Report on changes in Policy or Practice that were implemented

1. This was the second year using the Arbiter and a full time assignor. I believe everything worked very well. I did encounter more difficulties with Officials Board #39. That board has a policy that prohibits any member from working a second game in the same round even though it is a different classification. As a result, officials from other boards were assigned to those games. We are charged with assigning the best available officials to each game and need help in having Board #39 change their policy, which they have been advised to do by their state organization.
The above problem is still there. I have a communication from the NYSGBB Association's president that needs to be acted upon to finally clear this issue. **Please advise.**
2. Girls Basketball did publish color programs this year addressing the concerns of Sectional/Intersectional from last year. A profit was made on the programs, however the exact amount is yet to be determined as the section office has not provided all of the necessary figures. Four ads of \$100 were used to offset the printing, which was done at CA BOCES. A warm and hearty THANK YOU goes out to Joyce Nudd and Don Scholla (both from Olean) for making this possible

Problems encountered/ concerns

A total of 14 teams did not participate in sectionals. Last year's figures were 17 opt outs.

Recommendations for next season & proposed dates/sites

As a committee we plan to meet after school budgets are acted upon. The time of games and venues will then be discussed. Therefore, the dates and sites (in yellow) remain from 2011.

Report on changes in Policy or Practice that were implemented

The inaugural season of the Western New York Girls Ice Hockey Federation was very successful. The success achieved was remarkable especially due to the late formal organization of the league in late June. Seven teams competed in a 63 game schedule. The teams that were members of the federation for 10-11 were: Williamsville, Kenmore, Lancaster, OP/Frontier, Amherst/Sweet Home, Monsignor Martin, and West Seneca. A Federation Handbook was developed by the participating Athletic Directors to guide league activity. The financial structure of the Federation was similar to the Boys Hockey Federation with dues being forwarded to Loren Ratajczak and invoices for ice, officials and minor officials being paid by him. Rich Gray is the Athletic Director for the girl's ice hockey Federation responsible for finance and he will be working with Loren to provide an official financial report for the 10-11 season. The Executive Board of the Federation met regularly during the season to insure the league was progressing as planned and these official minutes were recorded by Brett Banker. The last meeting of the Executive Board and coaches was held on March 3. League coaches also attended this meeting. The All Star Selections were made and the year's activities evaluated. It was decided that only minor changes be made to the Handbook. The Executive board will meet again to discuss the 11-12 season and each league member was asked to bring home ice so next years schedule can be started.

The officiating for the Girls Federation games was excellent, with the league getting many compliments from the officials for the quality of play. Anyone who attended a girl's hockey game was impressed by the quality of play and the commitment of the girls involved.

There was no charge to attend girls league games for the 10-11 season because many of the games occurred at odd times. It was also decided for this past year that no gate would be charged at the Section VI championship game. Both of these issues will be reviewed by the Executive Board in June. A determining factor will be the quality of the ice time for games the Federation puts together.

Problems encountered/ concerns

If there was one problem that existed for the 10-11 season it was the late start (June 2010) that the Federation was formed and the problem getting quality ice time for games that late. The Federation Athletic Directors did a great job obtaining ice and although some ice times were not good enough many times were. With an early start for next season this problem should be averted in the future.

Another concern the league encountered was scheduling a Section VI Championship Game. Because the league is Federated and the Monsignor Martin team is involved, all league members felt strongly that a Federation Playoff should be held. It was. In that game, which was conducted on Friday Feb 25 Williamsville defeated OP/Front 3-2 to win the Federation Playoffs. Those same two teams met for the Section VI championship the next week with OP/Front winning the Section VI title. It was unavoidable in having the same two teams meet for the Section VI Championship after playing for the Federation playoff championship the previous Friday night. In the future the Federation Executive Board voted to continue the Federation Playoffs and have a special Section VI Championship game the following week. In the future if a Girls State tournament is held, the Section VI Championship game winner will move on.

Recommendations for next season including proposed calendar

The 2011-12 Girls Ice Hockey Federation season will begin Nov 1, 2011. The Federation Playoffs will occur Feb 20-25*, 2012 with the Section VI Championship game occurring on Feb. 28 or 29, 2012. Decisions on charging for games and State Championship games will be discussed at the organization meeting on June 15, 2011.

Report on changes in Policy or Practice that were implemented:

1. The amount of athletes per Boy's & Girl's Teams will not exceed 70 members per meet.
2. The six division format seemed to work very well.
3. Division Meets took place during the month of December and part of January.
4. The Western New York Relays were brought back.
5. The Varsity Team Challenged Type Meet was once again run.
6. The 9th & 10th Grade Championships were run once again.
7. The League Championships were scored and split into two groups – Large/Small Schools.
8. The Section VI – Indoor Track & Field State Qualifier Championships were run on a Sunday.
9. In the Long Jump – the 1st jump will be measured followed by a 2nd & 3rd jump to meet a standard.
10. Throwers were given four throws instead of three with the exception of the League/State Qualifier & Throwers Meet – Three throws with the Top Eight going to the Finals for an additional three more throws.
11. Weather Proposal – If the NYS Thruway & Fredonia State College is Open – Then Meet goes on.
12. Hurdle Responsibility will be added along with slitting up the Long & Triple Jump Duties.

Problems encountered/ concerns:

We know that running the State Qualifier Championships on a Sunday was of some concern but we did everything we could to try and move this meet from a Sunday – Fredonia State College just wouldn't budge.

Recommendations for next season

Team Championships will now go to only one entry plus any sectional qualifiers who meet a standard.

Other pertinent data

1. Trainers were of no concern this year – this issue was corrected this year. Thanks to Mr. Dinse and his U.B. Staff.
2. Floor Mats at both Fredonia State & Buffalo State College were provided for adequate floor mats in the High Jump & Pole Vault.
3. The Triple Jump was contested first in Meets followed by the Long Jump – This really alleviated the concerns that we had with way to many jumpers in the Long Jump.
4. We worked with six officials at Regular Meets.
5. Section VI – Security – Four to Five were needed at Fredonia State College throughout the season and only two were needed at Buffalo State College.
6. Girls in the Long Jump were jumping off an eight foot board unless they met a standard of 15' 0".
7. Boys in the Long Jump will be jumping off a twelve-foot board.
8. An Emergency Evacuation Plan will need to be added to the Hand-Book for next season.
