Per the 2022-2027 WNYSO/Section VI contract, *In year's where the fund balance drops below \$5,000, schools will be billed \$200 and officials' groups will be billed \$100 to keep the account in safe standing.* The Section is close to breaching the \$5,000 threshold with the start of the 2023-2024 school year and it is forecasted that reimbursements are on course to exceed the current fund balance during the school year. Therefore, it is recommended to bill the contracted rate now.

6.3.3 Travel Pay Update (S. Penhollow)

At present, the Finance Committee has not agreed to a proposal for equitable distribution of travel fees. The committee plans to formulate a recommendation at its October 12, 2023 Finance Committee meeting, which would then be a discussion item at the November 15, 2023 athletic council meeting and an action item at the January 17, 2024 athletic council meeting.

M. Kruzynski (Medina) currently represents Section VI on the NYSPHSAA Foundation Board. He is interested passing this role to someone who is better able to serve in this position. This foundation has been in place for about 3 years and was created to find ways of fundraising to support NYSPHSAA outside of the dues structure. Meetings are held 3-4 times a year via Zoom. Most of the board is made up of athletic directors, but there are 2 business officials as well. Council members were asked to share this with their leagues and let M. DiFilippo know if anyone is interested.

Wrestling Proposals (Implementation 2024-2025)

- Leagues / Coaches would like to have the opportunity to enter up to 15 wrestlers into the
 postseason with a maximum of two entries per weight class (both entries must have 6
 separate contests on 6 separate dates with a better than .500 record). Most of the
 Sections across the state allow for more than 13 entries into the postseason.
- 2. Open Sectional event (with a 2 year pause on the Class tournaments). See the attached proposal at the end of this report.

Interest in hosting a post season tournament has been expressed by Albion (Class B) and Clarence (Class AA or Sectionals). **Perhaps Buffalo State University** would be an option for an Open Sectional?

2 YEAR PROPOSAL FOR PAUSING THE CLASS TOURNAMENTS IN SECTION 6 FOR WRESTLING

Rationale:

- 1. We have had several teams combine in Section 6 to create fewer programs. In 2022-23 we had only 19 Division 1 programs / teams (10 merged to form 5). We had 30 Division 2 programs (16 merged to form 5 programs).
- 2. Most teams cannot field an entire roster of 13 starters from week to week (several forfeits).
- 3. NYSPHSAA currently holds a "Dual State Team Championships". Each Section holds a true Championship team event that sends our best D1 and D2 teams to that "Dual State Team Championships. The Class tournaments, as they currently exist, do not accurately identify our best teams. A team can win the Class tournaments with 6 wrestlers (out of 13 weight classes).
- 4. By pausing our Class tournaments, teams will have a weekend off prior to an "Open" Individual State qualifier event (Sectionals). It is also one fewer weigh-in that needs to occur. In most cases, wrestlers would face the same athletes two weeks in a row for the Class and Sectional championships. By pausing our class tournaments (with the current low participation numbers; logistically, we now would only need to acquire facilities for the Sectional Championships. That in turn, would allow us to allocate our resources to provide a better championship experience for the athletes and coaches in an open sectional format. As part of this proposal to pause the Class tournaments temporarily; we shall revisit reinstating the Class tournaments for the 2025-2026 season based on our leagues' preferences.
- 5. If we do hold an open sectional for wrestling, the tournament can be scored; in which case we can still identify our Class level champion teams. Those teams (1st, and 2nd place in each class) will be recognized with the corresponding Sectional plaque award.

Proposed new individual qualifying procedures for Section 6 Wrestling:

2 weeks prior to the NYSPHSAA Individual State Wrestling tournament, Section 6 will hold its Individual Wrestling Championships (2 tournaments – D1 and D2). Schools may enter up to 15 wrestlers total with a maximum of 2 per weight class. If there are 2 entries in any weight class, **both** entries must have a minimum of 6 varsity contests (on 6 separate dates) with a better than .500 win-loss record. All matches (Public, Private, Catholic, Federation) will count towards a wrestler's record. The tournament will be standard double elimination. If there are more than 32 wrestlers entered in a weight class, the school whose "second entry" has the worst win-loss percentage" will be forced to move to another weight class or withdraw from the

tournament. Additional tiebreaking criteria will be established in the event that there is more than one second entry with identical records (to resolve which wrestler has to leave the weight class with more than 32 entries).

The tournaments will be held over 2 days. In most cases, they will be Friday-Saturday events. Saturday-Sunday will also be considered based on the availability of the host sites. An ideal site would have the space for putting down 5-6 mats. A typical schedule will resemble the following:

Friday

10:00 am - 11:00 am Weigh-ins

12:00 noon Wrestling begins (32-man bracket)

A tentative schedule would be to wrestle 2 rounds forward in the championship bracket and 3 rounds back in the consolation bracket. This will allow for an early Friday departure. Wrestlers should not be competing in the later hours of the evening.

Saturday

7:30 - 8:30 am Weigh ins

9:00 Wrestling starts with the Quarterfinal round of 8

11:00 - Semi finals

2:00 – Consolation Finals (5th-6th place matches)

3:00 p.m. Finals (1st/2nd; 3rd/4th bouts run at the same time)

Proposed NYS Deductions 2023 - 2025

Both Competitive and Game Day

Timing - Timing will begin with the first movement, voice or note of the music, whichever comes first. Teams may start in a load position or choreographed position before timing begins. The timing will end when the music ends or the team is done chanting. If teams end in stunts, the timing stops but can still receive applicable deductions. Judges will not issue a deduction until 2:34 for the full routine and less than 29 seconds for the cheer.

- Cheer Minimum (-5.0)
- Overall Routine 4 5 seconds over (-1.0)
- Overall Routine 6 seconds or more over (-2.0)
- Game Day timing will not include the team spiriting, rallying, jumping, kicking, or tumbling prior to the start of the routine. Game Day Routine timing will end with the last synchronized voice or note of music. This would include call backs after the music has ended.

Performance Error (2.0) – NFHS rules violations that were not choreographed into the routine. Performance error skills are still counted toward difficulty and execution scoring. Cited per occurrence.

Apparel/Jewelry & Prop Violations (0.5) - Cited per occurrence

Choreographed Violations (3.0) – Any NFHS rule violation that was choreographed into the routine. Choreographed Violation skills do NOT count towards difficulty and execution scoring.

*If it is not clear whether it is a choreographed Violation or Performance error (such as when there is a single stunt group) then the official will err on the side of the athlete and give a performance error.

Out of Bounds (0.5) – One entire hand, foot or body part is completely outside of the performance Surface. Assessed per occurrence.

Athlete Bobble (0.25)

- · Landing on hands during tumbling or jumps.
- Tumbling in/out of a stunt transition

Building Bobble (0.25)

- · Stunts, tosses, or pyramids that almost drop or fall.
- Excessive movement of the bases.
- Dropping from below prep level skill.
- Dropping from an extended or prep level skill where at least one foot of support is at/above prep level.
- Dropping from an extended/prep level to a level where at least one foot of support is below prep level.
- Top person incorrectly becomes weight bearing on the bracer(s) of a pyramid/middle layer or base(s) of a stunt.



- Foot/feet/hand/hands coming in contact with performance surface during a cradle/prone.
- Dropping of a body position.

Athlete Fall (0.5)

- Landing on head, shoulders, back or other compromising positions during tumbling or jumps
- Drops from airborne tumbling skills to knees

Pyramid Collapse (3.0)

- Building bobbles and falls will be used until a single pyramid has received 3.0 in deductions. Once the pyramid has received 3.0 or more points in deductions, the Pyramid Fall deduction will be used.
- When multiple pyramids are built at the same time, each pyramid will be treated separately.
- If additional deductions are a result of the initial fall/falls, only 1 Pyramid Fall will be issued for that pyramid.
- Once a pyramid is rebuilt and shows stability, additional deductions can be given.

Minor Building Fall (1.0)

Stunt/Pyramid skills that almost fall or drop but are saved include:

- Lowering/Dropping from prep, extended or level in between to a load in, cradle, prone or flat back position.
- Top person incorrectly becomes weight bearing on a spotter.
- Base or spot landing on the performance surface anytime during a stunt, transition, or dismount.
- Dismounts Incomplete twisting that lands in a prone (on stomach) position.

Major Building Fall (2.0)

Drops to the performance surface from a stunt, pyramid or toss by the top person a base or spotter or more than 1 base and/or spotter. Uncontrolled lowering or drops to a compromising position not listed under building fall. Major Building Fall will include:

Stunts

- Lowering of a falling top person to the performance surface.
- Dropping from a skill and support is below prep level (both feet in a 2-feet stunt or the foot of support in a 1-foot stunt)
- Initiating a skill but never establishing contact.
- Dropping to a load in, cradle, prone/flatback position or compromising positions with the top's head going toward the performing surface.
- Multiple bases/spotters or a base/spot and top landing on the performance surface.

Dismounts/Tosses

- Dismounts that land in upright (feet down) or inverted (head down) position.
- Tosses that land in prone (on stomach), upright (feet down) or inverted (head down) position.

Pyramid

- Lowering of a falling top person back to the performance surface.
- Middle layer falling prior to loading the top person.



Game Day Format Violations (1.0 per occurrence)

- Skills that do not meet the additional skill restrictions for a Game Day Performance:
 - Tosses (basket, sponge or elevator) are NOT allowed.
 - Inversions are NOT allowed.
 - Twisting Released Dismounts are NOT allowed.
 - Single leg stunts are limited to liberties and liberty hitches.
 - Running Tumbling is NOT allowed.
 - Standing Tumbling is allowed. Connected tumbling skills are NOT allowed and a
 back tuck is the most elite tumbling skill allowed. Examples: Standing full is not
 allowed. Rippled Single Back Handsprings would be allowed. Jump tumble
 (single skill) would be allowed.
 - Tumbling during the Band Chant.
- The performance will follow this order: Band Chant, Situational Sideline, Cheer, followed by the Fight Song.
- Exceeding 3 consecutive 8-counts of incorporation during the fight song (High School and Below)
 - Building Skills that are stationary prior to the end of the 3rd 8-count may remain stationary until the end of the routine.
 - Dismounts following the completion of the routine will not be included for timing purposes.
- Stunting outside the allotted restrictions (before a routine begins and in between sections)
- Incorrect Situational Sideline response including calling a general sideline.

The NYSPHSAA Baseball State Committee is seeking approval of a "Battery Week" to allow pitchers and catchers to start one week earlier than players who do not pitch or catch. All Battery Week players would still be required to practice for 10 days before the first contest. Other components to this proposal:

- 1. All non-pitchers and non-catchers will start on the approved NYSPHSAA established start date for all spring sports and will be required to practice for 6 days before the first contest.
- 2. Rules and restrictions during Battery Week:
 - a. Only pitchers and catchers will be permitted during Battery Week and these practices will only count for pitchers and catchers.
 - b. No pitching to live batters.
 - c. No batting practice permitted during Battery Week for any player during this period.
 - d. Fielding, throwing, and conditioning workouts, along with position-specific skill work for pitchers and catchers are ONLY permitted during Battery Week approved practices.
 - e. No team practices are permitted during Battery Week.
 - f. Battery Week practices will follow all NYSPHSAA practice guidelines.

PRACTICE SESSIONS:

- Only one practice session per day.
- No student may be permitted to practice on 7 consecutive days during Battery

 Week
- Only six days of Battery Week may be counted towards the 10 total practice sessions required for pitchers and catchers.
- All required practice sessions shall be organized and planned for a reasonable length
 of time and shall include vigorous activity specific to the sport for the purpose of
 improving the physical condition of the players attending.
- Any "late addition" pitcher who does not attend Battery Week is required to fulfill
 the 10-day practice rule before pitching in a contest.

Pitcher arm health and safety is the main priority in this proposal. By providing these additional days of practice, pitchers will be more prepared to pitch in preseason scrimmages.

The current 10-day practice rule for baseball limits the opportunity for programs to schedule scrimmages prior to the regular season game start date. Scrimmages are vital team assessment and preparation opportunities that this proposal seeks to nurture while still adhering to the 10-day practice rule for pitchers and catchers.

- This will allow flexibility for scheduling scrimmages.

Updates/Discussion Items/Action Taken:

- 1. Dr. Zayas welcomed the committee to the call. He introduced the at-large representatives, Kim Saxton and Camaron Johnson. These individuals were selected to serve by NYSPHSAA President, Russell Bartlett. Dr. Zayas reminded the committee that the Championship Philosophy Committee is a recommending body. Any item proposed by the Committee will be voted on by the NYSPHSAA Central/Executive Committee.
- 2. Individual Sports Additional Classification: Section I brought a concern forward at the February 1, 2023 Executive Committee Meeting. The section requested this committee examine criteria for additional classification for individual sports. Todd Nelson - Conversation started with Boys and Girls Track Committee when examining cut-off numbers. This committee can review setting a criteria, which is currently 24-300 (1 class), 301 and above 2 classes. The discussion today should center around if a sport has 600 or more teams. If they do, the sport committee could request to go to a third classification (pending Executive Committee approval). Dan Doherty -The number of students sent to state meet is way below the maximum allowed (8%). A third class would bring the sport closer to 8%. Todd N. – Track is actually lower than 5%, and the goal is 5-8%. If a third class is added, it would put the sport in the 6% range. At this time, only outdoor track/field is discussing. Tom B. - This request is long overdue. The number and participants in that sport are larger than other teams. Not doing kids right by not creating a third class. Mike Andrew – Track/Field was three classifications in past. It was changed to two. The committee would like to go back to three for all reasons pointed out. Tom B. - What is the timeline? Dr. Zayas – if it gets support, it would be discussion in July and action in October, with implementation in the Spring 2025 season. A motion to add a third class/division for individual sports at 601 or above to the NYSPHSAA Championship Philosophy." Motion – Tom Baker. 2nd – Sugar. Unanimously supported.

 Team/Individual sports – Dr. Zayas suggested requesting criteria for additional classification in team/individual sports as well. Todd N. – The maximum number of classes allowed is four (501 and above is 4 classes). The staff would like the committee to establish a criteria to get to five classes (potentially 501 and above would get 5th classification). Boys and Girls Cross Country would like to see this occur. Dan D. – It has been five classes in the past for cross country. Dr. Zayas emphasized it is up to sport committee to take advantage of criteria, and then must be approved by Central/Executive Committee. Todd N. – Provided an example of this, in the sport of wrestling, there are two divisions. They could possibly have 3 or 4 divisions with number of teams they have. They choose not to. Joe S. – How many schools currently have in Class A cross country? Joe. S – Not used Top 100, bottom 75? Dan – that is correct. Cross Country would support four equal divisions. Mark D. – Why are we different for numbers between team/individual and individual? Dr. Zayas – There are different numbers because in the past the committee differentiated between team/individual and individual sports. Todd N. – At the time, over a decade ago, the philosophy was 5-8%. A motion to add a fifth class/division for team/individual sports at 601 or above to the NYSPHSAA Championship Philosophy. Motion – Sugar. Second – Joe Mercado. All yes and one no (Mark DiFilippo).

4. Section III Proposal (May 3 Sectional Concern) – Section III – Scott Sugar presented an idea regarding the expansion of the state tournament. The goal is quality participation in state championships and beneficial participation. Many motions were revising regional rotations and this proposal could address those concerns. The proposal includes a regular season, sectional tournament, and state tournament. The committee would need to recommend doubling participation percentage to 10-16%. Scott provided an example of the breakdown for sixth class for boys basketball. The number of bids is equal to the number of sections participating in tournament. If the philosophy is changed, there would be an increase in number of teams participating to 12 in AA and 16 in other classifications. Recognizes how different our state is. Play sectional tournament, then create 4 regional sites. Any section that has a second team, would not play first ranked team in regional. It essentially creates a regional format (regional weekend, then state final four weekend). Sections VIII/XI would receive four bids to state tournament. Dr. Zayas - Does it eliminate Long Island championship? Scott – No, that would be part of the sectional tournament. League championships do not count towards the total. John M. – The Long Island Championship does not have a bearing on regional tournament? Scott – That is correct. They will not face each other regional weekend. Still allows traditions for VIII/XI. Joe S. – No byes – all spots filled? Scott – yes. The second way, potentially the best way to get at large bids, is to have one standardized seeding process for the entire state. In Section III, they approved one standardized seeding process to be used for all six classification sports. Uses Bradley Terry model. The more teams that use the model, the more accurate the seeds are. If use common seeding process throughout the state, and in Class AA needed six at -large bids, go to seeding model, take top six schools that haven't won sectional, and they advance to state tournament. Tom – In favor of that. The proposal has a lot of merit. The common seeding process gets us get to correct quality and quantity. Dr. Zayas – In other states, AD is criticized because they did not schedule enough good games. Scott – Have coaches that duck opponents no matter what. Classification may be off, but the programs are equal. John M. – Went away from chasing points. Todd - Compromise between the two. Joe S. - Concern with breaking apart the leagues. Dr. Zayas – first and foremost, concept has to be supported by membership. Select at-large could be addressed at a later point. Todd N. – If philosophy makes that recommendation, then the proposal would go to CAC. That committee looks at details. Joe S. – Need details attached to recommendation. Mike A. – Proposal does not include the other high school athletic associations? Scott – It does not. Greg – Cannot forget about quality. Hosted regional softball game 20-0 in softball game. Further discussion ensued. Dr. Zayas – Asked Camaron opinion because she represents a large district with a lot of schools (Rochester). Camaron – I think more opportunity for students is a positive. Torn between the educational based athletics. Dr. Zayas - Would the committee like to take back to section? He suggested we meet again in middle of summer and have recommendation from this committee. Mark D. – Would like that. If we do increase the percentage, how does it affect the above proposals? Dr. Zayas – it would only be team sports. Mark - Are we not looking at percentage in other sports? How is that equitable? Dr. Zayas – Great point. Go back to sections to discuss. Will schedule another meeting in the Fall to discuss.

 Regional Rotation equity (May 3 Sectional Concern) – Tom B. presented Section I's concern regarding the inequity in regional rotations. Sections I, 2, and IX – the subregional always goes through their section. There is a problem with that, several outliers that create inequity across the state. Balance number of schools participating in that class in subregional games. As a result, shifted opponents section to section. The document attached was emailed to the committee during the call. Section I suggests aligning the regional rotations with the existing NYSPHSAA Championship Philosophy statement, "NYSPHSAA will sponsor Championships that represent excellence achieved in each sport. In the interest of equitable competition, minimal loss of academic time, financial impact and logistical concerns including, but not limited to, travel, lodging, meals and facilities for competition...". Also, add clarifying language to the NYSPHSAA Championship Philosophy document to ensure state sport committees are required to generate equitable rotations for their respective tournaments. Sports could also consider utilizing At-Large bids to create equitable rotations and complete the tournament structure (similar to football, ice hockey, field hockey, wrestling, etc.) as stated under Representation in the Championship Philosophy document. Dr. Zayas – what is the solution? Tom – Include other sections in as stated above. Revisit how to rotate subregional. Greg – Every sport is an island itself. Each philosophy for each sport may differ. Different sports have different classes missing. Dr. Zayas – can the sections consider the solution being Section III proposal? Tom – The problem needs to be fixed now as we do not know when the Section III proposal will be voted on and changed. Boys Lacrosse has already done it, but for some reason it does not begin until 2028. Todd N. asked the committee what is the philosophy? Is it that all sections have to share in the regional rotation? A motion to include all sections be part of the subregional rotations. Second – Greg. The motion was defeated 6-7-1 (1 – Yes, 2 – Yes, 3 – Yes, 4 - No, 5 - No, 6 - No, 7 - Yes, 8 - No, 9 - Yes, 10 - No, 11 - No, Dan - Yes, Tim - No, Kim - Not present, Camaron – Abstain). Dr. Zayas – If there is a lack of support then it will not go on to Central Committee. Are there other solutions? Mike – Sport Committees have always been told to be sensitive to geography. Tim L. - No simple answer with what we have right now.

Mike – Scott Sugar's proposal addresses all concerns. Scott Sugar made a motion to move forward with Sugar proposal. Second – Tim Lincoln. Tom B. said this is still concerning as the issue is not being addressed immediately. In other committees, votes were being taken via text, state coordinators voting two times because they also represent a section. There is a lot of

frustration in Section I due to the inequity. Greg - Scott's proposal needs to be looked at carefully. At-large bid will be an issue. It could take a while, but this does not help the Section I concern. As a Philosophy Committee, we can only vote on 10-16% for team sports. Scott's proposal is one way to do that. Need to get the percentage approved first. Dr. Zayas – if there is support for 10-16%, then Ad Hoc Committee can review Scott's proposal. Philosophy Committee recommends membership examines this percentage for team sports. Tom B. – We are not addressing inequity. Joe S. - He believes it is equitable because he is looking at number of teams/schools that are participating in that sport in that classification, Section I is looking at mileage. Tim L. and Mike A. - Sports use combination of both of number of schools in that class and geography, so there is opportunity to advance. Tim L. shared how girls basketball regional rotations are determined. Sometimes the rotations are very convoluted. Tom – Respects looking at number of teams in a region. Whenever subregional game, regular season shrinks. Superintendents ask why other sections cannot take this travel on as well. Scott – His proposal creates dialogue which is good for kids. This solves Tom's question and this can be moved faster. Dr. Zayas – Scott and Greg removed motion and second. Joe S. – Motion to request an Ad Hoc Committee be created to address the 10-16% in team sports and examine concerns in regional rotations. Second – Tim M. second. Unanimous support.

- 6. Regional Brackets for Boys Ice Hockey (February 1 Sectional Concern) Todd N. Boys Ice Hockey's philosophy is to rotate around to all sections. Some sections travel throughout the state. Section VII has a concern we are not following philosophy of other sports. Boys Ice Hockey does not have subregional game. Section VII could play Section V in regional, but only for atlarge (Mark D noted). Mark W. Section champions traveled farther than second place at-large team. Section VII would like champion to pick which regional they want to attend. No motion made and no vote taken. A language change would need to occur. Scott Suggested in a case where a section receives two bids, at-large game will defer to further travel. Joe S. Let the sport committee seed.
- 7. Recognizing Section Champions (Cross Country (only shirts and boards)), Gymnastics (Section team medals Top 3 Section teams), Golf (receives), Skiing (only announced), Bowling composite) Dr. Zayas asked if this is necessary for state championship events. Chris Joyce Bowling individual component, they compete as a section team because they qualify as a section. This is going to be discussed at Bowling Committee meeting coming up.
- 8. Championship medals awarded criteria Dr. Zayas said the committee also needs to discuss the number of medals awarded for events as there is a disparity across sports. For example, Cross Country awards the top 20, Wrestling is top 8, Swimming is top 20, and so on. Consistency is important. Further in depth discussion at next meeting.

1. State Coordinators Dave Hennessey (G) and Kristin Frazer (B) welcomed everyone and thanked everyone for logging in.

2. NYSPHSAA Staff Reports:

Joe Altieri: Participation certificates will be digital in 2023-24; will either be posted on NYSPHSAA website or a link will be sent to Section Coordinators.

Todd Nelson: Clarified information on wheelchair athletes - in Sectional Qualifier competition if an athlete is competing alone, they will need to meet the standard in order to qualify.

Joe A. on behalf of Kristen Jadin: Reinforced coaches need to read the Championship Operations Packet. Critical tournament information is the packet and eliminates confusion.

Chris Joyce: Online coaches pass list was not perfect but was better than using a binder check-in method. Any feedback, please send it to him.

Joe A. on behalf of Dr. Zayas: NYSPHSAA is looking to hire for the Director of Communications position, deadline to apply is July 7. Joe also stated the NYSPHSAA Strategic Plan objectives: 1) increase student participation, 2) recruitment & retention of officials 3) financially stability 4) diversity, equity and inclusion.

- 3. 2023 State Meet Recap: Joe A. complimented the group on the progress we have made over the years as the State Tournament "Reflections" document is now down to a little more than a page instead of the 4 pages it used to be.  - h. Times can be adjusted. Bob Headwell suggested having someone be the point person with the clerks and starters to avoid delays putting athletes on the track to remain on the time schedule.
 - i. Mike White would like to continue the use of stanchions to separate the Awards areas from the Jumps areas. Safer for everyone competing and receiving an award.
 - j. Kristin and Dave will talk to Ocean Breeze.
 - k. Times can be adjusted. Bob Headwell suggested having someone be the point person with the clerks and starters to avoid delays putting athletes on the track to remain on the time schedule.
 - I. Will look at the time schedule.

- m. Federation Championship Board was discussed in a prior email.
- n. Kristin and Dave will talk to Ocean Breeze timing company.
- o. Not sure if there is a solution, Inter Sectional Relay has been a tradition. Mike did suggest replacing with a team DMR.

- q. No parents should ever be on the infield. If an injury occurs, a coach can be called. Coaches are allowed for Field Event warm ups.

4. Committee Business:

ACTION ITEMS (These items will be presented for a vote at the <u>July 25-26 Central Committee Meeting</u>): Boys Lacrosse Regional Rotation 2028-33 – Coordinator Jim Amen explained the proposal. Deb asked about the thought process of not implementing sooner than 2028. Jim stated the committee wanted to finish out the current rotation. Mike A. noted Section 4 and 10 had to play in this rotation. Following all presentations, Deb recommended this rotation should begin in 2024, not in 2028. Deb also noted 3, 4, 5, & 6 are not in sub-regional games in this rotation as well.

MOTION by Deb to support the proposal. SECOND by Kathy. DEFEATED 9-0.

NEW MOTION by Jamie to recommend this rotation to begin in 2024. SECOND by Kathy. CARRIED 9-0.

Baseball Regional Rotation 2024-29 – Coordinator Al Roy explained the proposal. No questions/concerns were raised.

MOTION by Josh to support the proposal. SECOND by Kathy. CARRIED 7-2 (Susan, Deb).

Girls Soccer Regional Rotation 2023-30 – Boys Coordinator Mike Andrew explained the proposal on behalf of Coordinator Joe Vaz, which follows the same concept as boys. No questions/concerns were raised.

MOTION by Mike to support the proposal. SECOND by Jamie. CARRIED 8-1 (Susan)

Boys Soccer Regional Rotation 2023-26 – Coordinator Mike Andrew explained the proposal. No questions/concerns were raised.

MOTION by Josh to support the proposal. SECOND by Deb. CARRIED 8-1 (Susan)

Girls Volleyball Regional Rotation 2023-25 – Coordinator Peggy Seese explained the proposal. No questions/ concerns were raised.

MOTION by Deb to support the proposal. SECOND by Kathy. CARRIED 8-1 (Susan)

Girls Volleyball Bracket Play in State Semifinals – Coordinator Peggy Seese explained the proposal. Kathy asked why boys volleyball is not considering this as well. Joe explained they are considering but want to get through 2023 with the same format due to the venue capabilities. Mike inquired about two section coordinator votes who he heard were not ready to vote on this during the volleyball committee meeting. Following all presentations, Susan was concerned about a text vote that came forward. Jamie agreed and thought the change was radical and coaches may not be familiar with this. Joe clarified the coaches are already familiar with this format and the purpose of this format is to reduce the long day of semifinals. This is also just for the 2023 state tournament then will be reevaluated. Robert emphasized these points and indicated the text vote was from a person who was in the discussion of this proposal and texted their vote because they had to leave the call. Robert noted we will work on not having text messages as votes in the future. Deb said athletic administrators she is familiar with appear to be in favor of this proposal and coaches may not be. Greg suggested letting it play out. Eileen stated it would be nice to know how the six-class tournament would go first using the current format.

MOTION by Mark to support the proposal. SECOND by Josh. DEFEATED 6-3.

Sport Classification-Bowling, Game Day Cheer, Competitive Cheer – Assistant Director Todd Nelson explained the proposal. No questions/concerns were raised.

MOTION by Mike to support the proposal. SECOND by Susan. CARRIED 9-0.

Boys Swimming & Diving Qualifying Standards proposal was voted on during the discussion phase and carried 8-0 at the April meeting. It will be on the Central Committee meeting agenda in July for a vote.

Before votes were cast for action items, Greg indicated the Championship Philosophy Committee met last week and asked Dr. Robert Zayas to report on this. Robert indicated among the items discussed was a sectional concern from Section I about the inequity of regional rotations. Section I often plays an extra sub-regional game in many team sports. Robert shared a proposal brought forward by Scott Sugar (Section III) that could address this and would in turn increase participation in regional games. It would also create four defined regional locations. Greg recommended, due to timing, to accept the regional rotations being proposed so they are in place for 2023-24 then let the Philosophy Committee continue to address the equity issue. Robert stated it will take time to address the issues and even though the Scott Sugar proposal would solve the issues, it would create a significant economic impact. Eileen commented there are several moving parts including quality of play and contiguous sections playing each other. Susan agreed with Greg on voting "no" on regional rotations. Why are we waiting to address the equity concerns like Boys Lacrosse and Softball have. Eileen asked if baseball would resemble softball. It does not. Baseball continues the 1/4/9 sub-regional rotation. Softball does not.

FOR DISCUSSION:

Girls Basketball Regional Rotation 2024-28 – Coordinator Tim Lincoln explained the proposal. No questions/concerns were raised.

Boys Basketball Regional Rotation 2024-29 – Assistant Director Joe Altieri explained the proposal on behalf of Coordinator Bob Mayo. No questions/concerns were raised.

Softball Regional Rotation 2024 and 2025 - Coordinator Jim Wright explained the proposal. Susan thanked Jim for exploring an untraditional rotation to address equity. Eileen asked how many schools are competing for a regional title in six classes. Jim responded that his committee is working on that and noted Class AAA and D are the most difficult to create 8 regional games to make it even. Jim stated he would be revising the proposal with at-large teams while also maintaining equity. **SUBSEQUENT TO THE MEETING**, the softball coordinator submitted a revision after it was reviewed by the softball committee. This will be presented to the Central Committee in July and re-presented in September to CAC then in October to Executive Committee. ATTACHED BELOW

Boys Tennis Seed Team State Tournament - Coordinator Quan Hyunh explained the proposal. Greg asked how seeding will be done. Quan responded using the Universal Tennis Rating (UTR) system which is a metric to show strength of individual/team. Deb asked if the committee looked at how the seeding was at past tournaments and if it worked out. Quan explained yes and the top two teams, based on UTR rating, did in fact meet in the championship this past spring.

Boys Team Tennis Move to 2-3 Format for D2- Coordinator Quan Hyunh explained the proposal. Greg asked if this also addresses the quality of tennis in Division 2. Quan indicated it does not, rather gives another doubles player to compete in the tournament. Deb asked what the girls are doing. It was noted they are using a 3-4 format, the original format in the team tennis proposal three years ago. Deb asked why four boys tennis committee members voted against this proposal. Quan noted perhaps it was because of adding another player to postseason but he hadn't confirmed.

Boys Tennis Move to 3-4 Format for D1 - Coordinator Quan Hyunh explained the proposal. No questions/concerns were raised.

Indoor Track Qualifying Standards- Coordinators Kristin Frazer and Dave Hennessey explained the proposal. No questions/concerns were raised.

bidding the event in hopes of a more cost prohibitive bid. CAC expressed no concerns with this recommendation.

Girls Ice Hockey Regional Championship Site Selection 2025-27 – Assistant Director Joe Altieri explained the one bid submitted by Utica University Nexus Center. He indicated both staff and state committee agreed on the Nexus Center. Kathy Hoyt pointed out a typo in the bid comparison document which Joe will correct. CAC expressed no concerns with this recommendation.

INFORMATIONAL:

Gymnastics Championships 2024 – Joe explained Kenmore West High School (Section VI) has withdrawn their bid to host the 2024 Gymnastics State Championships and Clarence High School has fully agreed to host under the same terms as Kenmore.

Cross Country Admission – Joe explained issues have been addressed from the 2022 state meet at VVS and one of the solutions was to charge admission to individuals instead of cars this coming fall, hosted by VVS once again.

2022-27 Championship Dates & Sites – Joe noted the updated championship documents in the packet noting the championship recommendations above.

Rationale:

Six (6) classifications have been approved for the sport of softball so it is necessary to revise the regional rotation to reflect the change in programs in some sections. With many other sports considering filling brackets, softball is a sport that is definite need of a more competitive state tournament. Too many sections with higher numbers in their respective classifications go through an extensive sectional tournament while others have either an automatic, or a much shorter path to States.

- 1. Introductions: Queensbury coach Matt Flint and Section 2 Boys coordinator Jim Agnello
- 2. Election of Vice Chairperson and Secy. *Brian Kiely and Lynn Auble were reelected*.
 - a. Welcome by NYSPHSAA Joe Altieri/Todd Nelson/Chris Joyce/Kristin Jadin
 - b. Joe Altieri congratulated Marbry on being inducted to the Hall of Fame this July. He stated that more nominees are needed, and nomination forms are on the NYSPHSAA website. He also made us aware of the Implicit bias requirement that all Standing Committees need to take. It is only twenty minutes long and is available on the website. He met with Chris Joyce, Todd Bauer and Chuck at VVS to discuss the admission procedure that will be in place for this year. There will be two general admission gates to get into the area on Sat. One will be the normal gate to the football area and the other will be located on the East side close to the large parking area and tent city. Once inside there will be signs for the awards area and the sales area.
 - c. Philosophy committee update. Todd spoke about increases in classes. New enrollment numbers are coming this fall as BEDS are completed. Classes are determined by the number of teams not the numbers of schools having programs.

- 3. 2023 update Todd Bauer
 - a. Review of 2022meet. The meet went very well after surviving a windstorm on Friday and great weather on Sat. Due to the coaches leaving their destroyed tents on site, no tents will be erected on Fri. Coaches can claim their spot, but must erect them on Sat AM.
 - b. Race order/awards schedule. In a discussion about the order of races, a motion was made to switch the afternoon races to B girls, then A girls, B boys and then A boys. This would be consistent with the morning session and aid in the awards procedure and federation meetings. It was passed by a unanimous majority of the committee. See Attachment.

- 1. Boys State Coordinator Kristin Frazer (B) welcomed everyone. She thanked everyone for logging in and thanked Dave Hennesey for all of his time on the Committee and the mentorship he has offered all of us as well as his kindness and respect. Kristin also welcomed Bob Wallen as the new Girls Chairperson as well as Mike White as the Assistant Coordinator for both Boys and Girls.
- 2. Committee Directory There were no changes to the members of the Committee or email addresses .

3. NYSPHSAA Staff Reports:

Joe Altieri: on behalf of all of the NYSPHSAA officers he thanked Dave for all of his work, leadership and years of service, and was grateful he will continue to serve as the Section V Coordinator. Joe provided an update on behalf of the NYSPHSAA Office that a new Director of Sports Information should be starting on Tuesday.

4. Proposal - Adding Division 2 for Relays

Kristin explained that there was overwhelming support for this proposal from the Sections and discussed the timeline. September 27 - Kristin and Bob will present the proposal to the CAC (Championship Advisory Committee) for their vote.

Emilio Mancino (6) made a motion to recommend two divisions for all relays starting with the 2024 meet. Deb Ferry (11) seconded.

Discussion: Todd Nelson looked for clarification that the Committee is only looking to add Relays for the 2 Divisions and why not other events (this will probably be brought up by both the CAC and the Executive Committee). Kristin explained that at this time 1 day for Indoor Track & Field is not enough time to include Division 2 for all events. We will also use some of the discussion points that were brought up by various coordinators at our June meeting. Todd explained the timeline going to CAC and Executive Committee would not be voting on this until February which would be for implementation at the 2025 State Meet.

Joe Altieri advised everyone to bring this back to their home Section to discuss with their Athletic Councils. Lodging and Transportation will be affected for most Sections with this proposal as well. Todd asked if in the future this committee would be interested in having a two-division State Championship for all events. Facilities and lodging could be major hurdles to put in place as well as the lack of facilities in some sections in mirroring the State Meet and not having a location for 2 days of competition in sections.

Todd did express this a great reflection of the work performed by this committee and mentioned the timeline moving forward to looking at expanding.

The vote took place - Girls - 7 Yes, 1 No (Section 2) Also - Yes for CHSAA and PSAL Boys -6 Yes, 1 No (Section 2) Also - Yes for PSAL

5. Proposal - Adding Boys RaceWalk

Kristin explained that the majority of Sections were not in favor of this proposal. Dwayne Burnett let everyone know that the PSAL will be having the Boys RaceWalk in their meets. Emilio Mancino asked if Section 6 could keep the Boys Race Walk in 3 of their meets? Todd Nelson explained that the NFHS allows the Race Walk, so it should not be a problem.

6. Discussion - Using Metric to measure all Field Events

Emilio Mancino thanked Dave Hennesey for all of his time and efforts and for being such a good neighbor to his Section. He brought this up as a discussion after attending a USATF meet and hearing confusion from both parents and athletes. Kriistin did speak with her Committee recently and they explained that the majority of the high school equipment is only labeled empirically and they feel that this would only add more confusion. Bob W did speak with one coach who felt there were at least 5 other issues that would be more pressing. Dave Hennesey explained that years ago the Federation moved to metric, it got very confusing, and switched back to empirical measurements after about 2 years.

7. Section Concerns

Section 2 - Bob Wallen brought up at our March meeting at Ocean Breeze we were going to look at a day/date to finalize entries. Kristin explained some of the issues that occurred last year and also indicated that the state chairpeople have a conference call with NYSPHSAA, Ocean Breeze staff, and Milesplit staff 30-60 days before the meet occurs and would not be comfortable making a decision without their input. It will be discussed on that call and shared out with the Committee.

Kristin Frazer made a motion to adjourn at 10:03.

Report on changes in policy or practice that were implemented: NYSPHSAA golf committee has adopted a use of Distance measuring devices (DMD) rule for the use of range -finders or apps that use GPS. They will be used at the state level in June, 2023. If the device has slope measuring capability, the slope feature must be disabled. A new live-scoring app was used at the state tournament, Golf Genius. Section VI coaches were somewhat dismayed that we switched to this app after using iwanamaker for the past few years.

<u>Problems encountered/concerns</u>: Golfers who qualify for the spring sectional from the fall leagues are not playing in the sectionals for various reasons. This would not be a problem if notification is given in advance. It is not acceptable to just not show up.

Ideally, all leagues will be using the iwanamaker scoring app. This allows access for the press to see current and past scores as well as ranking players.







Motion was made by Bill Shaw and Seconded by Inga Welty to make the following proposal/change for the 2023-24 season for a 1 year trial. To be reevaluated after the season for possible permanent implementation.

Motion passed - 4 votes yes with 1 absent.

Concern:

Every year, Girls Basketball has an average of 10-15 teams opting out of the Sectionals. Currently the classifications for Sectionals are set up and possibly divided based upon the number of teams at the beginning of the season. This means that approximately 10-15% of our teams do not participate in sectionals every year.

As a result of these opt outs, 2 problems exist:

- 1 The classification sometimes drops below the minimum number (18) for splitting the class.
- 2 The split classifications are unbalanced because one classification, for example, has 10 teams and the other has 7 teams.

Proposal:

Due to the number of opt outs every year, we propose to keep Class A and B as one class at the beginning of the season, until the opt out deadline of January 27th (3 weeks before seeding meeting).

At that time, should the classes remain at 18 schools or above, the classes would then be split at that time. That would allow for the A1/A2 and B1/B2 classes to be evenly split for competitive balance.

Should the classes drop below the minimum number of 18, then the class would remain as one class.

Rationale:

With an average of 10-15 teams opting out every year, the committee believes that this proposal would create a competitive balance between the classes and thus produce the best possible Sectional Champion

Proposed Classes for upcoming year: This will be our first season with 6 Classifications. AAA is our new Classification, which may be a good thing for other Sections in NY State, but not a great idea for Section 6 since we only have 2 AAA schools. (Lancaster and Niagara Falls). Section 5 has only a handful of AAA schools as well. We will monitor this season at the State level and see if we (Sections 6 & 5) should look into a different format to see who goes to the State Tournament since we have so few schools competing. Also, we have added one girls game (AAA) to our finals at Buff State to maximize our use of Buff State and give the girls the ability to fit their other finals games in without having to play 6 games in one day at Buff State.

Changes in Policy/Practice for the upcoming season

Starting date for 2023-24 season will be Monday, November 13th. # of practices before first contest is now only 6. The State tournament will be hosted in Glens Falls this year. The Federation tournament will be held the following weekend in March at Fordham University. Spalding continues to be the state provider for basketballs; the "Legacy" will now be used for Sectional play and beyond.

Adding an extra Class and changing from 2 officials to 3 man crews for ALL Sectional games has definitely had an impact on how we arrange our schedule the first few days of the tournament. The Southern tier officials group, which has many dual certified officials (mens and womens Boards) is particularly stretched thin when both boys and girls are playing on the same night. Chris Durr and I have worked closely together to try and insure we can still fit all the games in while being able to have quality officials on both the boys and the girls side. This task continues to get harder as we deal with an aging officials population as well as a shortage of younger officials getting involved. I know it's been addressed the last few years, but we as a Section as well as each of the officials organizations need to come up with some significant improvements in how we attempt to attract younger men and women into those roles. I realize this is a national issue, not just a WNY problem, but coach and parent behavior is a major detriment to attractions young people into those roles.

Rule Changes for 2023-24

There is a significant rules change being adopted into the boys game this year. We are now following the women's NCAA protocol for team fouls. At the END of each quarter, team fouls will be re-set to 0. Also, there is no longer a ONE and ONE shot, all common fouls are 2 shot fouls. Thus, on the 6th team foul in a quarter, the shooter will shoot 2 shots. This will continue until the quarter is over, and now the team foul count is back to zero. Having watched the girls games the past few years after they adopted this rule change, the game had a much better flow to it. I believe this will be a positive change.

Report on changes in policy or practice that were implemented: Coaches did a nice job of entering weights from match to match into the <u>Track Wrestling</u> database as suggested by NYSPHSAA. Only a few programs had to be reminded throughout the season to avoid "open" contests (situation where a coach does not enter the team weights after a contest). NYS will institute a 1.5% weight descent plan this season which requires all coaches to enter weights from all matches / weigh-ins. All wrestlers weight descent plans will be based on the input of their entered weights. If a coach does not enter the team weights prior to the next contest, they will NOT be able to create a weigh-in sheet for that upcoming contest. 2 "open" matches (when a coach does not enter their team weights) will cause a forfeiture of the next bout.

<u>Problems encountered/concerns</u>: Losing Starpoint as a site and having to move the D1 Sectional tournament in 3 days' time was difficult and was accomplished with the help of the coaching staff / booster group at North Tonawanda HS.

Assisting Injured Athletes,
Expansion of Exchange Zones
Among Rules Changes in Track and
Field/Cross Country

Contact: Julie Cochran INDIANAPOLIS, IN (June 27, 2019) — The expansion of exchange zones in short relay events, which does not require tracks to be repainted/resurfaced, as well as assisting injured

athletes, are among the rules changes for high school track and field and cross country. Seven rules changes were recommended by the National Federation of State High School Associations (NFHS) Track and Field and Cross Country Rules Committee at its June 10-12 meeting in Indianapolis, and all changes were subsequently approved by the NFHS Board of Directors.

The first change amends notes in Rule 4 (Competitors and Competition) and Rule 8 (Cross Country) which reads, "A competitor who provides assistance to an injured or ill competitor should not be disqualified if neither the individual competitor providing the assistance nor his/her team gains an advantage as a result of providing the assistance."

"Previous changes to the NFHS rules created the exception that allows a competitor to assist an injured or ill competitor without being disqualified when medical staff is not present," said Julie Cochran, NFHS director of sports and liaison to the Track and Field/Cross Country Rules Committee. "In a clear majority of these types of situations, the action is intended to be an act of good sportsmanship and not an attempt to circumvent the rules or gain an advantage." While the injured or ill competitor is disqualified for receiving help, the competitor helping will not be disqualified, unless that competitor – or his/her team – gains an advantage. In all cases, the final decision rests with the meet referee, who has the sole authority to rule on infractions, irregularities and disqualifications in a meet.

Changes to Rules 5-3-3 and 5-3-4 expand the exchange zone in relays with legs of 200 meters or less from 20 to 30 meters. All exchange zones for races with legs longer than 200 meters will remain at 20 meters.

"The acceleration zone is now incorporated into the existing exchange zone, thus a 30-meter exchange zone for relay races with legs of 200 meters or less," Cochran said. "The rule change does not require that tracks be repainted or resurfaced in order to follow the new NFHS rules. Existing acceleration zone markings, such as triangles, squares or colored tape, placed at that location may be used to denote the beginning of the exchange zones on a track." Rule 6-2-6 has been amended to prohibit athletes from running backwards or in the opposite direction (non-legal direction) during warm-ups on horizontal jumps, pole vault and javelin runways. "This change promotes a more organized and efficient warm-up period," Cochran said. "Competitors should now be more aware of their surroundings."

Two changes to Rule 6 provide equivalent metric increments for tiebreaking jump-offs in vertical jumps, as well as clarify distance requirements for long jump and triple jump pits. For long jump and triple jump pits constructed after 2019, the length of the pit shall be at least 23 feet (seven meters). In cross country, Rule 8-1-1 has been reorganized to clarify that a cross country course may be marked with any or all methods listed in the rule. An additional change to cross country rules adds language to Rule 8-1-3 regarding straightaways at the start of a course. The change provides a recommended minimum distance of 100 meters for beginning straightaways, and states that no narrow section of a course should be longer than 10 feet (three meters) long. Small cones of the appropriate color, at least 12 inches (30 centimeters) high, are also now permitted to be used in lieu of painted lines or survey chalk. According to the 2017-18 NFHS High School Athletics Participation Survey, track and field is the most popular sport for girls with 488,592

participants and is No. 2 for boys with 600,097. Cross country ranks sixth for girls with 223,518 participants and sixth for boys with 270,095. There have been some rule changes that will affect the relay zones and the jumping events. I have copied them below. If you are repainting your track, you will only need two triangle markers for the 4x100 meter relay. There will no longer be a need for three markers - fly zone marker & two regular zone markers. Already lined tracks will use the beginning fly zone marker and the end of the zone marker as the only two needed. There are a couple more changes but they are minor and I will present them later.
