This year's revenue increased from last year because of the following: a highly successful regional tournament held in Section VI and a greatly reduced venue cost at ECC.

Non Participation:

A total of 17 schools did not participate in this year's sectional competition. They included: McKinley, Riverside, Riverside MC, Grover Cleveland, Lafayette, Dunkirk, Burgard, Buffalo Arts Academy, Emerson, Leonardo da Vinci, WNY Maritime, Buffalo Academy Science, Oracle, Brocton, Panama, Hinsdale, and MST Prep @ Science. All of the schools provided proper and timely notification as required.

Programs:

Programs will be addressed via the Media Chairperson at the May meeting.

Scheduling and Site Locations:

Alternating days with boys are going well. Thanks to all schools(Williamsville East, Lockport, Depew, Chautauqua Lake, and Jamestown) that hosted Semi-Final and Final games.

ECC-City Campus remains a willing and cooperative partner. This partnership with ECC and Section VI is more than a financial agreement. The site provides a decent venue to all participants and spectators. The willingness of the staff to do whatever is needed should be noted. Further, a built-in day to accommodate weather emergencies is provided. If a whole day (FINAL) would have been canceled, a no-cost day was scheduled for make ups. Additionally, no high school in our section could have handled this year's successful regional competition.

Trainers:

Great!. No real emergencies this year. Cell phone numbers should be provided between breaks in games.

Officials:

Cooperation continues among the three boards and three assignors. There were no written complaints or assignment problems. The Arbiter was used this year.

Conclusion:

This year's girls' basketball sectional and regional competition was a major success. The finance committee was promised a better financial reward while the athletes were rewarded with collegiate venues for finals and regional competition. While I can not guarantee acceptable financial results, I can and did negotiate favorable venue costs. The major contributors to the financial success to the regional bottom line was that Section VI produced great schools whose fans supported them and also Section V had two new schools play at the regional level. The attendance and participation was the best ever!

Attendance and financial enhancements could be enriched further if conflicts between the same schools playing on the same nights were resolved at the finals.

The collection of money for the Section VI Boys and Girls Tournaments was assigned to a committee headed by Leo Kaminsky. A separate financial report has been submitted by this committee to the Section VI office.

The boys and girls sectionals were conducted using the same format as the 2008 Sectional Tournament. This allowed for the addition of more teams and fewer individual bowlers. This format resulted in additional costs to each school that now qualified to fund a full team and not just an individual representative.

The boys sectional tournament went well without any problems. However, the girls sectional tournament had to be postponed due to adverse weather conditions. This tournament had to be held the week after the Winter Break and created some difficulty due to getting the required information to the State Tournament Coordinators in a timely manner.

The new rule that an athlete representing Section VI in state competition must be accompanied by their coach or a designated representative of the district was put into place. This resulted in an added expense in terms of seating on the bus, hotel room, and meal allotment.

All four of the Section VI teams did well at the State Tournament in Rochester. The West Seneca East boys team took **first place** and the Frontier girls team took **second place**. The Boys All-Section

team took **first place** and the Girls All-Section team took **second place**. In addition, Frank Porter from Niagara Falls High School was awarded the **Sportsmanship Award**.

The issue of moonlight bowling involving two separate incidents was dealt with by the Activity Board. The Board also determined that the Boys and Girls Bowling Sports Chairs will meet with the Activity Board prior to the 2009-2010 season to clarify the bowling standards for the 2009-2010 season.

We wish to thank the Section VI office for their continued support in helping to make the 2008-2009 season a success.

Note – We did save the Section some money in that there were three meets cancelled because of the weather during the middle & end of December – December 19th & 20th, 2008 at Buffalo State College and Wednesday, December 31, 2008 at Fredonia State College.

Fredonia Situation:

Mancino and myself along with the Section VI Administration made sure that we had adequate supervision that was led by Sue Dronckowski. This was the first time that we felt we needed to make some changes in regards to sufficient control of the Fredonia State Indoor Track & Field Facility as well as having supervision provided at the Sports Arena at Buffalo State College. We all felt that it was the best for all parties concerned and was well received by all of the coaches and athletes.

In order to control the amount of people at such Indoor Facilities our Section VI – Indoor Track & Field Committee meet back on Wednesday, April 1, 2009 at 6:30 PM for a Post-Season Meeting and came up with a game plan for the upcoming 2009 – '10 Indoor Track & Field Season.

1. The amount of athletes per Boy's & Girl's Team will not exceed 70 members per meet.
2. There will be six divisions instead of the normal four that has been used for the past six years or so.
3. Division Meets will take place during the month of December along with three weekend dates in January.
4. See attached proposal.
5. The WNY Relays will be eliminated and replaced by a Varsity Team Challenged Type Meet.
6. The 9th & 10th Grade Championships will now be split into two groups – Large/Small Schools.
7. The League Championships will also be split into two groups – Large/Small Schools.
8. The Section VI – Indoor Track & Field State Qualifier Championships may go to a Boy/Girl Meet only.
9. In the Long Jump in particular – the 1st Jump will be measured followed by a 2nd & 3rd jump to meet a standard.
10. Throwers will now get four throws instead of three with the exception of Leagues/State Qualifier & Throwers Meet – Three Throws with the Top Eight going to the Finals for an additional three more throws.
11. Weather Proposal – If Thruway & Fredonia State College is Open – Then Meet is on.
12. Hurdle Responsibility will be added along with splitting up the Long & Triple Jump Duties.

Mancino and I felt that everything went as smooth as can be expected. Refer to Pre-Season Report – 2008 – '09. All meet results and such were sent in to all people concerned in a very quick and timely manner. Emilio Mancino did the Girls Top Ten List and I did the Boys Top Ten List and such.

Other Items:

1. Trainers were a major concern especially during the early part of the season – this issue needs to be corrected.
2. Floor Mats at both Fredonia State & Buffalo State Colleges will need to provide adequate floor mats in the High Jump & Pole Vault.
3. An Emergency Evaluation Plan will be added to the Hand-Book.
4. Girls in the Long Jump will be jumping off an eight foot board.
5. Boys in the Long Jump will be jumping off a twelve foot board.
6. The Triple Jump will be contested first in Meets followed by the Long Jump.
7. Triple Jump Boards - Girls – 20' – 24' and/or 28' - Boys – 28' – 32' and/or 36'
8. Only six officials will be needed at regular meets – we eliminated one official.
9. Section VI – Security – three or four will only be needed.

As of now there are currently 32 schools from Section VI that participate in Indoor Track & Field as well as Canisius, St. Joe's and St. Francis bringing our boys numbers up to 35 total schools and 32 total girl schools. We do not feel at this time that Canisius, St. Joe's nor St. Francis need to be out even though our numbers might increase slightly. All three schools performed their responsibilities and such throughout the 2008 – '09 Indoor Season in a timely and efficient manner.
