GOLF TOURNAMENT POLICIES FOR DIVISION I II AND III

I. General Regulations Governing Conduct of CCAA Tournament

A. <u>Supervision</u>:

Each school involved in any CCAA Tournament is responsible for adequate supervision of all students either participating or observing. Each school participating must be accompanied by a certified coach

B. Admission Fees:

No team fee will be charged to enter the tournament Greens fees and lunch charges may apply.

II. The CCAA Committee Responsibility

- A. The CCAA Committee will appoint a CCAA Chairman
- **B.** If trophies or awards are given, the CCAA Committee will secure them and forward them to the Athletic Director of the schools involved.

III. CCAA Chairman Responsibility

- A. <u>Pre-Tournament Procedure</u>
- 1. Ascertain how many schools will be participating in the tournament
- 2. Obtain the site of the tournament
- 3. Make provisions for drawings for threesomes or foursomes
- 4. Notify all schools of the date, time, and place.
- 5. Prepare record blanks and scorecards in advance
- B. <u>Tournament Procedure</u>
- 1. Eighteen holes to be played. If circumstances require less holes, it should be agreed upon by the coaches. Weather may dictate less and timing may not allow for a makeup.
- 2. Sectional qualifiers are strictly individual
- 3. Summer rules are to be played whenever possible when winter rules are to be played. USGA recommends mark, pick, clean, and place. Ball can be moved six inches and no nearer the hole. Under no circumstances can a putt be conceded.
- 4. All infractions of rules should be reported immediately to the Chairperson
- 5. In case rule interpretation is necessary, ruling is to be made by the Club Pro if he is available, otherwise by the rules committee appointed by the chairman.
- 6. If possible no members of the same team may play on, or with the same foursome
- C. <u>CCAA League Tournament Procedures</u>:
- 1. Make a written report to the Secretary of the CCAA Committee showing the final results of the Tournament-- schools with score, also low individual score. This report should be made within two days.

- 2. If there are any expenses connected with the Tournament, the Chairman should send a written report to the CCAA Treasurer using the report sheets provided by the Treasurer.
- 3. A written report of the results of the Tournament should be sent to newspapers of the counties and radio stations.
- 4. A letter of appreciation for the use of the Golf Course should be sent to the Pro and/or Club President.

D. <u>CCAA</u>

1. CCAA has a Sectional qualifier that is based on individual play; no team records are kept.

RULES FOR GOLF - LEAGUE PLAY

- A. <u>Rules</u>
- 1. <u>Pre-Match Warm-ups</u>: A reasonable amount of time will be allowed for putting and chipping.
- 2. <u>Play-offs:</u> In lieu of playoffs, we will go with Co-Champions
- 3. <u>Rain Dates:</u> Make up at teams option. If matches must be cancelled then opposing teams should be informed by 2:00 PM.
- 4. <u>Forfeits:</u> Unless the <u>Coaches</u> have previously communicated, a forfeit will be called if an opposing team fails to show. All efforts should be made to reschedule the matches
- 5. Protests: Handled by League Chairman
- 6. <u>Termination of Matches:</u> A match shall be deemed complete when all players have finished five of the same holes. Matches can be terminated for weather by the home coach. Regard must be taken for the players' safety.
- 7. <u>League Matches:</u> Matches will consist of nine holes. The winning team will be determined in the following way:

CCAA Scoring System:

- a. Each team will play 6 players and score 5
- b. Reverse Cross Country Scoring method will be used.
- c. Low score receives 10 points, second 9, third 8, fourth 7, fifth 6, sixth 5, seventh 4, eighth 3, ninth 2, and tenth 1.
- d. 55 possible points.
- e. Maximum team score is 40 points if they sweep the top 5 spots.
