 T.Slade highlighted the following from the November Report:
 - a) Admission: The Finance Committee will review concerns regarding a student rate for sectionals and the \$4 admission charge for football bowl semi-final games. A report on the latter will be submitted to Finance by K.Stoldt, Football Chair.
 - b) Section VI passes: Due to the reduction of rent at Ralph Wilson Stadium, President Rabey and Executive Director T.Slade removed the suspension on use of Section VI passes at Ralph Wilson Stadium (as allowed by Policy #710.1c). It was noted that beginning in 2012-13, when presenting a Section pass for admission, the user must present ID and sign in with their pass # at the gate.
 - c) Winter venues: Wrestling still needs a host for the Class AA and B tournaments on Feb. 4 and the Division 2 Qualifier on Feb. 11. Girls Basketball is reviewing use of NCCC, with a high school site as a back-up, for semi-finals and finals.
 - d) BEDS numbers for 2012-13 are now being processed through SED. As a result, numbers for classifications will not be available until January, postponing scheduling for fall sports.
