#### SECTION VI SCHOOLS OF DISTINTION TO BE HONORED

NYSPHSAA announced that of the twenty schools in New York State that achieved the status of Scholar-Athlete "School of Distinction" for 2010-11 four were schools in Section VI: **Albion,** Newfane, Williamsville North and Wilson.

These schools achieved the "School of Distinction" status by having 100% of their interscholastic varsity sports teams earn above a 90.0% grade point average. Newfane with 18 teams is receiving the award for the 1st time. This is the third year winning the award for Albion, Williamsville North and Wilson High School. Albion and Wilson each have 17 teams while Williamsville North has 30 teams. The districts will be honored and presented with the award at the September Section VI Athletic Council meeting at the Erie 1 BOCES Education Campus in West Seneca.

The "School of Distinction" award, in its ninth year of existence, is the highest award handed out in the Scholar-Athlete program. The purpose of the "School of Distinction" award is to unite varsity coaches in challenging their teams to achieve a statewide honor in addition to the already established Scholar-Athlete Team Award program that was initiated in 1991-1992 school year. Of the 97 schools that have won the award since its inception in 2002-03, 24 were Section VI schools. *Congratulations to Albion, Newfane, Williamsville North and Wilson!!*

#### Wrestling:

- 14 Day Rule: A wrestler cannot begin practice until the waiver is approved. The approval date of the waiver starts the 14-day clock for certification.
- Weight Classes 99, 106, 113, 120, 126, 132, 138, 145, 152, 160, 170, 182, 195, 220 and 285.
- Selectively Classified athletes must weigh in excess of 91 lbs. for 99 lb. weight class, 96 lbs. for 106 lb. weight class, 185 lbs for 220 lb. weight class and 210 lbs. for 285 lb. weight class. Students in grades 9-12 do not have to make minimum weight.
- Weight Certification Beginning in 2011, a third measurement to all skin fold sites is required. The data must be submitted by using Optimal Performance Calculation on the NWCA website.
- Skin Disease Form "For NYSPHSAA member schools an appropriate health care provider is defined as a licensed physician, physician assistant or nurse practitioner."

**Boys Volleyball:** Net Height Waiver → The height of the net from the center of court is 7'11 5/8".

#### **IMPORTANT REMINDERS**

Practice Sessions - Highlights of Rule - No student or team may be permitted to participate in school organized practice or play on seven consecutive days during the regular season. Specifically, during the regular season, physical and/or instructional activities related to the sport on seven consecutive days is prohibited.

Only one practice session a day and only six days of a calendar week may be counted toward the total practice sessions required. A practice session conducted on the same day as a game cannot be counted to meet the minimum practice requirement to be eligible for that day's contest. All required practice sessions shall be organized and planned for a reasonable length of time and shall include vigorous activity specific to the sport for the purpose of improving the physical condition of the players. Each of the required number of practices for an individual must include vigorous activity; however, practice sessions required for the team beyond those needed by the individual may be used solely for meetings, film review and similar activities. (Reference the entire Practice Regulation found on pages 101-102 of the NYSPHSAA Handbook or pages 102-103 of the on-line version of the Handbook.)

Concussion Management: Schools are encouraged to develop a Board of Education approved concussion management policy. A draft policy and guidelines can be found on the NYSPHSAA website. Educate your coaching staff through a FREE on-line course at www. nfhslearn.org.

# Section VI Hosts Athletic Director Workshop

In May 2007, the NYSPHSAA Executive Committee approved the requirement that all school district Athletic Directors attend an annual Mandatory NYSPHSAA Eligibility Workshop. The rationale supporting this recommendation was to ensure compliance with all NYSPHSAA Rules and Regulations and to minimize student athletes from being deemed ineligible.

Erie 1 BOCES in West Seneca was the site of the 2011 Section VI Workshop on August 29. Nina Van Erk, Executive Director NYSPHSAA and Todd Nelson, Assistant Executive Director conducted a very informative and interactive session on Eligibility and Standards in the morning for over 80 Athletic Directors in Section VI, as well as a more in-depth review for the new Athletic Directors afterwards. Thank you Nina and Todd for sharing your time and wisdom!!!

# Central Management and Assigning of Officials -ArbiterSports

Section VI is beginning the fifth year of coordinating the efforts of centralized management and assigning of sports officials through ArbiterSports. New in 2011-12, the evaluation system for sport officials will be used by Field Hockey as well as boys and girls lacrosse and boys ice hockey which used the evaluation system successfully last year. Coaches for these sports login to arbitersports after each game to rate the officials on a variety of criteria. The results are valuable in establishing the ranking of sports officials.


Section VI now requires Disqualification and Form X forms to be submitted on-line through Arbitersports or the Section VI website. The hot-line to report DQ's and the subsequent paper trail have been eliminated since each on-line form is emailed directly to the Section office when submitted. Also, the lead official is now required to complete the Game Report (click on the red "R") for each contest in team sports entering the score and comments. Athletic Directors, secretaries and assigners are encouraged to view these reports!


We are also moving forward with using RefPay in ArbiterSports to pay officials for contests that the Section office is responsible for. For most sports, these are contests held at neutral sites. Officials to be paid in this manner will be requested to open a RefPay account and select their preference of payment: direct deposit, payment to a debit card or a check. This eliminates the need for social security numbers on vouchers and makes funds available to officials within hours of release from the Section. This process, used last year for boys ice hockey throughout the season and lacrosse sectional finals proved efficient and cost effective.

NOTE: The timeline for assigning (North and South) are posted on the Section website. Under General information, click on Forms and Information.....look for Arbitersports under "A". Athletic Directors, assigners and officials are all responsible for abiding by the dates posted in the timelines (approved by the Athletic Council).

And for the future......Claire Roberts, CEO of ArbiterSports announced in August that the company is building ArbiterGame. ArbiterSports, part of the NCAA Spectrum and dedicated to streamlining the process of holding sporting events, indicated that ArbiterGame will empower athletic departments to schedule games, manage teams, create rosters, arrange transportation, change venues and times, send notifications, see officiating crews, pay referees and other game staff electronically, and track the entire process online. ArbiterGame will be built on the powerful ArbiterSports platform, ensuring it works seamlessly with the entire line of ArbiterSports products and benefitting all ArbiterSports clients by simplifying the exchange of game information. Phase one will be released in May 2012. (Visit arbitersports.com or call 1-800-576-2799 for more information.) Section VI will investigate potential use of ArbiterGame as an alternative to League Minder/Schedule Star for member schools.



# CONGRATULATIONS Clarence 2011 Track & Field - State Scholar/Athlete Champions

The Clarence Track & Field Team was crowned as New York State Scholar Athlete Champions finishing first of 297 schools in the New York State Scholar Athlete program. The top 12 students achieved an overall average of 98.854. In addition to the top 12 students the Clarence Track Team had 35 students who achieved a 90 plus grade point average during the third marking period. The boys track team scholar athlete championship is the first for the boy's track program and Clarence's 15th state title.

Section VI is pleased to congratulate Clarence Track & Field Team for achieving the State Scholar/Athlete Champion.



### Section VI Track and Field Claims Two State Titles

**John Strickland,** a senior at Panama Central, jumped 6'8" at the NYSPHSAA Track and Field Championships, which was good for first place in Division 2 and second overall. John struggled getting over the 6-foot-6 mark in the event all year, but the state meet proved to be his breakthrough. After he cleared the 6'6", John's coach Rob Pawlak was congratulated by the Niagara Falls coach who said "You have the best high jumper in Western New York." Cody Schweickert of Springville told John to move his mark back six inches, and on the next jump, John cleared 6'8". His coach let out a huge yell of triumph on his clearing 6'8" and got a big hug with "It's ok to cheer for your kid!". John's previous best jump was 6'6", which he had jumped in the sectional qualifier last year, as well as several times this season, including the Section 6 State Qualifier Meet. This mark of 6'8"



is a new Panama High School High Jump record, beating the previous record he set at the 6'6" mark.

John is the son of Dan and Sally Strickland of Ashville, NY. He plans on attending the University of Buffalo, where he will participate on the track team there. Photo was taken by Brian Horey.

#### Kailyn Arcury - Williamsville South

Kailyn Arcury, a Williamsville South junior became the only girl from Section VI to win a title at the New York State Track and Field Championships at Caledonia-Mumford High School. Arcury ran 14.28 to win her hurdle race by .01.She was the first one over the final hurdle in an exciting race, but the field closed in fast on the final sprint to the finish line. "That

girl (Lexus Harney of Mount Vernon) caught me, and I just ran as fast as I could," she said. "It wasn't my best start. I can tell you that. I just kept picking it up each hurdle."

Arcury also came back later in the meet and won the Federation title in a season-best 14:26. Both wins were satisfying after placing second last year.



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### NYSPHSAA 2011 Hall of Fame Inductees Photo Hall of Fame 2011

Section VI is proud to say that two of our own representatives, **Dr. Ron Black and Stacey Schroeder-Watt** were selected for induction into the 2011 Class of the NYSPHSAA Hall of Fame. The induction ceremony took place at the NYSPHSAA Central Committee meeting banquet in Lake Placid on August 3, 2011. The Hall of Fame, launched in 2002 and sponsored by Pupil Benefits Plan, Inc. and Jostens, is mirrored after the National Federation of State High School Associations (NFHS) program which recognizes individuals in the categories of athlete, coach, official, administrator and related contributor.

#### DR. RONALD BLACK, Administrator

Akron Central School- Section VI

Dr. Ronald Black, a long-time administrator in Section VI, was NYSPHSAA's President from 2006-08 and the Section VI President for two terms. For nearly 40 years, he worked in Section VI schools as a teacher and Administrative Assistant to the District Principal at Holland Central School (1961-72) and as a Principal in Akron Central School District (1972-99). An Orchard Park resident, Dr. Black was additionally appointed a long-term seat on the NYSPHSAA's Championship Advisory Committee and served on the Strategic Planning Committee in the early 2000's.

Prior to his administrative career, Dr. Black was a four-sport athlete playing football, basketball, track and baseball at Buffalo Technical High School, then went on to play soccer at SUNY Cortland and later became the coach of the freshman soccer team at Penn State University. He earned his Bachelor of Science from SUNY Cortland and a Master of Science in 1961 from Pennsylvania State University. He additionally earned a Doctorate of Education from SUNY Buffalo in 1970, and in 1973-74 he received a Certificate of Specialization in Education Administration and a Certification of School District Administrators from Niagara University.

Ron has received numerous honors and awards

during his career including the School Administrators Association of New York State (SAANYS) Region 12 Administrator of the Year Award (1991) as well as SAANYS New York State Distinguished Secondary Principal (1992) award and the New York State Athletic Administrators Association Distinguished Service Award to Athletics (1992).

## STACEY SCHROEDER-WATT, Athlete

Grand Island - Section VI

Stacey Schroeder-Watt was one of the most exceptional track athletes in the state competing at Grand Island High School in Section VI. Her dominance in the shot put and discus led to a remarkable career including two NYSPHSAA State Championships in the shot put (1991, 1992) and one in the discus in 1992 when she shattered the girls state record, which still stands today. From 1988 through 1990 as an underclassman, she also earned spots in the NYSPHSAA State Championships after dominating Section VI in shot put and discus. Overall, Schroeder-Watt won five Section shot put titles and four Section discus crowns to go along with eight Niagara Frontier League championships. Her performances in the shot put and discus led to the honor of All-American status in 1991 and 1992 and being ranked number one in the country in 1992.

Beyond track, Stacey also successfully participated in high school volleyball and basketball. ### New K2 drug becoming concern in athletics

Kansas City — The company that does drug testing for the NFL, NCAA and more than 100 U.S. schools is coming up with a way to detect a troubling new synthetic substance that mimics the effects of marijuana and is so far legal in 49 states. The lab-made drug known as K2, King Krypto and Spice, among other names, is well known in Europe and authorities say it's been banned in countries including Germany, Russia, Sweden and England. It began showing up in the United States only about six months ago, federal authorities say, and Kansas outlawed it in March. A ban at the federal level could take months, if not years.

The NCAA declined to comment on the drug, but the agency it pays to conduct drug testing is already working on a test to detect K2 use after hearing from a number of schools concerned about it. By this fall, the National Center for Drug Free Sport Inc. hopes to have a test ready to go for college athletes, many of whom may be especially tempted by the drug.

"What you see with college kids is they're young and they think they're invincible," said Barbara Carreno, a spokeswoman for the U.S. Drug Enforcement Agency. "They don't have a sense of their own mortality yet. And with this, they're not going to get thrown in jail. It's got a lot of appeal."

The NCAA bans a broad swath of substances, including marijuana, and anything "chemically related" to those substances whether they are performance enhancers or recreational drugs. Drug Free Sport contracts with the NFL, NCAA,

several athletic conferences and schools to administer more than 20,000 drug tests annually. Athletes are tested at NCAA championships and randomly throughout the academic year, and Drug Free Sport tests athletes who fall under suspicion by coaches or trainers. "We started receiving phone calls about K2 after the first of the year from a few schools," said Frank Uryasz, president of the Kansas City-based company. Uryasz is confident K2 will eventually be banned in college athletics and Carreno is equally certain states will outlaw it. But so far, Kansas lawmakers are alone in taking action.

"We found out about it in October," said Jeremy Morris, a senior forensics scientist at the Johnson County, Kan., criminal investigation laboratory. "And by March, the governor signs the bill and we have it controlled. Kids were getting sick, going to the hospital, and we couldn't stop it. But now we can."

Officials interviewed for this story were not aware of any deaths resulting from the use of K2. But many expressed concern about the drug's effects. "It's rather frightening," said Dr. Anthony Scalzo, director of the Missouri Regional Poison Control Center in St. Louis and a consultant in cases of suspected K2 use around the country. "We've had people come in with dreadful symptoms. They're agitated. Their heart's racing. Their blood pressure is up," Scalzo said. "They feel terrible. Some are even paranoid and having hallucinations. And the tests come back negative, even for marijuana. So doctors wind up scratching their heads and wondering what's

going on here."

Like the NCAA, the Big Ten Conference declined to comment when asked about the new drug. Ed Stewart, an assistant commissioner of the Big 12, said he had not heard of it. But calls and e-mails about K2 have begun coming into Drug Free Sport's Resource and Exchange Center, a service that answers questions from anonymous athletes, trainers, or anyone connected with college sports. K2, in whatever form, is available for roughly the same price as marijuana and it can be purchased over the counter. Steve Vogt can hardly keep the stuff in stock at Weedz, a shop he owns near the Las Vegas Strip. "You can make \$7,000 a day if you've got a busy shop," Vogt said in a telephone interview. "I don't think I want to say exactly how much. But I'm going through a lot. All I do is keep buying more. More and more people are hearing about it. More and more people are buying it."

The DEA said the drug is made primarily abroad, in Europe and China, and Scalzo said K2 was developed in laboratory experiments in the mid-90s as scientists sought ways to restore the appetite of emaciated chemotherapy patients. "I think we can make a pretty good guess that somebody was doing some research on synthetic cannabinoids and came across this paper and realized that was something that could be a pretty good drug," said Morris, the Kansas forensics expert.

"It's not difficult to make a test, but there are so many different chemicals to test for to be comprehensive," Carreno said.

The NYSPHSAA Sportsmanship Committee reviews the self-assessments of the schools receiving sectional recognition and chooses school(s) deserving the New York Sportsmanship Promotion State Banner **By May 30**,. This prestigious award is presented to the winner(s) at the Annual NYSPHSAA, Inc. Central Committee Meeting Dinner in August.

NYSPHSAA announced that <u>Holland, Iroquois, Olean and Lewiston Porter High Schools</u> have been recognized for outstanding efforts in promoting good sportsmanship in Section VI. Each school will be honored at the September meeting of the Athletic Council. Congratulations to all!
