  - a) Football 4 nights rest between football scrimmage and a game: This will eliminate scrimmages between games. The football committee, NFL and NO leagues are not in support. The safety concerns are increased exposure to potential injuries and scrimmage guidelines are not always followed. Motion to support a change to 4 nights rest (from 2) between a scrimmage and a game in football DEFEATED Scholla/DiFilippo

  - a) <u>Modified</u> Pilot for a kick-off in modified football: The football committee and Sectional Intersectional Committee are not in support of this change. *Motion to support a pilot program for modified football kick-off*. DEFEATED Eberle/Dunnigan
  - b) Modified: A Mod/JV program is a 7-8-9 model for schools that have no JV program. It follows the HS grid with a modified start date and allows for flexibility in districts. 7-8-9 teams can compete against 7-8 teams if they use like criteria (age, grade, ability, geography) and determine there will be safe and equitable competition. The program would be allowed with Section and league approval. Motion to support implementation of a Modified/JV pilot program CARRIED Graczyk/Vantine
  - c) <u>Modified</u>- Baseball pitch count vs. innings pitched: Pitchers are currently allowed a max of 12 innings per week.   - Moratorium: It was noted that this is too great a penalty for athletes with minimal savings.
     Sections can opt-out of participation in state championships. Motion to support placing a two-year moratorium on all state championships beginning with the 2013-14 school year DEFEATED Dunnigan/Wendt
  - Curtailing: This could include reducing the # classes or ending competition with regionals.
     Motion to support curtailing the number of state championships DEFEATED Dunnigan/Vantine
- c2) Motion to support the following proposals regarding Sites of State Championships CARRIED Vantine/Bullis:
  - Selecting state championship sites based on a Section's desire to host.
  - Developing a new process by which members of the site selection committee are chosen.
  - Considering a change in transportation reimbursement structure with, perhaps, sections
    closest to the championship sites receiving less and those furthest receiving more.
