\qquad$ (8 Teams for both Division 1 and Division 2)
The 4 matches will play head to head at the higher seeded team on Tuesday, September 27th. This will be a regular scoring, best 2 out of 3 set match using the format listed above.

## Day 3 - Saturday October 1st:

$\qquad$ (4 Teams for both leading to 1 champion for each division).
A site will be determined for both Division 1 and Division 2. A location with 8 courts is a must. Once a site is determined, a schedule of time will be made available. Both semi finals matches will be played followed by the Section Championship match. Format will be 2 out of 3 sets, regular scoring. Division 1 will use 3 singles $/ 4$ doubles and Division 2 will use 3 singles $/ 2$ doubles. The winners of both divisions will advance to the Regional Finals on October 22nd at the Miller Tennis Center.

This is only the 2nd year for Section VI, although many other sections across New York and across the country have been competing in a team championship for years. I hope for a smooth running tournament, but expect to iron out any hiccups over the next couple of seasons. Flexibility is needed amongst the leagues. If participation continues to stay low, a new format will be used.

Looking forward to including more players in the championship events and gaining experience across the section.

## Report on changes in Policy or Practice that were implemented:

- In response to the COVIS-19 pandemic mask wearing continued at all Section VI Boys Ice Hockey events. Other mitigations were eliminated.
- All games were scored live using electronic scoring. No scoresheets were used for the 16 league games. Using iPads the off-ice officials scored the game, on-ice officials verified the game end results, and the data was immediately reflected on the website.
- A new divisional alignment was approved for a three-year period. The 21.22 season was year one. Four divisions were established that followed the pattern of the existing leagues schools presently complete in. The ECIC group was 14 schools and therefore it was broken into two divisions based on the BEDS numbers.


## Problems encountered/concerns:

- With the initiation of any new system start up problems are to be expected. This was true regarding the live scoring. Sometimes the $\mathrm{Wi}-\mathrm{Fi}$ at the rink was not reliable and the connection was lost. There were also challenges training and orienting all the staff, officials, and coaches into the system. However, considering the logistics of the league and the number of contests, these problems were minimum and correctable.
- There are also some software edits to the system that need to be made for next year so that certain specific data can be recorded accurately.
- There is no reliable evaluation system and/or communication process for scheduling officials. There is concern regarding the abilities and demeanor of some officials and a mechanism to address this is lacking.


## Recommendations for next season including proposed calendar:

- We will continue to fine tune the electronic scoring procedure games. The distribution, maintenance and collection of equipment also needs to be addressed. A better system must be implemented to make this process more manageable.
- The startdate for the season is November 14, 2022. Section VI will host the NYS Championships scheduled for March 11 \& 12, 2023.
- Establish an evaluation process for officials to better inform the assignor and the league regarding concerns and the need for corrective action.
- The three official system will be implemented for the sectionals and finals. This is in line with the NYSPHAA decision to use three officials for regionals and the state tournament.


## Other pertinent data:

- A special thank you to all the coaches, off-ice officials and Matt Todaro, our web master, for working so hard to implement the new scoring system.

## *NEW Coaches Sportsmanship Selections: 2021-22 Glenn Anderson - Allegany-Limestone

Report on changes in policy or practice: The State tournament moved back to Glens Falls and will continue there for the next two years. This coming Fall bids are due for any Section wanting to host the Boys State tournament after the 23-34 season. The official ball will continue to be the Spalding "Legacy". This will be used for Sectional semi-finals through the State Final Four. Home teams in earlier rounds may use the "Legacy" OR the Spalding "Classic" that was used in previous seasons. .

Problems encountered/concerns: As addressed in numerous reports the past few years, player movement from school to school locally is a major issue. Players are leaving public schools and showing up at Charter Schools or MMA schools. Some players are leaving MMA schools to attend Charter Schools, and most alarming, kids are attending "numerous" schools during their 4 years of high school. We've now had 4-5 basketball players the past couple of years graduate after playing varsity basketball at at least 3 different Section 6 schools, and generally this has had nothing to do with geography or a family's change of address. We're seeing a trickle down of parents watching college players use the "player portal" and leaving schools and attending others. I don't see players leaving to pursue academic goals, but changing for athletic reasons. Some are recruited by coaches, others are recruited by friends and players from other schools with a goal of playing together. We as a committee
would like to find some solutions that would make sense that could address these issues. We certainly do not pretend to have all the answers, but would love to see some changes made that would make academics override athletics when it comes to transferring and changing schools.

Also, last year we placed two charter schools, Health Sciences and Tapestry Charter, up one Class each. Health moved from Class B to Class A2, and Tapestry moved from Class C to Class B2. Having said that, we are monitoring the off-season and deciding as a Committee where we should place them next season. One of the reasons we are waiting, Health Science had 3 starters from 3 other varsity programs transfer to Health Science during the course of the summer. Many of those athletes played AAU basketball with Health Sciences players and decided they would go to school there last season. Having said that, we definitely believe both Tapestry and Health Sciences will again should be recommended to play up a Class again next season. Health Sciences went 18-5 and played in the Sectional Class A2 final, losing to Amherst by 5 points after winning their semi-final game by over 30 points. Tapestry also lost in the Sectional final to eventual State semi-finalist Allegany-Limestone.

## Other pertinent data:

We as a committee have added Fredonia State Athletic Director Jerry Fisk as a non-voting member of our Committee. We thought it was important to add a voice other than that of only high school coaches to give a broader perspective. SUNY Fredonia is also a facility that we may consider using as a future venue. As our Classes continue to change, Classes B \& C have MANY schools where Fredonia may be a better venue when we have schools traveling from the southernmost part of the Section to a school in the Northtowns. This is all preliminary discussion. We are VERY HAPPY with both JCC and Buffalo State as Sectional venues.

Regionals will be hosted by Section 5 this coming season. A "better" venue needs to be found for the Far West Regionals when Section V hosts. The last time Section V hosted, the venue was Greece Athena, which was WAY TOO SMALL!! I have discussed this with their boys Sectional Chairman - Ed Stores. They are looking at better alternatives. Blue Cross Arena used to be their primary venue, but has not been used in recent years for many reasons. We would suggest they consider Buffalo State until they find a better site - this will be an ongoing discussion with Mr Stores this off-season heading into the Fall.

Recommendations for next season (including dates/sites): Buffalo State and Jamestown CC continue to be outstanding venues for our semi-final and Finals. All sites and dates are listed below. Section 6 will be hosting the Boys Regional Finals this year @ Buff State as well vs Section 5. Again this season, we have fewer Class $C$ teams and will have just 1 Classification for Class C. HOWEVER,
with numerous Buffalo Schools combining, and some uncertainty as to where Charter schools may be placed, Class A could be just one Classification, and Class B has enough schools to warrant 3 possible Classes with at least 37 schools currently.

MORE RECOMMENDATIONS - Our committee voted unanimously to recommend a change in policy on our Sectional Seeding policy pertaining to points awarded for league victories. We would like to see the point system modified.

Proposal One - 5 points would still be awarded for a win vs an opponent the same Class size. For a win against a Class larger than you, 6 points would be the MAXIMUM point total, and 4 points only if the larger Class school should win. This would be helpful in leagues where the discrepancy in Class size is larger than one (Ex. - McKinley (Class A) losing to MEC (Class C)) MEC would only receive 6 points for winning, McKinley would receive 4 points if they won. In the past, this would have been either a 7 or 3 points for the winning school. The rationale is this would keep teams on a more level playing field within each Sectional Bracket.

Proposal Two - We voted unanimously to see the tie-breaker format changed. As it stands, if seeding points are tied, the \#1 criteria to break a tie is "most league wins." Criteria \#2 are "fewest league loses." With Charter schools having to count ALL their games as league games (like an independent school), and with some leagues playing 14 league games, some 12, and some as few as 10 , this criteria is no longer valid. We would like to see the \#1 criteria (after seeding points) be a winning percentage. For instance, this past season, Olean and Lackawanna tied for the second seed in Class B1. Olean went 12-0 in league play, while Lackawanna went 13-1. When dividing their power points by league wins, they tied at 4.5 points each. Under the old criteria, Medina won a coin flip to be the higher seed. Under the proposed criteria, Olean's league winning percentage would be100\%, while Lackawanna's would be $93 \%$, thus giving Olean the higher seed. This seems to us to be the more equitable tie-breaker than using a coin flip. Olean could not have done more than they did, and had Lackawanna gone 14-0, they would have won the tie-breaker just because they play in a larger league that plays more games in league play.

11.3 GRIEVANCE/APPEAL FORMS - Available on the Section VI Website

STAGE 3:
If the grievance is not satisfactorily resolved at Stage 2, a further appeal may be made within fourteen (14) days (after receipt of Stage 2 decision) to the Athletic Council which may hear arguments and has the power to affirm, reverse or modify the decision of the Executive Appeals Committee.
11.6.1 This stage must be submitted in writing and signed by the Superintendent, Principal and Athletic Director and sent to the Athletic Council via the Executive Director.
11.6.2 All such appeals must be accompanied by a certified or school district check, in the amount of $\$ 300$. This check will be returned to the school district only if the original decision is overturned.

### 11.7 STAGE 4:

If the grievance is not satisfactorily resolved at Stage 3, a final appeal may be made to the Appeal Panel of the NYSPHSAA in accordance with the provisions of the State
11.8 Executive Committee/ Athletic Council Appeal Panel Format

1. Introduction / Review Format

Reminder: The Appeal Panel will not reverse or modify decision unless it finds that:
a) The decision is contrary to the evidence presented.
b) The facts presented constitute a violation of the Association's Constitution, standards or rules, Regulations of the Commissioner of Education.
c) A procedural error affected the reliability of the information that was utilized to support the finding.
2. Oral Presentations *
a) Appellant (15 minutes)
b) Respondent ( 15 minutes)
3. Questions By Panel
4. Closing Oral Summations (5 Minutes)
5. Deliberation by Panel

A written decision will be rendered within five school days of the hearing.
*Oral presentations will only be heard from the designated Appellant/ Respondent representatives. Oral and written presentations will be limited to that presenting during the initial appeal.
11.9 Any school or league which institutes an unsuccessful legal action or appeal to the courts or the Commissioner of Education to overturn, stay or enjoin any decision, ruling or rule or rules of the Section or the NYSPHSAA will be liable for costs and attorney's fees incurred by the Section in defending against such action. Further, should the Section be forced to initiate legal action to collect the aforementioned costs and attorney's fees, the member school or league shall be additionally liable for the Section's reasonable cost and attorney's fees resulting from the collection action.
